Anointing of the Sick: Please call the Parish Office. It is best to arrange the anointing while the person who is ill can participate.






All Saints Sweepstakes





ELECTION 2020 ~ Protecting All Life

In recent years, Pope Francis has provided explicit instruction on the many ways we are called to defend, promote, and protect the sacredness of life. In his writing and speaking, Pope Francis makes it clear: abortion is not the only issue that matters. The following are his words:

Gaudete et Exsultate March 2018

101. Our defense of the innocent unborn, for example, needs to be clear, firm and passionate, for at stake is the dignity of a human life, which is always sacred and demands love for each person, regardless of his or her stage of development.

Equally sacred, however, are the lives of the poor, those already born, the destitute, the abandoned and the underprivileged, the vulnerable infirm and elderly exposed to covert euthanasia, the victims of human trafficking, new forms of slavery, and every form of rejection. We cannot uphold an ideal of holiness that would ignore injustice in a world where some revel, spend with abandon and live only for the latest consumer goods, even as others look on from afar, living their entire lives in abject poverty.

Note from Fr. Jay:

When preparing to vote, Catholics should study all the issues, pray for God's Spirit to guide you, then follow your conscience to decide who to vote for.

CAJE UPDATE

YOU Can Help Us Reach Our Goal

We have just two weeks left in our Listening Process - and we have added to our People Power as we have documented stories of injustice and concerns about the ongoing pandemic.

As we begin the final quarter of 2020, I would like to remind you of the impact made by each financial investment into the work of CAJE.

During our 2019-2020 cycle, 42 CAJE leaders participated in regional and national training workshops at little-to-no cost to them.

The average 2.5 day training module costs approximately \$500/person. This was partially grant funded.

My salary and health insurance was completely covered by the Congregational (individual contributors) Drive!

This year, we set a Congregational Drive goal of \$70,000 but lowered it to \$65,000 after COVID-19 hit the community. As of this Friday, individuals have invested \$59,784!
