

Parish Council November Meeting Summary



The All Saints Parish Pastoral Council continues its work for the parish with meetings on ZOOM. At the November 4th meeting, the council heard from Jim Tolen about the need to replace the water tower cooler for the parish office building. The council voted to accept the building committee's recommendation for the replacement. This now goes to the finance committee and the bishop for final approval.

The synod planning process continues. All three focus groups have met 3 times and have sent summary statements and recommendations to the planning committee. This committee will meet on November 9.

Parish staff held a second meeting with Aurora to discuss issues relating to the homeless population in the neighborhood. Several policies have been developed to accommodate the needs of the homeless and the needs of the parish.

In the future, current council members and former Father Niehaus Award winners will not be eligible for the Brute Award. This addition to the diocesan guidelines was necessitated because council members serve on the review committee.

All Saints Day was November 1, but we will continue to celebrate our parish feast throughout the month. Watch for suggested readings and activities in the bulletin and in the parish app. Coming soon—a prayer card-to unite us in one voice.

Special Points of Interest

Baptism of children should be arranged in advance by contacting Fr. Davidson at the Parish Office.

Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults (RCIA): Those wishing to become Catholic or learn more about the Catholic faith may call the Parish Office.

Marriage: Couples planning to be married should contact Fr. Davidson at least six months before the wedding date. This ensures time for adequate preparation.

Anointing of the Sick: Please call the Parish Office. It is best to arrange the anointing while the person who is ill can participate.

Catholic Schools: Grades K-12, open to children of our parishioners. Contact Sharon Vogler at the Parish Office to ask about our policy of sponsoring students in Catholic Schools.

Family Faith Formation: Religious Education for families and children is available. Please call Sharon Vogler at the Parish Office.

Prayer Chain: Contact Judy Wittgen at our Parish Office if you would like to join the phone or email prayer chain.

Homebound, Nursing Home or Hospital Visitation: Call the Parish Office.

Summary of the Diocesan Pastoral Council Meeting, November 7, 2020

The Diocesan Pastoral Council met on November 7 at the Catholic Center in Evansville. The DPC is a consultative body to Bishop Siegel. Following Mass, Bishop Siegel welcomed members and led them in the Diocesan 75th Anniversary Prayer. Diocesan Finance Officer Dean Happe then provided an overview of diocesan finances. He addressed a range of items such as the diocesan operating budget; the insurance program budget; sources of revenue and expenses; income opportunities; and the Catholic Parishes Campaign. Following that, Vice-Chancellor Dominic Faraone discussed the pastoral planning process. He briefly described the 2016 Diocesan Pastoral Plan and reviewed responses that DPC members had shared regarding a review of that plan and their recommendations for new diocesan priorities. He explained that the Bishop would be compiling the responses from the DPC, the priests and the diocesan office directors and then form a task force to revise the pastoral plan.




Justice Challenge

Christ the King/34th Week in Ordinary Time

The Gospel for Sunday proclaims the famous story Jesus told of the sheep and goats. 



End-of-Year-Giving Option

ARE YOU 70½ OR OLDER?

When planning your year-end giving, you may want to consider making a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD) from your IRA.

WHAT IS A QCD?

A Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD) is a direct transfer of funds from your IRA to a qualified charity. QCDs can be counted toward satisfying your Required Minimum Distributions (RMDs) for the year, as long as certain rules are met.

WHY GIVE WITH A QCD?

Making a gift with a QCD is a tax advantageous way to make gifts supporting your parish or ministry of choice.

- ❖ Satisfy your Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) with your gift.
- ❖ Allows you to give from pre-tax assets with your gift not being counted as taxable income.
- ❖ Your gift comes from your assets instead of your checkbook.
- ❖ It's easy to do! Just notify the custodian of your IRA.

QCD REQUIREMENTS

While many IRAs are eligible for QCDs there are requirements:

- **You must be 70½ years old, or older,** to be eligible to make a QCD.
- QCDs are limited to the amount that would otherwise be taxed as ordinary income.
- There are maximum annual gift amounts that can qualify for a QCD.
- For a QCD to count towards your current year's RMD, the funds must come out of your IRA by your RMD deadline, generally by **December 31.**

Any amount given above your RMD does not count toward satisfying a future year's RMD.

Funds distributed directly to you, the IRA owner, which you then give to charity, do not qualify as a QCD.

If you itemize your deductions

The new Adjusted Gross Income limitation for charitable contributions has been raised from 60% to 100%. You can now deduct your cash or cash-equivalent contributions from your entire income.

If you don't itemize your deductions

You are now able to claim a charitable deduction of up to \$300, even if you were unable to claim any charitable deductions last year.


