



Parish Council January Meeting Summary

All Saints Parish Council met on ZOOM on



Tuesday, January 5, 2021. The major agenda item was the ongoing parish planning process begun in 2020. Tad Dickel, facilitator for the planning process, joined the meeting to explain progress to date. The parish planning committee, following on the leadership task force's recommendation, is pursuing the concept of a pastoral life coordinator with a sacramental minister as the model for our parish. Given the decreasing number of priests available in the diocese, this seems to be a good model to pursue. The bishop has indicated an openness to the idea. Much discussion centered on this plan and the job descriptions that need to be developed to be sure we are serving the needs of all the parish and the desire to remain true to our mission of hospitality, justice, and empowerment of the staff and lay leadership. The council voted to approve a grant application to the Welborn Foundation to support this model.

The Youth Task Force will be meeting with St. Boniface Parish to discuss possible collaboration with them to serve the young people in our parish. We already join that parish for vacation bible school, so further connections could be desirable. Discussion with Holy Redeemer Parish is also being pursued. Council will next meet on Tuesday, February 2.





GOSPEL








Draw Jesus at home giving Simon the new name, "Peter."
