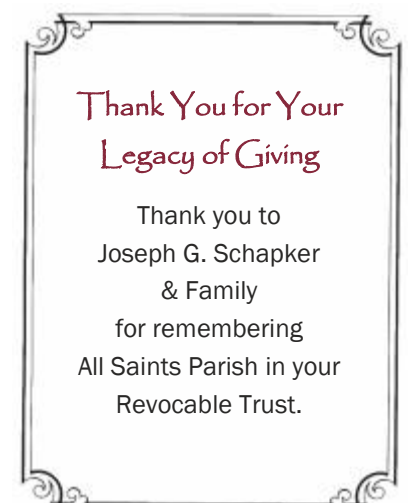

Justice Challenge

6th Week in Ordinary Time

This Sunday's Gospel is about the leper who touches Jesus' heart. While leprosy isn't rampant in our

communities today, many people suffer from the poverty of relationships which lepers suffered in Jesus' time. There are people in our own communities who have no one who loves them except God. And they may not experience God's love because they have no human love to help them recognize God's love. They are the lonely, the alienated; some are scared, or angry or wounded. **Your challenge this week** is to take the love in your heart beyond your immediate circle of loved ones and extend it to someone who is alone. What can you do as a family or household to bring love into this person's life? And can you commit to making it more than a one-time act of kindness and care? How can you continue to let this person know that he or she is not alone in this world, that God loves them, and that you do, too?

Ash Wednesday

Wednesday, February 17, 2021

Mass with the distribution of ashes

12:10 pm Mass at St. Joseph Church

5:30 pm Mass at St. Anthony Church



Ashes this year will be distributed by sprinkling them on each person's head. Following is a brief explanation of this practice:

Sprinkling ashes on the top of the head recalls the biblical practice of putting on "sackcloth and ashes" as an act of penance.

For example, we read in the Book of Nehemiah: *"On the twenty fourth day of this month, the Israelites gathered together while fasting and wearing sackcloth, their heads covered with dust"* (Neh 9:1).

While the custom in the USA has been to mark the forehead with a cross, sprinkling the ashes on the head remains the custom in other parts of the world such as Spain and Italy.

However the ashes are received, the interior repentance expressed by this exterior act is at the heart of the action.



Fasting and Abstinence

Lent for 2021 begins February 17 (Ash Wednesday) and ends just before the Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper on April 1 (Holy Thursday).

Catholics 18 to 59 years of age are obliged to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, and should continue this Easter fast on Holy Saturday, as well.

Catholics 14 years of age and up are obliged to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, the Fridays of Lent, and Good Friday.

It is almost Lent in our Church Seasons!

**Parish Council
February Meeting Summary**



The Parish Pastoral Council met on Tuesday, February 2nd. Tom Bogenschutz presented a plan to build our faith community by forming small faith communities within the parish. These groups would meet with trained leaders for retreats, prayer and discussion, and some form of mission. Tom will start adjusting his workload to begin this process. Fr. Jay gave an update on the parish planning committee and on the grant submitted to the Welborn Foundation. This plan includes hiring a pastoral life coordinator and a justice minister. If the grant is approved, funds will be available as early as June. Parishioners will be receiving a letter detailing the parish plan. The youth focus group reported that it looks likely that All Saints will partner with Holy Redeemer for its programs. Some kind of agreement will be drawn up detailing the involvement. A focus group on All Saints facilities will likely be formed in the spring. The process for discerning new members for the council will begin this month. Five members are completing terms-Laura Ackerman and Roger Rogge (eligible to serve a 2nd term); Deavron Farmer, Emma Jean Couture, and Tegan Rush (each completing 2 terms and not eligible to continue). Fr. Jay reported that the parish reached 68-70% of its CPC goal. Father will write a letter reaching out to parishioners to try to increase that number. In other matters, Sharon requested help in removing the sticky finish left on the floors at St. Anthony Church as a result of disinfecting over the past year. The A-Men's Club will be approached for help.

CAJE Updates January 27, 2021

Our research teams have conducted meetings this month and have narrowed down possible directions and "asks" of officials. **Please make sure to check your email for notifications of research visits that have been scheduled.**

Kedzie and I are in the process of reaching out to local, regional and national experts on the various problems we are tackling. Many leaders took part in a DART preparing for Action/negotiations webinar on January 14. I am looking forward to watching them utilize those skills in April & May.

Safe Neighborhoods: After the Community Problems Assembly, the SN committee met with Mayor Winnecke to urge him to move more quickly in his pursuit of funding for the gun violence Problem Analysis to be conducted by the National Network for Safe Communities. To date, we still do not have a solid timeframe on when this contract will be signed, nor do we have a set date for the Problem Analysis. We are determined to see the city adopt evidence-based strategies that will reduce gun violence in Evansville.

In case you missed it: Our March 15 Team Assembly (for Team Captains and Clergy), April 12 Rally, and May 10 Nehemiah Action **will be conducted virtually.** Because we will not set aside time for sign in, these events will **begin at 6:00 pm.**

A BIG Thank you to all who invested in this system-changing work in 2020!

Because of each of you, CAJE broke the \$70,000 mark - \$72,500.30 to be exact!

You showed your commitment to your Justice Ministry and helped CAJE thrive - in a pandemic!
