



Family Faith Formation

"I received from the Lord what I handed on to you." 1 Corinthians 11:23

We just finished our study of Abraham and Sarah last week in Family Faith Formation.

We read several of the stories that are part of the life of Abraham...God asking Abram to leave his homeland and settle in a new land, Abram and Sarai in Egypt at the time of the famine, Abram and Sarai receiving their new names from God, visitors telling Sarah and Abraham they will have a baby in their old age, the sacrifice of Isaac...all stories of covenant...promise.

With each of these stories we shared how much trust we thought Abraham and/or Sarah had in God. We had some great discussions!

A prayer that was suggested as we reflected on trusting God was the Serenity Prayer...

Prayer for Serenity

God, grant me the serenity to accept the things I cannot change, the courage to change the things I can, and the wisdom to know the difference. Living one day at a time, enjoying one moment at a time; accepting hardship as a pathway to peace; taking, as Jesus did, this sinful world as it is, not as I would have it: trusting that You will make all things right if I surrender to Your will; so that I may be reasonably happy in this life and supremely happy with You forever in the next. Amen.

Justice Challenge ~ 2nd Week of Lent

Sometimes we think about making big plans for Lenten sacrificing, only to fall behind with work, family, and other responsibilities. We find ourselves in the Second Week of Lent with no commitment to better prayer lives, doing good deeds or practicing acts of selfdenial.

But it is never too late. Catholic Relief Services offers a great resource to parishes and families for praying, fasting and charitable giving—all in one simple project. What is so great about this project, known as Operation Rice Bowl (ORB), is that it makes all the right connections. When you put the money you would have spent on a CD or that mocha latte you crave into your Rice Bowl box, you participate in a small yet significant way in Jesus' sacrifice.
