Ash Wednesday Wednesday, February 17, 2021

Mass with the distribution of ashes 12:10 pm Mass at St. Joseph Church 5:30 pm Mass at St. Anthony Church



Ashes this year will be distributed by sprinkling them on each person's head. Following is a brief explanation of this practice:

Sprinkling ashes on the top of the head recalls the biblical practice of putting on "sackcloth and ashes" as an act of penance.

For example, we read in the Book of Nehemiah: "On the twenty fourth day of this month, the Israelites gathered together while fasting and wearing sackcloth, their heads covered with dust" (Neh 9:1).

While the custom in the USA has been to mark the forehead with a cross, sprinkling the ashes on the head remains the custom in other parts of the world such as Spain and Italy.

However the ashes are received, the interior repentance expressed by this exterior act is at the heart of the action.


For this purpose have I come."

We are preparing for Confirmation!



Justice Challenge

5th Week in Ordinary Time

The Gospel reading for Sunday describes Jesus healing people all day, and then getting up the next morning to be deeply absorbed in prayer. Jesus cared for the poor and the sick and those marginalized by society. But he never forgot the source of the healing which he did—his heavenly Father, whom he called "Abba", or "Dad". He kept in close contact with the Father throughout his life. Your challenge this week is to reflect on the relationship between prayer and action in your own lives—as individuals and as a family or household. Do you have a healthy and holy pattern of prayer which is part of your daily routine? Do you let that prayer lead you to the actions which God wants you to take to help heal a hurting world? Remember that part of a vibrant prayer life is letting God speak once you are done. Listen to what God wants you to do just as Jesus did when he lived on earth.

CAJE Updates January 27, 2021

Our research teams have conducted meetings this month and have narrowed down possible directions and "asks" of officials. *Please make sure to check your email for notifications of research visits that have been scheduled.*

Kedzie and I are in the process of reaching out to local, regional and national experts on the various problems we are tackling. Many leaders took part in a DART preparing for Action/negotiations webinar on January 14. I am looking forward to watching them utilize those skills in April & May.

Safe Neighborhoods: After the Community Problems Assembly, the SN committee met with Mayor Winnecke to urge him to move more quickly in his pursuit of funding for the gun violence Problem Analysis to be conducted by the National Network for Safe Communities. To date, we still do not have a solid timeframe on when this contract will be signed, nor do we have a set date for the Problem Analysis. We are determined to see the city adopt evidence-based strategies that will reduce gun violence in Evansville.

In case you missed it: Our March 15 Team Assembly (for Team Captains and Clergy), April 12 Rally, and May 10 Nehemiah Action will be conducted virtually. Because we will not set aside time for sign in, these events will begin at 6:00 pm.

A BIG Thank you to all who invested in this system-changing work in 2020!

Because of each of you, CAJE broke the \$70,000 mark - \$72,500.30 to be exact!

You showed your commitment to your Justice Ministry and helped CAJE thrive - in a pandemic!

Pray for friends

In his Gospel, St. Mark tells a story of a paralyzed man whose friends showed great determination to bring his needs before Jesus. The house in which Jesus was speaking was too crowded for their friend, so they lowered him through a hole they made in the roof (Mark 2:1-12). In response, Jesus changed the man's life. Amazing things can happen when we place our friends' needs before Jesus.

Just ask

Jesus tells us to ask God for what we need and to be persistent until we hear from Him. Don't worry about pestering God. Think of how eager we parents are to help our children-especially if they are struggling. It's the same with God - our perfect Father - who never tires of helping us.

"If you then...know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will your heavenly Father give good things to those who ask him" (Matthew 7:11).



Observe a fruitful pandemic Lent

Once again, Lent will look different for many families. One goal of the season is to eliminate distractions and turn our hearts back to God. A few

adjustments to your Lenten observance may help you transform your family's hearts, even in the midst of a pandemic.

Offer it up. So much of what we are experiencing in the pandemic is sacrificial. Use visual aids to help children offer deprivation or sacrifices to God's purposes. For example, place a jar on your kitchen

counter and encourage everyone to place a jelly bean in it each time they suffer a deprivation - a canceled sport season, a missed gathering, a scaleddown birthday celebration. Celebrate by eating the candy at Easter.

Practice gratitude. Gratitude helps to keep everything in perspective. Stay aware of the pleasant moments you

> have with your family and do what you can to create more of them.

> > Be flexible. Accept that the landscape in a pandemic is different. Prioritize your family, your health and the health of your loved ones. Try not to hold onto specific ideas for accomplishing your usual activities.

Swap screen time for prayer time. Spending time watching or reading bad news or

scrolling through social media sites filled with negativity creates stress. Turn to God in family prayer and rest in His presence in your lives.


It is possible to receive the whole Christ in just one form or the other. However, it is most fitting to receive Christ in both forms during the celebration of the Eucharist.

Give your family the gift of "Little Easter"

A few nights later I overheard our ten-year old saying her prayers asking God for help. She ended with, "Thanks for listening. Amen." Then she went to sleep. Standing outside her room, I realized that Tessa didn't tell God what to do. She asked for help, trusted that it would come, and left it to God.

I prayed for the first time in weeks and ended with, "Thanks for listening. Amen." I realized God is always listening. I was the one who had stopped talking.

Mark 9:2-10, The test of the **Transformation**

When Jesus met with Elijah and Moses on the mountaintop, they talked about the journey Jesus was going to make to Jerusalem and the Cross. Perhaps the holy men were offering support and comfort, and Jesus probably felt strengthened by the meeting.

Certainly he was bolstered by hearing the voice from Heaven, Still. he had a difficult road ahead and he realized that despite all of his efforts, some would refuse to listen and would be lost. But God knew that the desire to follow Jesus comes

from confidence about who he is. If we believe Jesus is God's Son then we will want to do what he says. So he

> let the disciples witness the amazing meeting on the mountaintop, and he let them hear the heavenly voice proclaim Jesus as God's son and instruct us to "listen to him."

What can a parent do?

Society may try to tell us what is right, but Jesus' words are our final authority. Help youngsters test everything they hear against Jesus' words in the Bible and they will not be led astray.



February 2 - The Presentation of the Lord. In accordance with the Law of Moses, Mary and Joseph brought Jesus to the temple to make the required offering forty days after his birth. They were faithful observers of the law of the Lord.

February 3 - St. Blaise (316). Bishop of Sebaste, he was martyred for refusing to renounce his Catholic faith. Priests usually bless throats on this day because St. Blaise, reportedly a physician, healed many ailments of the throat.

February 10 - St. Scholastica

(543). Twin sister of St. Benedict, St. Scholastica founded a Benedictine community for women five miles from her brother's monastery. The twins visited each other each year and Scholastica died three days after their last meeting. St. Benedict saw her soul rising heavenward in the form of a dove.

February 17 - Ash Wednesday. The first day of Lent. Ashes from the burnt palms of the previous Passion Sunday are blessed and placed on the foreheads as a sign of penance.
