Parish Council March Meeting Summary

Parish Pastoral Council met on March 2nd.
Fr. Jay reported that the job description for the Parish Life Coordinator is now in the hands of the bishop for consideration. He also reported that the Welborn Foundation contacted All Saints with interest and questions about the justice piece of our proposed grant. Fr. Jay reported on a meeting with Holy Redeemer's pastor and youth minister. A partnership is being discussed for youth ministry.

Sharon is extending the period for nominations for the Parish Council. Members are encouraged to submit the names of parishioners who would be good council members. Nominees do not learn who submitted names. Further discussion about a possible youth representative on council will be taken up at the April meeting.

The parish recently received additional CPC pledges of \$18,000, raising the pledges to 81% of the goal. It was suggested that the federal Covid relief package may help to bring more donations.

There is no update on a music minister. The marketing committee is meeting this month to address post-pandemic return to church.

How are we living in God's covenant?



CAJE Good News: City Council Approves Money for Gun Violence Intervention

On March 8th, in a 9-0 vote, Evansville City Council approved the Mayor's allocation of \$100,000 to begin a GVI partnership with the National Network for Safe Communities!

Seating was restricted to just 12 seats for the public - CAJE members filled nine of them, while additional members were out in the hall, listening.

Mayor Winnecke, in a rare appearance, presented the ordinance and Erin Bloom and Louisa Aviles attended via Zoom to add details and answer questions. Three members of our Safe Neighborhoods committee gave prepared testimonies.

Leading up to last night's council meeting, over 100 CAJE members sent emails to the councilors, urging them to approve the Mayor's allocation. We also did media interviews and hounded city officials by tagging them in social media posts - every single time a shooting has occurred since our CPA.

Furthermore, Mayor Winnecke announced that the administration wants to go all in with a \$385,000 investment for a two year partnership with the NNSC and another \$50,000 will go before council to be included in the next finance ordinance!

Live the Liturgy ~ Inspiration for the Week

How do we convince people that God's law is written upon their hearts? God is wedded to God's people. This is a simple and fundamental fact of life. Yet, many ignore this truth and carry on as if they, or humanity as a whole, are the center of the universe. As a grain of wheat has to fall to the ground and die in order to become what it really is, we too must die to our secular images and ideas of ourselves so that we can become who God really made us to be. If all of us kept our focus on God's deep bonded love with human beings, indeed with our very self, then there would be no need to teach others this fundamental life lesson. They would simply know this truth, as Jeremiah tells us. Somehow, perhaps through original and personal sin, we have lost sight of this reality. We have lost our way and our axis. It is time to find our way back, to learn the virtue of obedience, to pay attention to what God is saying and become aware of the Divine Love that is the reason for all creation. Then, even in our darkest hour when all may seem to be lost, we can say as did Jesus, the model of obedience, "Father, glorify your name," By this perseverance, people can come to know the Lord and what God has done. ©LPi

Justice Challenge ~ 5th Week of Lent

March 22 is World Water Day. The foundation of all Catholic social teaching is respect for the life and dignity of every human person. Fundamental to both life itself and life lived with dignity is access to clean water. Around the world, millions of people—elderly people, children, and all ages in between—suffer because of a scarcity of water.

Your challenge this week is two-fold. First, examine how your family uses water. Do you conserve it as a precious and God-given resource which is not unlimited? Pay attention to how much water you waste (e.g., letting water run while you are brushing your teeth instead of just using it to get your toothbrush wet at the beginning and to rinse at the end). Then on Saturday, discuss how you can limit your use of water and commit to it—at least for the rest of the Lenten season. Secondly, decide on one way you can support people in areas of the world which do not have clean water. You might want to research particular programs of Catholic Relief Services which help people dig wells or purify contaminated water. (Go to www.crs.org for details.) 
