Justice Challenge ~ Holy Week

The First Reading for Palm Sunday is from Isaiah (50:4-7) and contains one of several powerful images of the Suffering Servant found in this book of the Bible. While the author was describing the nation of Israel when he wrote, the passages about the suffering servant took on new meaning after the suffering, death, and resurrection of Jesus. It is easy to see how Jesus embodied the traits of Isaiah's suffering servant, one of which was his peaceful approach to conflict. Jesus exemplified non-violence, even when he was attacked, spat upon, mocked, and scourged. He met violence by turning the other cheek. And he asks us to do the same.

Your challenge this week is to examine your conscience for any signs of violence in your lifein your actions, but also in your words. Make a commitment to responding to violence against your person, be it bullying or being yelled at or being physically attacked, with a strong but peaceful response.

CAJE Update

On March 16th, about a dozen CAJE members attended the County Commissioners meeting as the plan for a mental health and addiction crisis stabilization unit was presented.

CAJE laid out our 6 year timeline of our push for jail diversion and UCS Executive Director, Jason Emmerson, shared the plan and cost-savings projections with the commissioners.

The media interviewed Tom Bogenschutz, Jason Emmerson - and Sheriff Dave Wedding who was there to offer his support for funding the unit.







