



#### Fifth Sunday of Easter Acts of the Apostles 9: 26-31 1 John 3: 18-24 John 15: 1-8

#### Questions of the Week

#### First Reading:

We hear how Peter courageously testified before the Sanhedrin that in Jesus' name the crippled man was healed and in Jesus' name all believers are saved. How strong is the conviction of your faith when someone challenges you?

#### Second Reading:

John speaks to his community of believers as "children of God." What do you see as some of the implications of such a designation?

#### Gospel:

In speaking of himself as "the good shepherd" who cares deeply for his sheep, Jesus contrasts himself to "a hired man" (the Pharisees) who has no concern for his sheep. How should have the Pharisees reacted to this criticism?

#### Parish Council April Meeting Summary

#### Synod Planning Process Update:

Jay reported that he, Gina, and Tad will be meeting with Holy Redeemer on Wednesday to finalize arrangements for youth group. Jay also reported that the PLC information was sent to the bishop who will consult with the priests' group before getting back to us. The parish planning meeting scheduled for the 5<sup>th</sup> was postponed.

No word from Welborn Foundation as of yet concerning the grant submitted by the parish.

#### Discernment of New Members:

Sharon announced that 30 names were submitted for consideration for parish council. A total of 9 are proceeding to discernment.

#### **CPC Update:**

The parish is now at 83% of its goal, a considerable increase over the 70% reported last month. This is \$20,000 below goal but better than last year.

#### **Getting People Back to Church:**

Fred reported on the Marketing Committee's work. This includes: trying to over-communicate using all media means; preparing for small group meetings (Tom's plan), although this may need to wait until the pandemic ends or include some hybrid forms; and "feeding them"-a plan to gather for breakfast before 10:30 church at St. Anthony. Fred also reported that the committee is searching for an appropriate activity to welcome parishioners back to the St. Joseph campus as well. The Fall Festival booth will be arriving at the St. Anthony campus soonperhaps another chance to come back and enjoy some food. The booth will be used for a Marian Outreach fundraiser on May 1.





#### Earth Day

They specifically teach us that abusing the earth is morally wrong.

#### St. Wendel Men's Club Grillin' & Chillin' Cruise-In






