Deliver us from the silence that gives consent to abuse, war and evil.

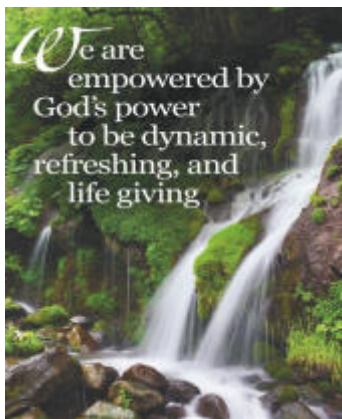
Grant us the desire, and the courage, to risk speaking and acting for the common good.

Parish Council May Meeting Summary



Commission Reports: Work continues on the hiring of a music director with Fr Jay, Sharon, Tom, Laura and Tony serving on the committee. The new collaboration with Holy Redeemer's youth group begins with a Saturday event. Holy Redeemer has multiple activities planned to engage youth over the summer; peer invitations and multiple media notices are being used to contact All Saints youth; approximately 50 parish youth are in the middle school/high school age group. Gina was thanked for her work in helping to develop this program connection.

Synod Planning Process Update: Jay reported that the parish is still waiting for a response to the Welborn Foundation grant application. This should come mid-May. If this is granted, Jay will then contact the bishop concerning the PLC position. The planning committee is looking at alternative grants if needed.

Discernment of New Members: Congratulations to the newly discerned parish council members: Laura Ackerman (2nd term), Melissa Engler, Kathy Reitz, Jim Schulz, and Landon Wagner. New members will begin terms in August.

Marketing Committee Report: Fred and Deavron reported on the planned produce giveaway-previous year's focus was on "come receive fresh produce" -this year the focus in on gardeners and "if you have produce, come, bring, and share." Fred also reported that Deb Miller with WIKY and Evansville Living are involved with media exposure. Evansville Living is planning a feature on the giveaway as well as information about the Seton Harvest farm. The Fall Festival booth's first venture with Marian Educational Outreach was considered a success with 350 meals of 3 tacos, corn, and tortillas being served. A big thanks was given to José and team for assisting the A-Men's group with menu, cooking, and serving. Fred also announced that the committee is working on plans to serve parishioners a "welcome back" breakfast before the 10:30 Mass. Finally, the committee is considering a donor wall, going back to 2015, the year All Saints Parish was formed.

Pastor's Comments: Jay acknowledged the good work and good food of the parish food booth. He also reported on the 160 responses to the parish survey regarding attending church in person: of this group, 70 people are already attending, 8 will be back as soon as they receive the vaccine, 17 back as soon as the pandemic is over, 31 back as soon as they feel safe, and 28 not sure; 57% reported they will attend the 10:30 Mass, 29% will attend the 4:00 service and 17% will attend at 5:00. Jay does not know how long virtual Mass will continue to be offered.
