First Reading:

In return for God's favor, the Israelites are instructed to keep God's statutes and commandments. Why do you think so many people are resistant to this divine expectation?

Second Reading:

Paul sees the Holy Spirit as integral to our identity as "children of God" and "joint heirs with Christ." How do you sense our Triune God at work in your life?

Gospel:

We hear today the closing words in the Gospel of Matthew — Jesus' final commissioning of the disciples to evangelize and baptize in the name of the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. What insights to the nature of God does this divine relationship offer?

Lifting of the Dispensation from the Obligation of Mass

Effective 11 June 2021

For Immediate Release: May 20, 2021

The celebration of the Eucharist at Mass is the source and summit of our life and mission as Catholics.

Since March 2020, due to the outbreak of the COVID-19 pandemic, all Roman Catholics throughout the entire Province of Indianapolis, which comprises all five dioceses of Indiana, have been dispensed from the obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation. However, with the decrease of cases in our state, the widespread availability of vaccines and following the guidance of public health officials, we are now able to safely accommodate more parishioners for Masses. Therefore, **effective June 11**, the Solemnity of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus, the general dispensation from the obligation to attend Mass is hereby lifted throughout the state of Indiana.

Except for the unique situations as described below, those who are otherwise healthy are obliged to return to Sunday Mass by the weekend of June 12-13, 2021:

- Those who are seriously ill, exhibit flu-like symptoms and/or may have a contagious disease (including quarantine due to exposure).
- Those who are unable to attend Mass through no fault of their own (e.g. transportation issue).
- Those who are homebound and/or incapacitated due to age, infirmity and/or medical restrictions.
- Those who have compromised health conditions and/or at high risk of contracting the virus.
- Those who are caretakers of person who are sick or of persons at high-risk of serious illness if they contract COVID-19 virus.

If you have any questions about any specific needs, concerns or protocols, you are advised to contact your parish directly. Your pastor, who has the authority to dispense in individual cases, may be helpful in addressing individual fears and concerns.

The obligation to attend Mass is a joyful one, reflecting the very character of who we are as Catholics. We look forward to welcoming our parishioners each Sunday and Holy Day to worship God as a community of faith and to celebrate the presence of the Risen Christ among us in Word and Sacrament.



Greetings!

It is the end of May, and we are seeing changes throughout our world in how we are living with Covid.

Parishes have received guidelines from the Diocese to consider as we move forward. Our All Saints Parish Virus Committee has reviewed and worked with these guidelines. Below are some of the changes you have already seen, and the precautions we ask you to please continue to take....**beginning immediately.**

- If you have been fully vaccinated, you do NOT have to wear a mask. You can continue to wear your mask if you would like to.
- We ask that if you have any signs or symptoms of Covid, please DO NOT come to Mass.
- Social Distancing: Is not required.
 - At St. Anthony Church, there is a reserved section in the north east area of church. This section is roped off. It is reserved for individuals who want to continue to social distance.
 - At St. Joseph Church, there is a reserved section in south east area of church. This section is roped off. It is reserved for individuals who want to continue to social distance.
- Weekday Masses WILL continue to be held on Tuesday and Thursday mornings at 9 a.m. in St. Anthony Church.
- Holy water will be available at the church doors again.
- Eucharistic ministers will continue using the same pattern. You are encouraged to please continue to receive the Body of Christ on your hand and **not** your tongue.
- Please continue to bring your own missalette if you have one. Missalettes **will** be available at the doors again.
- Gatherings with friends should be social distanced and outside of **church**.
- Hand sanitizer is available and to be used when you enter and leave church and after receiving communion.
- Collection baskets will continue to be set by the doors where they are. Please consider the convenience of giving your weekly or monthly gift online through our website or app.

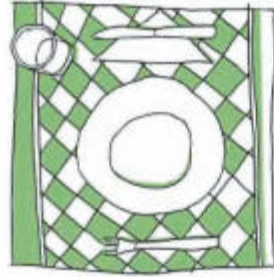


Table Prayer Trinity Sunday Year B

Use this table prayer for mealtime on Trinity Sunday in Lectionary Year B. You will need a Bible to proclaim the reading.

We Gather...

We begin our prayer in the name of the Triune God: the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit.

We Tell the Story....

Reader One

St. Paul teaches us that because we are led by the Spirit, we are children of God – brothers and sisters of Christ.

Reader Two

Proclaim Romans 8:14-17.

St. Paul uses the image of a family to express our participation in the Trinitarian love of God. The Holy Spirit in our hearts makes us sons and daughters of God, and we are free to call God our Father.

Reader Three

All of creation is an outpouring of God's love and is filled with the Spirit. We are brothers and sisters to all. God calls us to love all the members of our earthly family equally.

We Bless Our Food...

We praise you, Lord, for your generous gifts to us. We pray for the day when all of the members of our earthly family will share equally the gifts of creation. We pray our prayer to the Father, through the Son and in the Holy Spirit. Amen.

We Discuss...

The Father, the Son and the Spirit are a perfect communion of love. They are not like a committee of three individuals with competing ideas and conflicting desires. If we are created in the image of this perfect family of love, how can we act in a way that will make the human family look more like the divine family?

We Go Forth...

We leave the fellowship of this table to go forth in service to the Lord through our words and actions, as we close our prayer in the name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit, Amen.

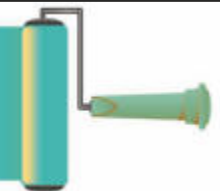
