Justice Challenge

22nd Week in Ordinary Time

It's all about right relationship with the law this week. It is about knowing the commandments and laws, living them, but not living for them. Before entering the Promised Land, Moses reminded the people that their God was rather incredible – their God gave them simple rules to live by and that would be what brought others to want a relationship with God. Their God loved his people enough to give them some guidelines on how to get along with one another and live in right relationship with God. What would set the Hebrew people apart from all the other nations and tribes? Love. It is much easier to talk about this than to do it, though – to follow commandments and to have love at the heart of all our thoughts and actions. We fall short of that as did the Israelites. The Psalms remind us this week that when we live according to the rules of love set for us we are living just lives, worthy of the presence of God. When Jesus came, he said those laws were okay, but really what we needed was the law written on our heart. Laws that would just come naturally because we know we are loved by God. This is our hope as Christians.

What is the law written on our hearts? How do you describe it and live it out?

One thing that Jesus spoke of in the Gospel of Mark was that the Pharisees looked at the outward things – what a person was eating, wearing and doing. Jesus said that isn't what the law is about – that isn't what is really in one's heart. By our actions, our heart is made known.

Have you been quick to judge outward appearances? **This week**, try to see beyond the surface with those you meet, live with and work alongside. Note the changes in perspective by the week's end.

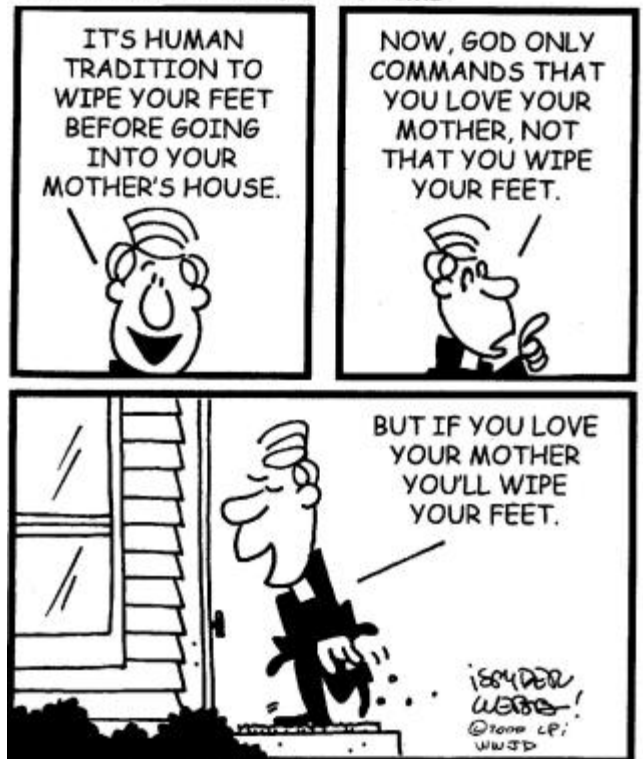

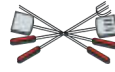

Faith and Racial Justice turns a group of individuals into a community rooted in trust and compassion. Through new learning from articles, videos, and resource books, it lends new insights to participants' awareness of privilege and racism. By encouraging new spiritual practices and informed action, it cultivates an expanding community of Christians who work to dismantle racism in their respective contexts.

- Eight 2½ hour sessions, plus an opening retreat and immersion experience.
- Cost for the program is \$30 or \$40 depending on whether you need the book *40 Days of Prayer*. The cost covers the cost of books and any support materials.
- Internet access is required since some reading material is only available online and we MAY be meeting via Zoom.
- Program will be offered in person and/or Zoom depending on Covid and out of area participants.

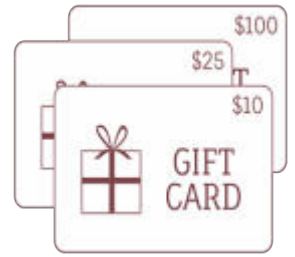
