

#### Justice Challenge

#### 28th Week in Ordinary Time

On October 11 we honor Pope Saint John XXIII. This is the pope who shepherded the Second Vatican Council. He also wrote several encyclicals, one in his last year of life in which he focused on war and peace. #### **Creation Care News**

While monarch migration is a well-known phenomenon, it's not the norm when it

comes to butterflies. In fact, the vast majority of butterflies and moths overwinter in the landscape as an egg, caterpillar, chrysalis, or adult. In all but the warmest climates, these butterflies use leaf litter for

winter cover. Great spangled fritillary and wooly bear caterpillars tuck themselves into a pile of

leaves for protection from cold weather and predators. Red-banded hairstreaks lay their eggs on fallen oak leaves, which become the first food of the caterpillars when they emerge. Luna moths and swallowtail butterflies disguise their cocoons and chrysalises as dried leaves, blending in with the "real" leaves. There are many such examples.
