"The Father Deydier House of Discernment opened upon its third year in the fall of 2020. Four new House residents began their discernment under the leadership of House Chaplain, Father Tyler Tenbarge. The House exists to serve young men as they discern whether God is calling them to seminary in the year after they live at the House. The House also hosts a weekly Monday Night Holy Hour & Mass

for Vocations at Sacred Heart Church, at which more than 150 people usually attend, about half of whom are young adult Catholics. The third component is the House is the monthly Savio Night gatherings for teenage guys. There, these young men are formed in the faith and have begun their own discernment of their vocations." 

## **Creation Care News**

According to a 2005 NASA estimate, there are around 40 million acres of lawn in

the continental United States – making turf grass the single largest "crop" we grow. This disproportionate ratio of lawn to garden is the main reason we rake, mow, and blow. To mimic the natural ecosystem an animal needs, a layer of leaves needs to be at least a couple of inches thick. While this would be too much of a good thing for turf grass to handle—research has shown that lawns actually benefit from a thin layer of leaves, and the rest can be piled up around ornamental trees, shrubs, and perennials to no ill effect.



## **CAJE October Updates**

Some of you may have seen CAJE members on the news Monday night...

The good news: CAJE had 16 people present and Rev. Edwards reminded City Council members that Evansville has a rare opportunity, with the influx of funds from the ARPA, to properly fund the Affordable Housing Trust and asked the council to consider \$10 million for 2021! Rev. Gerald Arnold, one of the founders of CAJE and current president of the NAACP, gave a statement of support for CAJE's efforts.

We know nothing more than we did a week ago. It IS frustrating but we are encouraged that several councilors agree that there must be more money in the AHTF.

We are in the same boat with *both city & county* funding commitments for the Evansville Diversion Center (located at United Caring Services). As soon as we know something solid, we will call and/or email our membership.

We have some **special plans** for our <u>annual</u> <u>Community Problems Assembly - Monday, Nov. 15,</u> <u>6:00 - 8:15!</u> This will be a hybrid event. Holy Redeemer Catholic Parish will host the event AND livestream on Facebook. We will also provide a Zoom link for members who wish to watch the livestream but do not have a Facebook account.
