

End-of-Year-Giving Option

ARE YOU 701/2 OR OLDER?

When planning your year-end giving, you may want to consider making a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD) from your IRA.

WHAT IS A QCD?

A Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD) is a direct transfer of funds from your IRA to a qualified charity. QCDs can be counted toward satisfying your Required Minimum Distributions (RMDs) for the year, as long as certain rules are met.

WHY GIVE WITH A QCD?

Making a gift with a QCD is a tax advantageous way to make gifts supporting your parish or ministry of choice.

- Satisfy your Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) with your gift.
- ❖ Allows you to give from pre-tax assets with your gift not being counted as taxable income.
- Your gift comes from your assets instead of your checkbook.
- It's easy to do! Just notify the custodian of your IRA.

OCD REQUIREMENTS

While many IRAs are eligible for QCDs there are requirements:

- You must be 70½ years old, or older, to be eligible to make a QCD.
- QCDs are limited to the amount that would otherwise be taxed as ordinary income.
- There are maximum annual gift amounts that can qualify for a QCD.
- For a QCD to count towards your current year's RMD, the funds must come out of your IRA by your RMD deadline, generally by December 31.

Any amount given above your RMD does not count toward satisfying a future year's RMD.

Funds distributed directly to you, the IRA owner, which you then give to charity, do not qualify as a QCD.

Creation Care News

Let your wildflowers go to seed for the birds—it is amazing and fun to watch how

many birds fed on sunflower seeds—and let your vegetable garden bolt to provide resources for pollinators. Allow some messiness. When trimming back bushes, pile the branches in out-of-the-way places where they can provide shelter for overwintering bumble bees or butterflies. When the leaves fall, rake them but do not discard them. Instead, pile them on garden beds or in the corners of the yard where they might be used by the animals that need this shelter. In the spring, either dig them into the garden beds or put them in the compost. Look at what is using these leaves. Spiders and pill bugs are common, as are predatory centipedes and beetles. Where the leaves are in contact with the soil, you will often find great numbers of earthworms that help make better soil for the garden.
