

All Saints Health Ministry Offering Daily Devotions for Lent "Walking (Movement) to the Cross"



Walking (Movement) to the Cross is a devotional program designed for the season of Lent. The program is for people of all ages and health conditions. It offers opportunity to reflect on our own sacrificial service to God and others. God asks us to care for what He cares for. Begins March 13, four weeks of goal setting, scripture, prayer and increased movement.

This self-directed program offers:

- Setting a weekly "movement goal" or a reasonable physical challenge for yourself.
- Movement chosen to meet your needs may be walking or stretching or exercise.
- A weekly goal, daily passage of Scripture along with a thought and a prayer.
- Read any time of the day, or reflect during your chosen activity (movement).
- Weekly check in to see the progress of all participants or answer questions.

Family Faith Formation "Say the Word and My Soul Shall be Healed."

People reaching for God and God reaching for people. We can't get there on our own.

Why do you notice the splinter in your brother's eye, but do not perceive the wooden beam in your own? How can you say to your brother, "Brother; let me remove that splinter in your eye," when you do not even notice the wooden beam in your own eye? You hypocrite! Remove the wooden beam from your eye first; then you will see clearly to remove the splinter in your brother's eye.

Sunday's Gospel has Jesus challenging us about critiquing the speck in our brother's eye when we have a wooden beam in our own. This speaks to Jesus' sense of humor, but also to his passion for seeing everyone as created in God's image. As Pope Francis would say, "Who are we to judge?" Your challenge this week is to think of a person or a group of people whom you have judged. Spend some time in prayer and reflection, recalling that they are children of God and looking for signs of goodness that you may not have seen before. Then pray for them sincerely and honestly, asking God to bless them and help them to grow deeper in their love for him.





8th Sunday of Ordinary Time

This Wednesday is Ash Wednesday. We enter into the holy season of Lent, beginning our journey to the Cross and beyond that to Resurrection. The three Lenten practices are fasting, almsgiving, and prayer.

Your challenge this week is to choose something from which you will fast for the next six weeks to stand in solidarity with those who cannot have it; to give generously to a cause which fights injustice and helps those in need; and to pray during Lent for those across the world who suffer from oppression intolerance, prejudice, or any other form of injustice.

Also, on March 3rd we celebrate the life of St. Katharine Drexel. Born into extreme wealth, Katharine gave away millions and devoted herself to helping Native Americans and African Americans, particularly through education. She founded the first university for black people in
