Justice Challenge

5th Week of Lent

What is the role of anger and rage in our lives? What purpose does it serve? We often think that when we feel anger, we need to express it... we need to get it out of our system. Perhaps anger has a different purpose as Jesus suggests to the angry crowd that is about to hurl stones at the guilty woman. Perhaps anger is a signal that there is something wrong inside of us, some pain that has surfaced because we have witnessed an injustice in the world and our consciences are feeling pricked. Anger can trick us into thinking that the injustice is outside of us or that we are above it. But Jesus suggests that when we seek justice with anger, rage, or revenge, we should use our anger to look within and hurl stones at our own sin. The challenge this week is to address the injustice that has root in our own souls.

Tri-State Creation Care / "Energy for All"

We want to share with you all that Tri-State CC has entered into the coalition, "Energy for All" with 13 other environmental, social justice, and consumer advocacy groups to address high energy rates and to challenge the future that CenterPoint intends with the construction of two "peaker" plants. Our statement makes three demands:

- That CenterPoint Immediately take steps to alleviate the burden their exorbitant rates have caused this community.
- That they provide full transparency on the details of the utility billing process and full transparency in the cost basis for those bills.
- That they abandon their ill-conceived and expensive gas fueled pants as the means to meet the future energy needs of our community.



Lay a foundation

Don't hesitate to talk to children about topics that may seem beyond youngsters' understanding right now. The Holy Trinity or the Real Presence might go over their heads at this moment, but will become clearer in time. Others will remain mysteries as they do for us. Look at it as sowing seeds for later harvest.

Prayer works

The Israelites were so sinful that God was ready to destroy the entire nation. But Moses prayed for them, and God relented. Prayer can make a difference.

A parenting win

Say, "I love you," until they're sick of hearing it ... and then say it again. Praise them in public like God did, "This is my beloved Son, in whom I am well pleased" (Matthew 3:17).

When you give alms, do not let your left hand know what your right is doing ... And your Father who sees in secret will repay you" (Matthew 6:3-4).



Take back Sunday

In the Third Commandment, God instructed us to keep holy the Lord's Day - Sunday. This is a challenge in today's busy world but God commands this for our good. We need

a day of rest to grow in holiness and thrive in God's care. Try these tips to "take back" your Sundays in the midst of a busy family

Highlight the Mass. It's vital for our souls that we reconnect with God and

Have a slow, easy day, especially if


your weeks are busy. Slow down the pace of your Sunday and focus on your

Share love. Allow Mass to remind all to be patient, use kind words, forgive annoyances, show love. Consider adopting a Sunday habit of putting money in the poor box at church, visiting a lonely neighbor, or preparing a box for a food or clothing drive.




Why do Catholics practice Adoration?

Adoration is a time-honored, powerful devotion in which the priest exposes a consecrated host in a display holder called a "monstrance." The adorer is literally eve-toeve with Christ, in the form of the Blessed Sacrament, who gazes on us with love (Mark 10:21).

Since one is adoring God, this action fulfills the First

Commandment. It's pleasing to Him and beneficial for our souls. For these reasons. Adoration has a unique place among Catholic devotions (Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC), #1378).







GOSPEL

In Bible days, people who did wrong were stoned to death. Jesus changed that. He said, "If you have never done anything wrong, throw the first stone." Everyone makes mistakes. A rock can hurt people, animals, cars, and houses. When you say bad things about someone, you are throwing a rock at them. The rock might come back and hurt you, too. If you can not say something nice about someone, pray for them.

PRAYER

Lord, help me pray for others rather than judge them.
