- C. forgave his wife of her indiscretions; uses his marriage & children as a metaphor for the problems in Israel.
- D. great-great grandson of King Hezekiah of Judah; prophesied in Jerusalem; spoke out against corruption and idolatry.
- E. God told him to go to Nineveh; swallowed by a whale; got the people to repent.

Congregations Acting for Justice & Empowerment (CAJE) Campaign Issue Updates January 21, 2022

Safe Neighborhoods:

- National Network for Safe Communities (NNSC) has completed and delivered to the Mayor and the EPD
 the problem analysis for the city of Evansville along with a list of recommendations to help decrease the
 number of murders and non-fatal shootings occurring. Twenty-one murders in 2021 saw one of the
 highest death tolls since the late 60s.
- The problem analysis (using 2020 data) showed that 56% of gun violence in the city was caused by .09% of the population.
- The city will create and maintain a Custom Notification Team comprised of law enforcement, community members, and social service providers who will directly communicate to this .09% of the population
 1) a community message against violence 2) a credible law enforcement message about consequences for continued violence 3) a credible and genuine offer of help to those who want it.

Evansville Affordable Housing:

- CAJE's steering committee for affordable housing has continued to work on getting clarification about how
 much the major is going to propose to go into Evansville's Affordable Housing Trust Fund over the next
 two years. We met with Katie Hines by zoom (who is with a national group that helps communities
 develop local affordable housing trust funds) on Jan. 6th and found out that the final rules for the use of
 American Rescue Plan monies were published that day. We forwarded the 4 page introduction to the rules
 to the mayor the same day and have asked when he is going to let us know. We are going to follow up
 with a request for a meeting.
- Brenda Meyer has been attending the local HOUSE meetings and participating in the process to identify
 what the current problems are for our area. Linda Henzman has been attending Evansville Trust Fund
 meetings to monitor their actions and the use of the money.

Warrick County Affordable Housing:

- CAJE has a unique opportunity with the Warrick County Affordable Housing Campaign. Due to the American Rescue Plan funding, this committee is researching how to create an Affordable Housing Trust Fund as well as the different kinds of Trust Funds.
- The committee had a research visit with Debbie Bennett-Stearsman. She is an independent grant writer that the County Commissioners hired to help them with the ARP funding and rules.
- There will be a time that we ask the members of CAJE to come support our neighbors in Warrick County by attending County Council and Commissioner meetings and sharing testimonies.

Dual Diagnosis:

- The committee learned about the Stone Family donation to create a mental health center in Evansville as
 a part of the IU School of Medicine. Because of Mayor Winnecke's update at the November CPA the
 committee sent him a letter asking him if he had more information about it. He says he doesn't and plans
 for a meeting with Mayor Winnecke are being discussed.
- The committee did a research visit with Scott Branam the CAO of Deaconess Crosspointe. He also doesn't know much about this new center or if they will treat patients diagnosed with Autism.
- We were given new information regarding Southwestern Behavioral Health looking to possibly apply for a
 grant that would give them the ability to expand services in the community.
- Further research meetings are being scheduled so we can continue to get information.

Housing Security:

- The new research committee has had a couple of research visits. Both were meetings regarding the rising
 cost of utility bills. The committee learned a lot of great information during those meetings. There is still
 more that needs to be learned in terms of Center Point Energy and utility bills.
- In February the committee will do research meetings with agencies that will hopefully give us more
 information on housing conditions and absentee landlord as well as continue to research the rising utility
 bills.


