2nd Sunday of Easter

A consistent theme in Catholic social teaching is the preferential option for the poor and vulnerable. God loves all people but has a soft spot in his heart for the poor and vulnerable members of society. Thomas was vulnerable because he missed out on the first appearance of Jesus to the Apostles. He was an outsider among the group, and he expressed his sense of being "distant" by refusing to believe their story. When Jesus arrived again with Thomas present, he directed his attention to the vulnerable Thomas. Jesus loved all of his followers, but Thomas was in need of special, preferential attention. Jesus delivered, and Thomas believed. **The challenge this week** is to give attention to the outsider in your group. Draw that person back in with your love. Question of the Week



First Reading:

Luke tells us of the success and healing power of the apostles in the Jerusalem church in the early days, weeks, and months following Jesus' resurrection. Where do you see this level of enthusiasm for the faith today?

Second Reading:

The resurrected Jesus appears to John on the island of Patmos during his exile for bearing witness to the faith. In this encounter, John is initially fearful but then reassured by Jesus. When have you turned to Jesus in moments of fear in your life?

Gospel:

The apostle Thomas challenges his fellow apostles about the reality of Jesus' resurrection, seeking direct evidenced from Jesus himself. How often do you encounter fellow believers who are skeptical in their faith?

Food Donations

We accept small canned/packaged food donations anytime — some specifics listed on the needs list. We accept left-overs from catered meals daily until 6 pm (if later, please call ahead to arrange). We accept and will pick up large food donations directly from local businesses (based on needs & storage capacity) preferably with an inventory list, expiration dates, and estimated values (for a gift receipt and tax purposes). We accept or pick up large food donations **M-F, 8:00am – 2:30pm**. Other days/or later times need to be arranged.

Accepted Donations

We appreciate the generosity of our donors who provide many of the necessities we use each day. Please note that we ask that all items be **clean**, **safe**, **and in working condition**. New and used items are accepted in most instances; however, if the item is something you would never use, wear or desire then the same goes for the people we serve.

Find out more about our needs by checking the urgent and ongoing needs lists.

Household items, small appliances; Backpacks & small luggage; Cleaning supplies & equipment; Bath towels & Washcloths; Studio Apartment Furniture; *NEW* Twin Mattresses, Springs, Frames; Household Tools; Electronics; TVs (LED/LCD); WIN10 PCs/Laptops/ Tablets; Monitors (LED/LCD); Cards, Games, Sporting goods.

Special Points of Interest

Baptism of children should be arranged in advance by contacting Fr. Davidson at the Parish Office.

Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults (RCIA): Those wishing to become Catholic or learn more about the Catholic faith may call the Parish Office.

Marriage: Couples planning to be married should contact Fr. Davidson at least six months before the wedding date. This ensures time for adequate preparation.

Anointing of the Sick: Please call the Parish Office. It is best to arrange the anointing while the person who is ill can participate.

Catholic Schools: Grades K-12, open to children of our parishioners. Contact Sharon Vogler at the Parish Office to ask about our policy of sponsoring students in Catholic Schools.
