



Justice Challenge 3rd Week of Easter

It was a huge catch of fish..."so many fish they could not haul the net in.... In spite of the great number, the net was not torn." Yes, there is room for more. The net represents the Church. Our churches need to be full, but they often are not. Why? There are certainly plenty of people populating the areas around most churches, yet the people aren't joining. Perhaps we are only casting our nets in familiar waters. Jesus suggests casting the net elsewhere. The challenge is to expand our vision of who should belong. Are there people living in your community who might not be desirable members of your church? Start talking to other parishioners about how to reach out to them. The net is strong enough to hold all of you together.

OR

May 5th is a day to remember St. Hilary of Arles, a 5th century bishop. He used his office to serve the poor. He did manual labor to earn money for the poor, and was known to sell sacred vessels to pay ransom for those who were held captive. He was a man who did what he could do with the resources at his disposal. This is the call of all Christians. Do something good for Christ using whatever is available to you. **The challenge this week** is to examine your daily routine. What kind of influence do you have? What are your resources? How can you use your influence and your resources to do something good for someone or some community that needs your help?

Food Donations

We accept small canned/packaged food donations anytime — some specifics listed on the needs list. We accept left-overs from catered meals daily until 6:00pm (if later, please call ahead to arrange). We accept and will pick up large food donations directly from local businesses (based on needs & storage capacity) preferably with an inventory list, expiration dates, and estimated values (for a gift receipt and tax purposes). We accept or pick up large food donations M-F, 8:00am – 2:30pm. Other days/or later times need to be arranged.

Accepted Donations

We appreciate the generosity of our donors who provide many of the necessities we use each day. Please note that we ask that all items be clean, safe, and in working condition. New and used items are accepted in most instances; however, if the item is something you would never use, wear or desire then the same goes for the people we serve.

Household items, small appliances; Backpacks & small luggage; Cleaning supplies & equipment; Bath towels & Washcloths; Studio Apartment Furniture; *NEW* Twin Mattresses, Springs, Frames; Household Tools; Electronics; TVs (LED/LCD); WIN10 PCs/Laptops/ Tablets; Monitors (LED/LCD); Cards, Games, Sporting goods.

Special Points of Interest

Baptism of children should be arranged in advance by contacting Fr. Davidson at the Parish Office.

Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults (RCIA): Those wishing to become Catholic or learn more about the Catholic faith may call the Parish Office.

Marriage: Couples planning to be married should contact Fr. Davidson at least six months before the wedding date. This ensures time for adequate preparation.

Anointing of the Sick: Please call the Parish Office. It is best to arrange the anointing while the person who is ill can participate.

Catholic Schools: Grades K-12, open to children of our parishioners. Contact Sharon Vogler at the Parish Office to ask about our policy of sponsoring students in Catholic Schools.

Family Faith Formation: Religious Education for families and children is available. Please call Sharon Vogler at the Parish Office.






<u>The annual Nehemiah Action will be</u> Monday, May 9, 2022 at Old National Events Plaza.

Parish Pastoral Council Meeting Summary April 5, 2022



Jim Schulz led prayer.

March minutes were approved.

Commission reports were reviewed.

Building & Finance: They are working on the budgets.

Several of our youth attended the Source & Summit a diocesan retreat for youth and young adults that focuses on the Eucharist.

Synod: We had about 40 people in attendance, in person and through Zoom. Feedback and opinions were shared.

Parish Synod: We continue our search for a Parish Life Coordinator. We are very close to finding our Justice Minister.

Boilers have been installed and are working well. AC will be going in shortly.

Tom shared that the Stewardship on Time, Talent & Treasure video was shown this past weekend at the Masses.

Marketing Committee: For Synod we sent out about 1600 cards in a 1-mile radius from church.

Other: Parish Council is losing 3 positions this year and will need to fill those. The discernment process will begin the weekend after Easter.

Pastor's Comments: Fr. Jay reminded everyone that on **April 11** we will be holding the CAJE Rally at. St. Anthony Church.

Next Month's Meeting will be held **Tuesday**, **May 3** beginning at 6:00pm. This meeting is scheduled to be hybrid.

Talk about God

Children are naturally curious about God. Discuss your child's concept of Him. Does he see God as a loving parent or a harsh police officer, for example. Children are more likely to want to spend time with someone who is kind. Remind them that Jesus wants us to know God as our Father who loves and accepts each of us unconditionally.

A family novena

Introduce your children to the power of the novena. Together choose an intention and spend the next nine days praying about it. You can pray the Rosary for nine days, recite the Divine Mercy chaplet, or even write a novena service of your own. Even better, find out if your parish has a novena service you can attend as a family.

"And he went down with them and came to Nazareth, and was obedient to them; and his mother kept all these things in her heart" (Luke 2:51).



Help children love the Mass

At each Catholic Mass, Jesus Christ becomes sacramentally present among us, feeding us with the fullness of love. Helping children know and love the Mass will help them experience His love throughout their lives.

Prioritize. A busy family can have competing activities throughout a weekend. Yet, going to church together sends a strong message to children that Mass is more important than any of them. Don't miss Mass on Sunday or Holy

Days. If you know you'll be traveling for vacation, research nearby Catholic churches and Mass times beforehand.

Prepare. Discuss the Gospel before Mass and read Scripture together often. Help children perform a daily examination of conscience and go to Confession regularly to ensure everyone eligible can receive Communion.

Pray. Praying as a family is one of the ways to activate the graces we receive through the Sacraments. Start with

a decade of the Rosary or

meals or bedtime. Our sacramental life sanctifies our everyday life. Sing. Children (of all ages) can connect with the celebration of Mass through

the hymns. See

who can sing the loudest.

Celebrate! The Sacraments are channels of God's life, love, and grace. Write a special family prayer you can pray together to thank God for His many gifts after Mass. Afterwards, celebrate with a special dessert or fun family activity.



Why do Christians pray?

The world's religions bear witness to the truth that God's children yearn for the One who created us. In turn, He draws us to the mysterious encounter known as prayer.

Prayer is the raising of our minds and hearts to God, or the petition of good things from Him that are in harmony with His will. Christian prayer is the personal and living relationship of the children of God with their Father, with His Son Jesus Christ, and with the Holy Spirit. It's how we stay connected with the One who loves us most.

Encourage children to embrace Mary's virtues

May is a month in which we honor our Blessed Mother in gratitude for leading us to her Son. She shows us how to follow Him by sharing the practice of virtues, such as:

Humility. Even when Mary learned she would be the mother of the Savior, she still considered herself a "lowly handmaid" (Luke 1:48). She surrendered to God's will. Children can practice humility by doing what they're asked willingly and quickly, and by waiting their turns patiently.

Generosity. After the Annunciation, Mary

hurried to Elizabeth's house knowing that her cousin would need help when St. John was born. Children can look for ways to help at home. They can also be merciful by letting go of grudges and choosing forgiveness instead.

Gratitude. Mary's Magnificat is a prayer of praise, joy, and thanksgiving to God for blessing her and fulfilling His promises. Tell children to say "thank you" when someone does something nice for them. Encourage them to look for ways to share their gifts with others in need.



Luke 24:46-53, Know Him, love like Him

The disciples' heads had to have been spinning. Jesus reminded them that His suffering, death and Resurrection had been part of God's plan and that they should tell everyone about it and invite them to repent. Then, He ascended and was taken from their sight.

As they stood staring at the heavens, two angels appeared to clarify matters for them. Jesus was enthroned in Heaven, but He had left them with a mission. They had to build up and maintain the Church and tell everyone the Good News. The blessings of

the New Covenant come through the preaching of the Gospel and the administration of the Sacraments that were entrusted to the Church. Salvation now extends beyond Israel to encompass all nations. Then other generations after them would encounter Christ and believe in Him.

> What can a parent do? Tell children about Jesus and

how He wants us to live. Tell them His story, spend time with Him in prayer, and receive the Sacraments regularly. Then people will know we belong to Christ if we treat them like He did.

May 1 - St. Joseph the Worker (1st century). Entrusted with the care of the Blessed Mother and Jesus, Joseph was a humble carpenter who was dedicated to his family and obedient to God.



May 19 - St. Celestine V (1296). Born in Italy, Peter di Morrone was a

the order of the Celestines as a branch of the Benedictine order. He was elected pope and accepted because the papacy had been vacant for two years. He resigned to return to his humble, pre-papal life but was imprisoned by his successor and died in prison.

May 30 - St. Joan of Arc (1431). Patron of France, St. Joan was inspired by God in a vision to lead the French to victory during the Hundred Year's War against England. She was captured and falsely accused of sorcery. She

was canonized in 1920.
