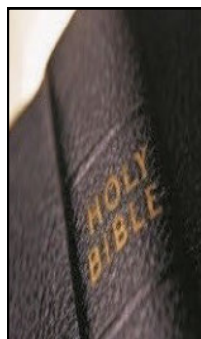

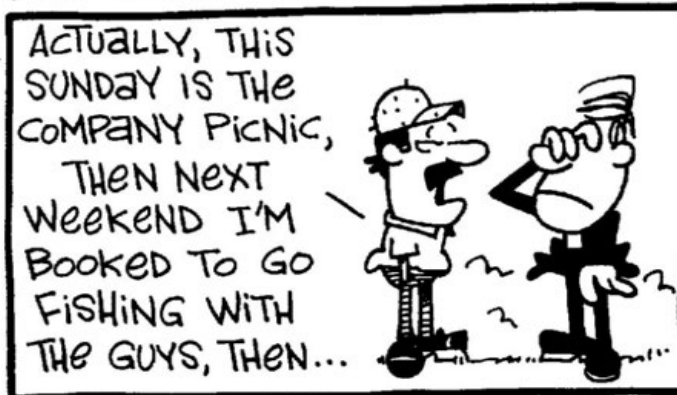

Sound system is down at St. Joe. Quotes are being obtained for repairs.

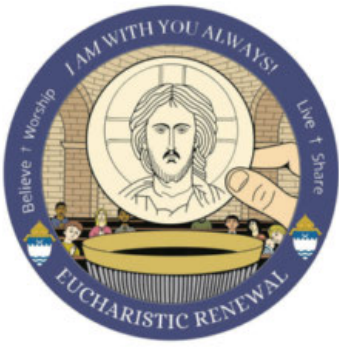

Eucharistic Renewal

The Diocese of Evansville has kicked off a Eucharistic Renewal in which our Parishes, Catholic Schools and Diocesan Offices will be participating! At the same time, all of the Catholic dioceses in the United States will be holding a Eucharistic Renewal (referred to as a "revival" on the national level). Eventually, the Renewal will culminate in a National Eucharistic Congress in Indianapolis from July 17–21, 2024.

The Eucharistic Renewal in our diocese focuses on four goals:

1. *Believe*: Foster belief in the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist.
2. *Worship*: Foster attendance at Mass, as well as valuing Mass in its entirety.
3. *Live*: Encourage living in such a way so as to reflect the Eucharist in our daily lives.
4. *Share*: Encourage sharing the truth, beauty and goodness of Mass with others so that they in turn may be drawn to it.

As part of our participation in the Renewal, I will be sharing responses from members of the parish. I hope you will enjoy reading their thoughts, be encouraged by their thoughts, and be challenged to look at how you see and live the Eucharist as part of your life.

1. Why is it important to you to attend Mass?

Mass makes me feel faithful and fulfilled.

2. What does it mean to you to receive the Eucharist/Body of Christ?

I feel like I can function and am safe for another week.

3. How does receiving the Eucharist/Body of Christ help you, change you, challenge you?

I feel connected and cared for at the same time.

4. How is your receiving the Eucharist/Body of Christ reflected in your life, shared with your world?

Watching Mass isn't the same as receiving the Eucharist and the Eucharist isn't Mass, but it doesn't seem the same with out others. I'm not sure how I share it with others other than in the Mass.

5. Other thoughts you'd like to share.

I struggled with the idea of the Eucharist being the body and blood of Christ. For years I considered it symbolic. It wasn't until I had a spiritual experience where I felt the presence of God wrap me up in swaddling cloth that I decided if I could be touched once that God was quite capable of doing this regularly and I could believe.

From Rich...

1. Why is it important to you to attend Mass?

There are 2 parts to this question for me. First, church is community. Attending Mass is being part of a community. Second, is the Eucharist itself. Eucharist is a crucial link for Catholicism. The Body of Christ is exemplified in the Eucharist.

2. What does it mean to you to receive the Eucharist/Body of Christ?

That makes me included in the community. The symbol of Eucharist is awesome...all of the grains of wheat making one bread and all of us people making on body.

3. How does receiving the Eucharist/Body of Christ help you, change you, challenge you?

Help you..Helps me reflect. I have a hard time reflecting. I'm not good at meditative prayer. I Need all of the help I can get to reflect.

Change you...At my time in life, there are a lot of things I can't do anymore as part of the church and larger community. The Eucharist lets me still be included even though I can't be active in ways I have been in the past.

Challenge you...It challenges me because the Eucharist is Christ coming to me and when I think of the gospel message, it is a challenge. I often feel powerless to do what the gospel calls us to be.

4. How is your receiving the Eucharist/Body of Christ reflected in your life, shared with your world?

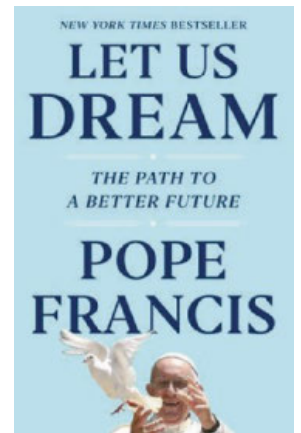
Eucharist to me is the core in the gospel message. I used to be able to physically do a lot. Now, I pry more. I'm left with not being able to do as much. I used to be involved in doing justice. Now I can make financial contributions. The Eucharist brings us into community. By participating and receive the Eucharist, I can be part of life as the gospel calls us to be.

Let Us Dream: The Path to A Better Future.

We have a great history of justice and charity work at All Saints, but the COVID pandemic has affected us all. Some are not yet comfortable returning to Mass, much less attending public meetings or activities.

I have been thinking about a book I read as we were all hunkering down during the pandemic. It's called:

Let Us Dream: The Path to A Better Future. This is a small book (6 x 8½ x 5¾) and 144 pages. Pope Francis wrote this book for American Catholics during the COVID crisis. He tells us we enter a crisis to be sifted, but we do not come out of a crisis the same as we were, but either better or worse. He suggests we need to think about what we experienced, what we saw and how our hearts were tested. The temptation is to retreat, and Pope Francis says instead we should make things better. "This is a moment to dream big, to rethink our priorities—what we value, what we want, what we seek—and to commit to act in our daily life on what we have dreamed of."



I think it would be immensely helpful to take time to consider his words and how they might apply to us. Things that were important to us before COVID, may not be now and something else may really be where we want to put our energies.

As the new Justice Minister at All Saints Parish, I would like us to start off the new Justice Ministry with both support and discovery. I envision the impact that can happen if many of us take 4 hours out of our busy life to think about COVID's impact and what it means to us, our community and what we should do as a result.

I will facilitate a small discussion group of Pope Francis' book **Let Us Dream** and include time for prayer for justice in the world, in our country, in our community, in our Parish, in our Justice Ministry and in ourselves. We would meet four times before Mass to discuss Pope Francis' book **Let Us Dream**.

The book is divided into four sessions:

- Prologue - first session
- A Time To See - second session
- A Time To Choose - third session
- A Time To Act and Epilogue – fourth session

Times are set to fit into your day if you are already coming to a particular Mass:

St. Joseph Church- Saturday, June 25, and July 2, 2- 3:00pm.

St. Anthony Chapel- Sunday, July 10, 17, 26 and 31, 9-10:00am.

St. Anthony Chapel- Sunday, August 7, 14, 21, and 28 3:30-4:30pm.

I will arrange a Zoom meeting series either during the day or evening during the week if there is interest.
