Which of these three, in your opinion, was neighbor to the robbers' victim?


He answered, The one who treated him with mercy. Jesus said to him, Go and do likewise.

#### **Eucharistic Renewal**

The Diocese of Evansville has kicked off a Eucharistic Renewal in which our Parishes, Catholic Schools and Diocesan Offices will be participating! At the same time, all of the Catholic dioceses in the United States will be holding a Eucharistic Renewal (referred to as a "revival" on the national level). Eventually, the Renewal will culminate in a National Eucharistic Congress in Indianapolis from July 17–21, 2024.

#### The Eucharistic Renewal in our diocese focuses on four goals:

- 1. Believe: Foster belief in the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist.
- 2. Worship: Foster attendance at Mass, as well as valuing Mass in its entirety.
- 3. Live: Encourage living in such a way so as to reflect the Eucharist in our daily lives.
- **4.** *Share:* Encourage sharing the truth, beauty and goodness of Mass with others so that they in turn may be drawn to it.

As part of our participation in the Renewal, I will be sharing responses from members of the parish. I hope you will enjoy reading their thoughts, be encouraged by their thoughts, and be challenged to look at how you see and live the Eucharist as part of your life.

#### From a member of the parish...

1. Why is it important to you to attend Mass?

The community is so much a part of what it means to attend mass in person! I really missed that connection when we had to attend via the website during the pandemic. And because we attend in person we are able to receive the Body & Blood of Christ which is a BIG part of our faith and religion!

- 2. What does it mean to you to receive the Eucharist/Body of Christ?
- I found during the time we could not attend mass in person, that the Body of Christ was what I missed the most! We are accepting Christ, time & time again as we receive his Body each & every mass we attend, in our lives and need to have his nourishment to continue our work on earth!
- 3. How does receiving the Eucharist/Body of Christ help you, change you, challenge you? It brings me many reminders of why I am Catholic,. Not just because that is how I was raised from a baby on up, but it reminds me constantly that Christ is the MOST important person in my life! I am trying to be more & more like him every day, week, month & year that I am still here on earth. Do I still falter? The change is, Of course we all do as humans, but we get to start over every day we wake up to begin another day of being like Christ! Listening, healing, helping, etc. in any and every way we can! The challenge is because it is not just about giving money, it means taking your time to be with them and helping them in any way you can, even just listening while they talk, and helping them get better as well.
- 4. How is your receiving the Eucharist/Body of Christ reflected in your life, shared with your world? I believe that receiving the Body of Christ is making me a much better person in general. I try to be kinder to the person that cut me off in traffic, to a coworker that will not listen to what I said to do, help anyone that I can ( like crossing a busy street, getting up and down from a chair, visiting someone in my neighborhood or elsewhere that is lonely, even if it is a phone call or in person, etc), help someone reach that item in the grocery store that is on the top shelf, let someone go before me at the grocery store that only has a couple of items while I have many items in my cart, or just pray for those that are less fortunate that I am.
- 5. Other thoughts you'd like to share.

We all need each other to make a difference in our world. We can only get better. Even when we think we are doing great, there is always room for improvement in all of us! Each of us has a place in life that we must strive to be at before Jesus calls us home with him.

#### Let Us Dream: The Path to A Better Future.

We have a great history of justice and charity work at All Saints, but the COVID pandemic has affected us all. Some are not yet comfortable returning to Mass, much less attending public meetings or activities.

I have been thinking about a book I read as we were all hunkering down during the pandemic. It's called:

Let Us Dream: The Path to A Better Future. This is a small book (6 x  $8\frac{1}{2}$  x  $5\frac{3}{4}$ ) and 144 pages. Pope Francis wrote this book for American Catholics during the COVID crisis. He tells us we enter a crisis to be sifted, but we do not come out of a crisis the same as we were, but either better or worse. He suggests we need to think about what we experi-

enced, what we saw and how our hearts were tested. The temptation is to retreat, and Pope Francis says instead we should make things better. "This is a moment to dream big, to rethink our priorities—what we value, what we want, what we seek—and to commit to act in our daily life on what we have dreamed of."

I think it would be immensely helpful to take time to consider his words and how they might apply to us. Things that were important to us before COVID, may not be now and something else may really be where we want to put our energies.

As the new Justice Minister at All Saints Parish, I would like us to start off the new Justice Ministry with both support and discovery. I envision the impact that can happen if many of us take 4 hours out of our busy life to think about COVID's impact and what it means to us, our community and what we should do as a result.

I will facilitate a small discussion group of Pope Francis' book Let Us Dream and include time for prayer for justice in the world, in our country, in our community, in our Parish, in our Justice Ministry and in ourselves. We would meet four times before Mass to discuss Pope Frances' book Let Us Dream.

The book is divided into four sessions:

- Prologue first session
- •A Time To See second session
- •A Time To Choose third session
- •A Time To Act and Epilogue fourth session

Times are set to fit into your day if you are already coming to a particular Mass:

St. Joseph Church- Saturday, June 25, and July 2, 2-3:00pm.

St. Anthony Chapel- Sunday, July 10, 17, 26 and 31, 9-10:00am.

St. Anthony Chapel- Sunday, August 7, 14, 21, and 28 3:30-4:30pm.

I will arrange a Zoom meeting series either during the day or evening during the week if there is interest.

Registration still accepted. The book costs about \$16.00 new.
