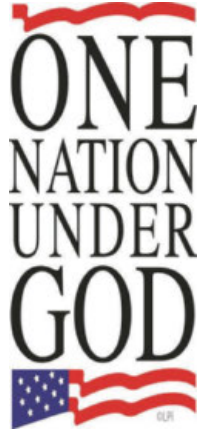

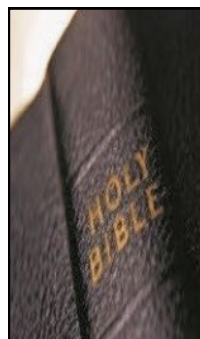

**Justice Challenge**  
**14<sup>th</sup> Week in Ordinary Time**

This Sunday's Gospel tells of Jesus sending out the 72 disciples. The message they were to give people was one of peace: "Peace to this household!" Jesus embodied peace, and he challenged his disciples to be bearers of his peace. Yet in our world today, there are so many examples of violence, tension, war, and conflict. **Your challenge this week** is to look at your own lives—as individuals and as families. How are you sowing peace at home, in your parish or school, in your neighborhood and community? What is one action you can take this week—be it prayer, a kind gesture, asking forgiveness, seeking reconciliation, or building bridges between people—to bring peace into the hearts of individuals or a group in conflict?

## From the homilies recently...

From Fr. Steve's homily on the Feast of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ.

We celebrate the mystery that the Lord is truly present when we eat his body and drink his blood.

We hear the story of the feeding of the multitude of people several times. When it became late, the disciples wanted to know how to get food for everyone. Jesus told his disciples, "Give them some food yourselves." They all ate and were satisfied.

It's hard to be satisfied sometimes these days. When we feed on Jesus we are filled. Our challenge is to share our bounty and feed others with love, compassion, forgiveness and truth.

## Questions of the Week



### First Reading:

Upon their return from exile in Babylon, the prophet Isaiah speaks of God's restoration of Jerusalem, characterizing Jerusalem as a nurturing mother feeding and loving her child. Why do you think Isaiah uses such sensuous and bold imagery?

### Second Reading:

In his closing remarks to the Galatians, Paul comments that he "bears the marks of Jesus on his body," a clear reference to his own physical sufferings. Paul's scarred body gave him credibility as an apostle. How would you demonstrate your credibility as a believer in Jesus?

### Gospel:

During his public ministry, we hear how Jesus sent out his followers to begin evangelizing (preaching, healing, and exorcising) in his name. How best can we evangelize non-believers today?

# Congregations Acting for Justice & Empowerment

It has been nearly two weeks since the Justice Ministry Celebration & Investment Drive Kick Off. It's been nearly seven weeks since our Nehemiah Action.



What's new? Glad you asked...

1. We have a goal of **\$85,000** for the Individual Investment Drive (Justice Ministry & congregational members). To date, we have received \$27,194.
  - a) There are three ways to invest.
    - i. Mail a check to: CAJE, P.O. Box 18172, Evansville IN 47719. Don't forget to write the name of your congregation on the memo line.
    - ii. Invest through PayPal: Through the app just search for CAJE or [info@greaterevansvillecaje.org](mailto:info@greaterevansvillecaje.org). We are charged a fee; if you can add 3-5% to your investment, it would help!
    - iii. Give through our website: <https://www.greaterevansvillecaje.org/invest>. There is also a fee for this service.
2. We have planned a Day of Mourning for our energy future. ***This Friday, July 1 at 4:30 pm***, we will meet on the riverfront, across from CenterPoint Energy. Please bring a black or bright yellow umbrella. We will mourn for a future without sustainable and affordable energy sources (black umbrellas). We will also remind folks that the future is bright with solar (yellow umbrellas). We will pray for those who can't afford to turn on or do not have air conditioning; for those facing disconnection; for those who give up one necessity to pay for another. We will pray for lawmakers and CenterPoint executives to do what is right for ALL people. You are welcome to bring a prayer or song from your faith tradition. Call or text Yvonne or me for details.
3. Members of the Housing Security research team met on Friday to lay out next steps regarding the lack of follow through from Senator Tomes, plans to reach out to Indiana elected officials, and ways to engage our membership and the media in this energy crisis. Look for upcoming emails on this topic.
4. The Mental Health Commission will meet on July 5. Notes from that meeting will be available to anyone who wants to review them.
5. Don't Forget: **July 6 3:30-5:30 pm** the Vanderburgh County Council will vote on the finance ordinance which includes a \$500,000 allocation for the operational costs for the Evansville Diversion Center. We. Need. You. Please arrive by 3:15 to get a seat and to put your name in to speak, if you wish. Follow up is the fourth step in our annual process. Your presence at the County Council meeting will speak volumes.
6. It is not too late to reserve your spot for the Justice Ministry Conference! A delegation from CAJE will travel to **Orlando, FL** for a national training **July 18 - 23**. This crucial grassroots training will cost you little-to-nothing. Registration closes on July 5. Contact us for more details.
7. We are planning a retreat for our clergy and Justice Ministry Team Captains. ***SAVE THE DATE: Friday August 25 & Saturday August 26 (half day). Additional details coming soon!***
8. Our Listening Process Kick Off is **Tuesday September 13**. We are working hard to schedule 60 listening sessions within our 27 member congregations. We need more Team Captains in all of our Justice Ministries. The Justice Ministry Conference is an ideal way to learn how you can be an effective Team Captain and build the People Power needed to transform our communities.

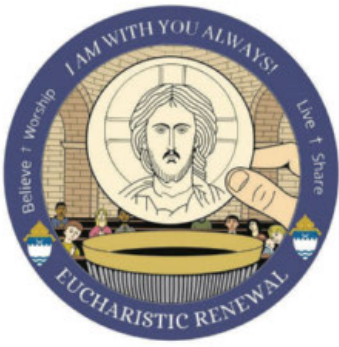

## Eucharistic Renewal

The Diocese of Evansville has kicked off a Eucharistic Renewal in which our Parishes, Catholic Schools and Diocesan Offices will be participating! At the same time, all of the Catholic dioceses in the United States will be holding a Eucharistic Renewal (referred to as a "revival" on the national level). Eventually, the Renewal will culminate in a National Eucharistic Congress in Indianapolis from July 17–21, 2024.

### The Eucharistic Renewal in our diocese focuses on four goals:

1. *Believe*: Foster belief in the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist.
2. *Worship*: Foster attendance at Mass, as well as valuing Mass in its entirety.
3. *Live*: Encourage living in such a way so as to reflect the Eucharist in our daily lives.
4. *Share*: Encourage sharing the truth, beauty and goodness of Mass with others so that they in turn may be drawn to it.

*As part of our participation in the Renewal, I will be sharing responses from members of the parish. I hope you will enjoy reading their thoughts, be encouraged by their thoughts, and be challenged to look at how you see and live the Eucharist as part of your life.*

#### 1. Why is it important to you to attend Mass?

To me, it is very clear from reading the Bible that we were not meant to worship only in private. We were meant to worship in community. Jesus gathered with his disciples in the upper room, he sent them off in pairs to tell the good news etc. Especially when Jesus gives the command "do this in remembrance of me," he was talking about the Eucharist to be celebrated in communion with others. As my wife, Terri, often says, Mass is like a family meal – we come together, and gathering as a community is a blessing and a gift to us. I love seeing our community.

#### 2. What does it mean to you to receive the Eucharist/Body of Christ?

To me, receiving the Eucharist is celebration of being called to be the Body of Christ – it is strengthening us for our journey – it is celebrating also the intense love the Christ has for us – love so strong that he instituted the Eucharist so that he could be with us always until the end of time. It is also a calling from God to take part in something that I can never truly understand – a mystery of transubstantiation.

#### 3. How does receiving the Eucharist/Body of Christ help you, change you, challenge you?

Eucharist changes me every time....and also over time. I hope that I am becoming more like Christ. It challenges me to let go of earthly things and look beyond – look to Christ. Eucharist challenges me to want – to desire as deeply as possible – to serve Christ and others. Eucharist challenges me to sacrifice....and to joy. Sacrifice and joy are joined in the Eucharist because the giving back is a celebration of all the gifts we have been given – especially the gift of Jesus' presence.

#### 4. How is your receiving the Eucharist/Body of Christ reflected in your life, shared with your world?

Coming to Mass and participating in the Eucharist is very much about strengthening me to live Christ's calling in a world that seems challenging, self-centered, and often bleak. The Eucharist reminds me of Christ's sacrifice and reminds me that Christ's love has and will triumph over everything.

#### 5. Other thoughts you'd like to share.

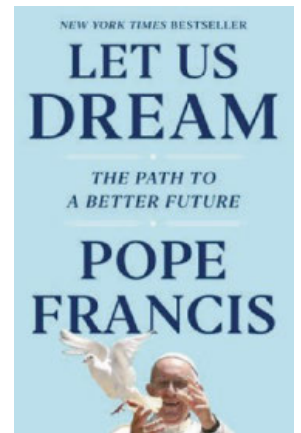
I love that our diocese is doing this. And, I hope that the diocese will also look at why people are not attending. I can talk to others till I am blue in the face about this, but I think the church needs to really ask itself how it can demonstrate its relevance in peoples' lives. For families with LGBTQ+ people, how is our church helping everyone search for God? For families with children, how is our church trying to make Mass and other gatherings appeal to children as well. What can we do differently that will help more people to love the Mass, love the Eucharist, and love Christ more. How have recent scandals in the church and the use of the Eucharist as a political weapon diminished its value? I have many more thoughts, but this will have to do for now.

## Let Us Dream: The Path to A Better Future.

We have a great history of justice and charity work at All Saints, but the COVID pandemic has affected us all. Some are not yet comfortable returning to Mass, much less attending public meetings or activities.

I have been thinking about a book I read as we were all hunkering down during the pandemic. It's called:

**Let Us Dream: The Path to A Better Future.** This is a small book (6 x 8½ x 5¾) and 144 pages. Pope Francis wrote this book for American Catholics during the COVID crisis. He tells us we enter a crisis to be sifted, but we do not come out of a crisis the same as we were, but either better or worse. He suggests we need to think about what we experienced, what we saw and how our hearts were tested. The temptation is to retreat, and Pope Francis says instead we should make things better. "This is a moment to dream big, to rethink our priorities—what we value, what we want, what we seek—and to commit to act in our daily life on what we have dreamed of."



I think it would be immensely helpful to take time to consider his words and how they might apply to us. Things that were important to us before COVID, may not be now and something else may really be where we want to put our energies.

As the new Justice Minister at All Saints Parish, I would like us to start off the new Justice Ministry with both support and discovery. I envision the impact that can happen if many of us take 4 hours out of our busy life to think about COVID's impact and what it means to us, our community and what we should do as a result.

I will facilitate a small discussion group of Pope Francis' book **Let Us Dream** and include time for prayer for justice in the world, in our country, in our community, in our Parish, in our Justice Ministry and in ourselves. We would meet four times before Mass to discuss Pope Francis' book **Let Us Dream**.

The book is divided into four sessions:

- Prologue - first session
- A Time To See - second session
- A Time To Choose - third session
- A Time To Act and Epilogue – fourth session

Times are set to fit into your day if you are already coming to a particular Mass:

St. Joseph Church- Saturday, July 2, 2- 3:00pm.

St. Anthony Chapel- Sunday, July 10, 17, 26 and 31, 9-10:00am.

St. Anthony Chapel- Sunday, August 7, 14, 21, and 28 3:30-4:30pm.

I will arrange a Zoom meeting series either during the day or evening during the week if there is interest.

Registration still accepted. The book costs about \$16.00 new.

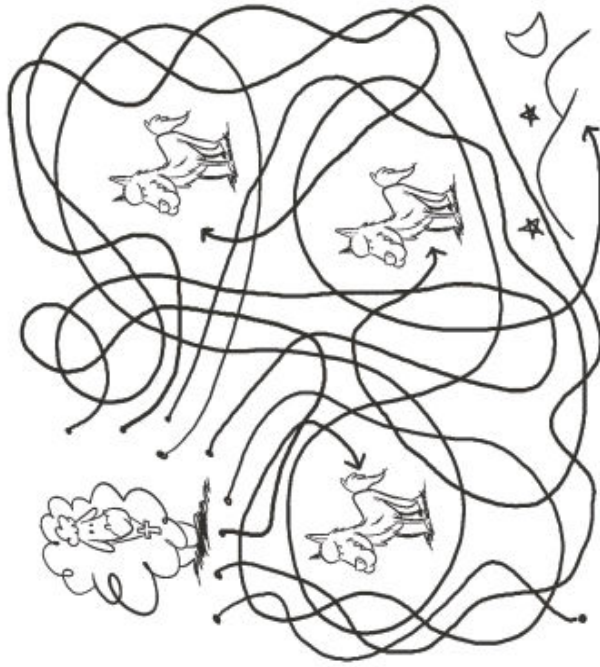
