

Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults (RCIA): Those wishing to become Catholic or learn more about the Catholic faith may call the Parish Office.


#### Justice Challenge 26<sup>th</sup> Week in Ordinary Time


Sunday's Gospel tells the story of the rich man and Lazarus (Luke 16:19-31). Ironically, we don't see the rich man doing anything bad—he didn't hit Lazarus or make him leave or even yell at him. So why did he end up in eternal damnation? It was because he didn't even notice his suffering brother. The rich man was totally oblivious to the needs of Lazarus.

Your challenge this week is to increase your awareness. Look at your community, your country, and even your world with new eyes. Who are the invisible poor who need your help? Discuss every evening who you have noticed for the first time. Then, at the end of the week, as a family or an individual choose one action you can do to help a person or a group whom you identified. The help could be a financial donation, direct service, or a form of advocacy on their behalf (e.g., emailing your state legislators to change laws to provide more aid to the homeless or single-parent families or the mentally ill).

#### **Eucharistic Renewal**

#### The Eucharistic Renewal in our diocese focuses on four goals:

- 1. Believe: Foster belief in the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist.
- 2. Worship: Foster attendance at Mass, as well as valuing Mass in its entirety.
- 3. Live: Encourage living in such a way so as to reflect the Eucharist in our daily lives.
- **4.** *Share:* Encourage sharing the truth, beauty and goodness of Mass with others so that they in turn may be drawn to it.

As part of our participation in the Renewal, I will be sharing responses from members of the parish. I hope you will enjoy reading their thoughts, be encouraged by their thoughts, and be challenged to look at how you see and live the Eucharist as part of your life.

From a member of the parish...

- 1. Why is it important to you to attend Mass? It is important for me to attend mass because I feel it's a time that all our loved ones that have passed are with us and watching as we pray for them.
- 2. What does it mean to you to receive the Eucharist/Body of Christ? Receiving the body of Christ weekly is a reminder that Jesus is in my heart and I should go out for the week and show that to others that I encounter.
- 3. How does receiving the Eucharist/Body of Christ help you, change you, challenge you? It helps feel every Sunday is a way to start fresh. To ask for Forgiveness for the weeks short comings and remind me Jesus is in me and encouraging me to be the best I can be.
- 4. How is your receiving the Eucharist/Body of Christ reflected in your life, shared with your world? I use this at work often. If times arise when I must deal with unkind people, I try and think that these people are Gods people just like me. I remind myself to take a moment to remember Jesus wants to treat all people kind.
- 5. Other thoughts you'd like to share.

All Saints is truly a place to come for a weekly renewal. Somehow every message speaks right to me and I walk out feeling good and ready to spread the kindness and love of God to others.


## One Minute Meditations

what we do best. God often wants us


to use those competencies to share His love with others. loves and delights in each of us. He will purify our sinfulness, but what is essential to us, He wants to develop and strengthen. If God made you
