
People reaching for God and God reaching for people. We can't get there on our own.

Prayer Chain: Contact Machalle Walker at our Parish Office if you would like to join the phone or email prayer chain.



Justice Challenge 31st Week in Ordinary Time

Sunday's Gospel is focused on a short tax collector and his encounter with Jesus. Zacchaeus must have often felt like the underdog. He was so short that he had to climb a tree just to see Jesus. His occupation made him an object of scorn and hatred for many Jews, who associated him with the Roman Empire for which he collected the tax. In addition, many tax collectors at the time were cheating the people by charging more tax than was required and keeping the difference for themselves. We don't know whether or not Zacchaeus was a cheat. What we do know is that his encounter with Jesus changed his life. Zacchaeus promised to not just be fair or just, but to be charitable with anyone whom he had mistreated. Your challenge this week is to examine your own life to see if you have been unjust to someone else—in your family, your school or workplace, your neighborhood or larger community. What can you do to right that wrong? How can your own encounters with Jesus give you the courage and compassion you need to treat others more justly and more lovingly? OR

This week we celebrate both All Saints and All Souls Days. On November 1, we honor the Communion of Saints. Many of the saints found their path to holiness by serving God's most vulnerable. Your challenge this week is to choose a saint whose life modeled justice, compassion, and love for those in need. Use a book on the lives of the saints (we recommend All Saints—Daily Reflections on Saints, Prophets, and Witnesses for Our Time from Crossroads Publishing) to find a saint who inspires your whole family/household. Read the life of this saint, then discuss one thing you can do to emulate the saint in his/her outreach to those in need. Then commit to doing it—at least once. But also challenge yourselves to make this an ongoing action for your family.

Gabriel Project

The Gabriel Project is a pro-life ministry that provides material, personal, and spiritual support to pregnant women and young families in

need. The project started in Texas in 1973; many chapters have formed since then including St. John's Parish in Daylight Indiana; they have been serving since 2008.

By their witness, we are hoping to extend the spirit of the Gabriel Project to the west side of Evansville. Once a month we will be visiting families; praying with them, visiting with them, and providing material support based on their needs.

The needs of each family will vary month to month, be we are mainly looking to provide diapers, wipes, household supplies, and gift cards to ease monthly expenses; an estimate of about \$100.00 per month, per family.

To help us with this mission, we are having a Diaper and Wipes Drive. You can purchase diapers (sizes 2T and up) and wipes and drop them off at the All Saints Parish Office. 


All Souls Day Mass at St. Joseph Cemetery

Creation Care Tip: We can offer some help to our bird friends in the Fall. Birds sustain themselves by seeds and caterpillars. Leave your seed bearing flowers; coneflowers, daisies, Blackeyed-Susans, etc. so the birds can have the seeds. Even more important, leave the leaves unraked in part of your yard. Leaf litter is the winter home for many bugs, moths, and butterflies and their caterpillars will become food next Spring for all the birds and their nestlings.
