



Justice Challenge 33rd Week in Ordinary Time

Today we celebrate World Kindness Day. The idea of designating a day to do random acts of kindness, pay it forward, or surprise people by just being nice is, in a way, an indictment of our current culture. We shouldn't need a special day to be kind—that should be something disciples of Jesus do every day. But we have become more indifferent to those around us, and we often don't feel like helping others when we ourselves are struggling. Your challenge this week is to put a justice spin on World Kindness Day. Choose someone who has been mean or unjust to you in some way, and do something nice for this person even if you have to grit your teeth to do it. Then choose someone to whom you have been unjust, see what you can do to right the wrong, and do one extra thing just to be "kind."

The Sunday Gospel describes the end times, and has Jesus challenging the apostles to live faithfully and persevere through the turmoil. Throughout Luke's Gospel, Jesus paints a picture of his ultimate goal for the future—the realization of his Father's Kingdom here on earth. The Reign of God brings a kingdom of peace and equality, a world in which everyone has what he/she needs to live a life of dignity and hope. It is a world in which love rules over hate.

Your challenge this week is to discuss as a family or household one step you can take to bring the reign of God one step closer to being realized. What act of love or kindness, of justice or equality, can you do to make Jesus' dream for humanity a reality? OR

November 16th marks the anniversary of the murder of the Jesuit Martyrs of San Salvador. In 1989, six Jesuits, along with their housekeeper and her daughter, were murdered by death squads sent by the government to kill them because they had dared to speak out against the injustices being inflicted on the poor. Following in the footsteps of Oscar Romero, these members of the Jesuit community had been a prophetic voice for those who were suffering through their preaching, their teaching and their writing. The Jesuits paid the ultimate sacrifice for their work, ending up as martyrs. Your challenge this week is to be a voice for someone who, like the poor of El Salvador, have no voice or whose voice goes unheard. Gabriel Project

The Gabriel Project is a pro-life ministry that provides material, personal, and spiritual support to pregnant women and young families in

need. The project started in Texas in 1973; many chapters have formed since then including St. John's Parish in Daylight Indiana; they have been serving since 2008.

By their witness, we are hoping to extend the spirit of the Gabriel Project to the west side of Evansville. Once a month we will be visiting families; praying with them, visiting with them, and providing material support based on their needs.

The needs of each family will vary month to month, be we are mainly looking to provide diapers, wipes, household supplies, and gift cards to ease monthly expenses; an estimate of about \$100.00 per month, per family.

To help us with this mission, we are having a Diaper and Wipes Drive. You can purchase diapers (sizes 2T and up) and wipes and drop them off at the All Saints Parish Office. CAJE House Meeting Results

Thank you to everyone who participated in a CAJE House Meeting or made a personal commitment to work for justice. Jerome Echele, Bonnie Wink, Kristi and Vince Wagner, and Tom Bogenschutz, held a total of 10 House Meetings since September 17th. Fifty-eight parishioners, friends, relatives, and neighbors attended. Forty committed to be Network members and bring three people with them to the Action in May. Network Team members are still reaching out to individuals who have expressed interest or attended CAJE events. Please contact one of the CAJE Team members if you want to be involved.

What happens after the House Meetings?

Team Leaders report to CAJE regarding the issues identified and who has committed to be a part of their network. The Community Problems Assembly is when new congregations are acknowledged, the new CAJE board is presented, community official update on previous ACTION commitments and the issue campaigns are selected for the year.

What's next?

Come to the Community Problems Assembly Tuesday, November 15th at 6:00pm at Holy Redeemer Catholic Church 918 W. Mill Road.

Learn the results of the concerns expressed at all the CAJE House Meetings and vote on the issues that CAJE will focus on this year.

CAJE is holding a Research Kick off meeting Monday, December 5. Contact your Team Leader for specifics or Brenda Meyer at (812)457-5529.

CAJE Network members who want to work on finding proven solutions commit to working on a particular CAJE issue campaign. Each issue group sets up meetings to further study the problem, talk with key individuals and learn how other communities have addressed similar issues.

Research starts in December and continues thru January and February. Each problem issue is directed by a steering committee and has a larger committee represented by all the congregations.

Starting in March, these groups are responsible for cutting the issues and developing the questions that will be presented to key individuals who have the power to implement these community changes.

What is the Rally?

The Rally is where Network Team Leaders and Network members learn the results of the research done by each issue campaign. We learn the importance of bringing out people power to the Action to impress key community decision makers to implement solutions. The energy of the Rally helps us organize for the Action.

Why have an Action?

The issues CAJE works on are important. It takes a considerable number of us to say this needs to change before community leaders say it is worth their time to do so This is the only opportunity I'm aware of where 100's of people sit in support of an "ask" for proven solution to be implemented, rather than just protesting that things aren't right. Protests have a place, but research, thoughtful requests have resulted in changes and innovative programs in our communities.

Encountering the Eucharist

Believe & Worship & Live & Share





If you've ever been to a Catholic funeral, you probably noticed that the casket is usually covered with a white cloth. This is called a "pall." it serves to be a reminder of the white garment that each of us received at our baptism. During the rite of baptism, when the white garment is presented to the person or the parents, the priest or deacon says: "With your family and friends to help you by word and example bring it unstained into eternal life." It is most fitting, therefore, that the casket is covered with a symbol of that garment which the deceased brings into eternal life. The body is also incensed during the funeral because it received the holy sacramental elements during life: oil, water, Eucharist. We recognize the sanctity of the body by the incense.


The Communion of Saints...The Resurrection of the Body

In the Apostle's Creed, we confess our belief in "the communion of Saints, the resurrection of the body and life everlasting." These brief statements contain within them the effects of the Pascal Mystery, that is, the passion, death, resurrection, and ascension of Our Lord Jesus Christ. Yet, how often do we ponder what these statements

mean? During the month of November, the Church places before us the 'holy dead' for our contemplation. Liturgically, we celebrate the Solemnity of All Saints and the next day the Commemoration of All Souls. We are all too familiar with the loss of loved ones through death; it's simply part of our human experience. Neverthe-



less, both the Church Triumphant (those holy souls who are in Heaven) and the Church Suffering (those holy souls who are in Purgatory) can teach us about the meaning of the Eucharist if we are willing to ponder the mystery. On the death of his brother, St. Ambrose gave a eulogy for him that's recorded in the Two Books of St Ambrose, Bishop of Milan, on the Decease of His Brother Satyrus. It's a great meditation on death and sorrow. At one point, after expressing how much he misses the earthly presence of his brother, Ambrose says that one night while he was in bed thinking about the loss he says: "So that, as I lay with my limbs bathed in sleep, while I was [in mind] awake for you, you were alive to me. I could say, 'What is death, my brother?' For certainly you were not separated from me for a single moment, for you were so present with me everywhere, that enjoyment of each other, which we were unable to have in the intercourse of this life, is now always and everywhere with us." In other words, St. Ambrose recognizes that, freed from the limitations of this earthly life, his brother is more present now than when he was alive! "Presence" is a psychological concept. We can be sitting right next to a stranger on a bus or airplane and never be "present" to that other person. Yet, we can sense the presence of someone close to us who is in fact far away in proximity. Being able to recognize the Real Presence of the Resurrected Jesus in the Eucharist, can also facilitate our ability to recognize the presence of the all the Saints in Heaven, including all of our deceased love ones, who are "always and everywhere with us." "We are surrounded by such a great cloud of witnesses" the writer to the Hebrews tells us. The familiar adage, You are what you eat, also applies to the Eucharist. We receive the Body of Christ and, simultaneously, we are united to the whole body of Christ here on earth, in Heaven, and in Purgatory. We are in "communion" together with all the holy people of God in Christ Jesus Our Lord. Special thanks to Joseph Munning, PCL at Holy Family Parish, Jasper for inspiring this month's reflection.


