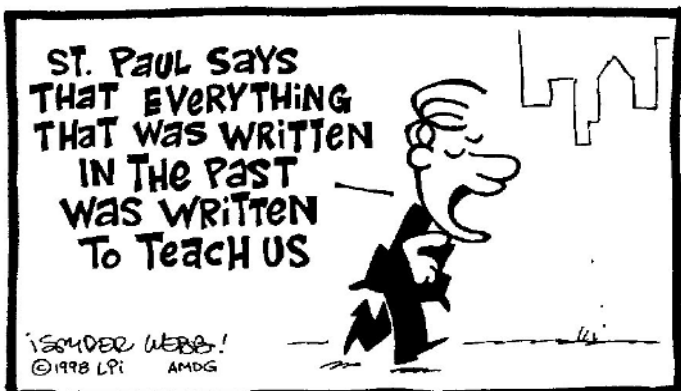
Justice Challenge

2nd Week of Advent

The first reading for the Second Sunday of Advent is from the prophet Isaiah. It includes these words: "Then the wolf shall be a guest of the lamb, and the leopard shall lie down with the kid; the calf and the young lion shall browse together...There shall be no harm or ruin on all my holy land; for the earth shall be filled with knowledge of the Lord..." (Isaiah 11:1-10). From the homilies recently...

Fr. Steve

The story of Snow White and the 7 Drawfs.

This story gives us the image of beauty. Beauty is not on the outside but on the inside.

The image of Jesus dying on the cross is not a beautiful image. Even you and I can come to live the image of the crucifixion. The Lord took on the cross and died for us. So do we choose evil or do we choose goodness? Choices are before us at all times.

In the first reading, we have the image of shepherd. Shepherds are always good to the sheep.

As we come to the end of the church year, we are reminded we can choose between evil and goodness. "Jesus remember me when you come into your kingdom." Do we choose good or do we choose evil?

Did you ever wish you could change the ending of a movie if things didn't turn out the way you wanted?

If I were at the crucifixion, I would've liked to have changed things because this ending is gruesome, and I don't want to see him suffering and dying. Jesus is king. Kings don't suffer like this. Jesus rules the world, and Jesus is especially king of the suffering.

Jesus shows by his actions that he is King. King of the suffering. King of us. Jesus shows by his actions that he is the God of love, the God of comfort, the God of peace, the God of death, the God of suffering, the God of Resurrection.

Let's take a few minutes to talk to this God we call Jesus, to this King. Let us thank him for his love and ask him to help us love others.

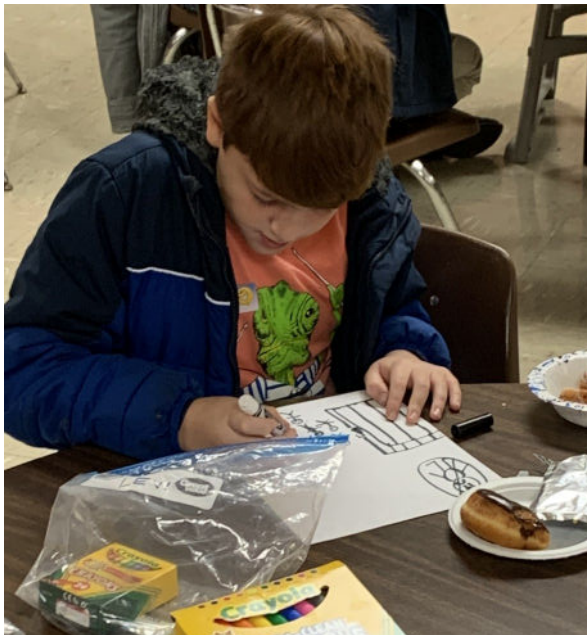

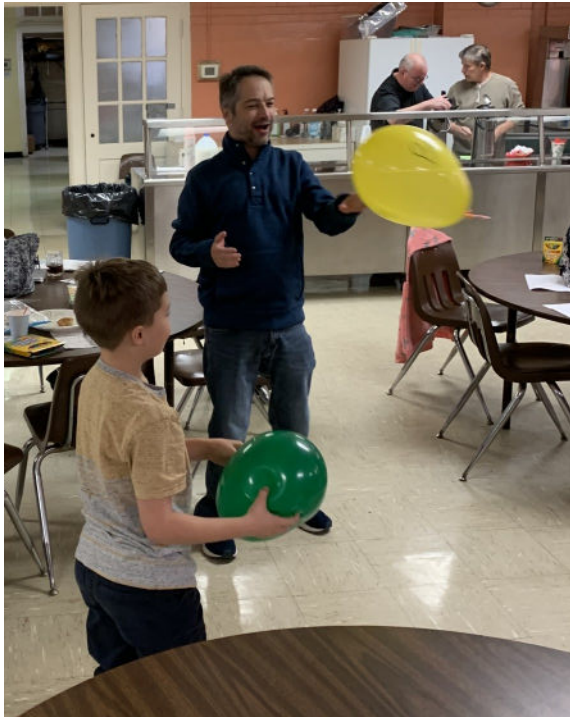
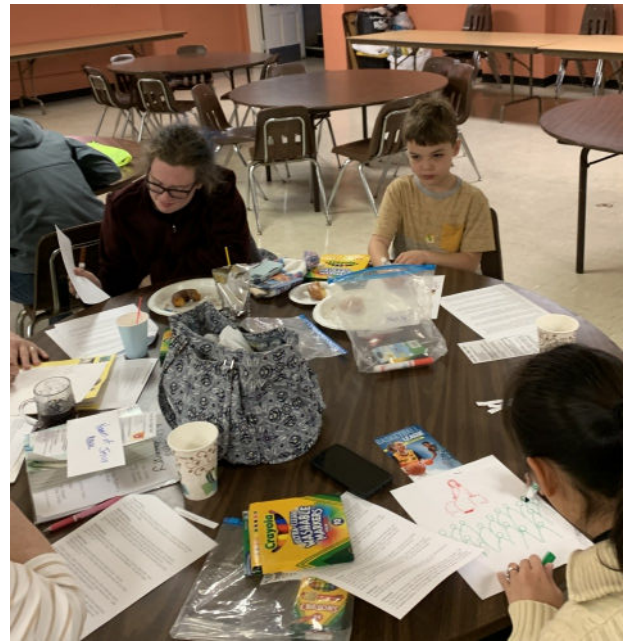
