

Justice Challenge 4rd Sunday in Ordinary Time

Sunday's Gospel is Jesus' beatitude teaching from the Sermon on the Mount. The beatitudes provide us with a blueprint for being people of faith and justice. **Your challenge this week** is to take one beatitude each day. Read the beatitude in the morning, and ask God for the strength to practice that attitude throughout the day. Then in the evening, reflect on whether or not you lived that particular "attitude of being" in your life during the day. Thank God for your successes, ask for forgiveness where you failed, and pray for the courage and strength to live that beatitude in the future.

4. Blessed are they who hunger and thirst for holiness, for they will be satisfied.

Am I passionate for the things of God?

Do I work for the triumph of love, peace and justice?

5. Blessed are the merciful, for they will be shown mercy.

Am I forgiving and merciful?

Do I give others the benefit of the doubt?

Am I harsh or judgmental?

6. Blessed are the pure of heart, for they will see God.

Am I single-minded in the practice of my faith?

Have I allowed a particular sin or vice to distract me from God?

7. Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be called children of God.

Am I a person of reconciliation, peace and mercy?

Do I hold grudges or seek revenge?

8. Blessed are they who are persecuted, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.

Do I suffer well?

Am I willing to sacrifice anything for my faith?

Do I allow human respect to keep me from being a Christian witness?

What is our history?

The Gabriel Project is an effective churchbased program that reaches out to pregnant women, or women and families with young children, to help them choose life rather than abortion.

In 1973, the late Bishop John L. Morkovsky of the Catholic Diocese of Houston challenged his pastors to reach out to women who were having abortions. The pastor of St. Michael's Church in Houston put a large sign on the church property telling pregnant women who needed help that they would assist them. Thus, the Gabriel Project was born.

In June of 2008, churches in the Evansville area were asked to offer the program locally. Grace Robertson responded to the call, and St. John the Evangelist Catholic Church in Daylight started their own Gabriel Project to serve the Evansville area.

In June of 2022, the Supreme Court overturned Roe v. Wade, which sent the abortion decision back to the states. Pope Francis challenged Catholics to become more proactive in helping women afford to keep their babies.

Westside area churches in the Catholic Diocese of Evansville decided to expand the Gabriel Project in order to reach more women and families and enable them to afford to choose life.


