Justice Challenge
3rd Week of Lent

March 16th is the anniversary of the day in 1998 when Saint John Paul expressed to the Jewish people his regret that Christians didn't do enough to help prevent the Holocaust. Six million Jews ended up being murdered by the Nazi regime. John Paul's apology was a powerful and healing moment in Jewish-Catholic relationships. **Your challenge this week** is to look for an opportunity to stand up for a person or a group of people being persecuted in some way. It might be Syrian refugees, or undocumented people in your community, or the kid in school who is bullied a lot.

OR

The Samaritan woman, also known as the woman at the well, is featured in Sunday's Gospel. She was a member of a tribe with which the Jews did not interact, she was a woman, and she had a fairly bad reputation after being married several times. Even with these three strikes against her, Jesus made her the first evangelizer of her village. **Your challenge this week** is to identify someone in your life who is not from your immediate circle of family and friends, someone you might consider an outsider, and listen to or closely observe that person. See if you can learn something about Jesus from the way he or she lives and speaks. Show appreciation for this "outsider" in any way you can.

The poet, Mary Oliver - "When Death Comes."

Today we hear the story of the Transfiguration. What do I need to do, claim, undergo to be transformed?

How are we truly listening to the words of Christ....with our hearts and our living. I believe the great story of the transfiguration is when Jesus says, "get up, don't be afraid." The mountain top experience was overwhelming. They were terrified. I think we all have known this in our lives. Sometimes life brings us these moments. Jesus tells us to get up and don't be afraid. When a change has made us terrified or something overwhelmed us, "get up, don't be afraid" as Jesus tells us.

Jesus took Peter, James, John - imagine you were there, too - and Jesus became dazzling white. Peter wanted to stay there forever. They left and came back down the mountain.

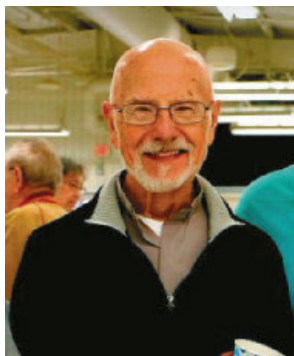
You may have had a mountain top experience...the birth of a child, Cursillo, CRHP. Most of our lives are lived on the plains/flat lands. And sometimes we descend into the valleys, the deep, dark valleys where pain, loneliness and sorrow happen. We are to find God in there somewhere. It is hard to do. It may seem that God is hiding. God is with us even in those difficult times. It is good to try to find God present. What is God's message for us? What is the lesson for us?

So, our lives are spent on various levels, mountaintops, plains, and valleys. God is always with you. God loves you.

When have you seen God on the mountain top? When have you seen God on the plain? When have you seen God in the valley? Where has God been for you on the mountain top, on the plain, in the valley?
