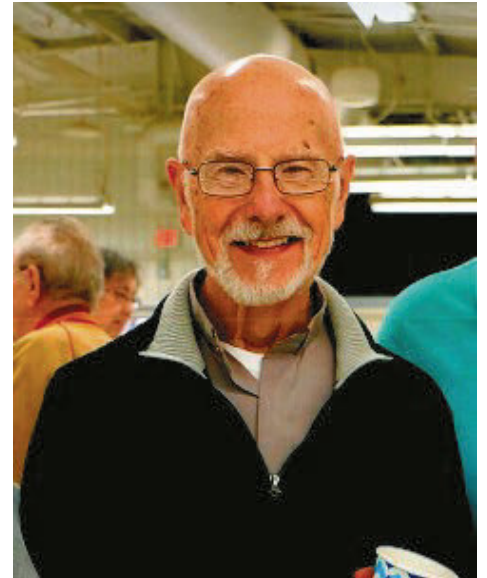

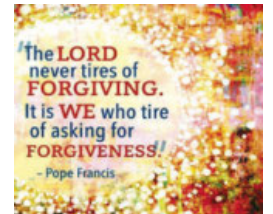

## Justice Challenge 4th Week of Lent

Sunday's Gospel addresses the story of the man born blind. The Jews blamed his parents and their sins for his condition, but Jesus taught a different message—that God doesn't punish people for things which aren't their fault. **Your challenge this week** is to look at how you judge others and yourself. Do you look at people's actions through the lens of a loving God? Do you give others the benefit of the doubt? And are you gentle with yourself? Do you forgive yourself when you mess up, trusting in a God who forgives infinitely? God is the arbiter of justice, and we are called to trust in God's judgment, which ultimately is so much more merciful than human judgment. Place the world in God's hands this week, and stop yourself from judging.

OR

World Water Day is celebrated this week—on March 22. Water is essential to life. Lack of clean water has led to draught, dehydration, illness, death, conflict, and even war. While we might not experience lack of water, we are aware of the thousands of our brothers and sisters across the globe who live without clean drinking water. **Your challenge this week** is to stand in solidarity with those who don't have the water they need by monitoring and limiting your use of water. When you shower, once you get wet turn off the water, soap up, and only turn the water back on when you are ready to rinse off. When you brush your teeth, don't run the water until you are ready to rinse. Avoid using bottled water if possible. Think of other ways you can conserve water as an individual and a household. And pray for those who do not have access to the water they need to live in health and dignity.

## Family Faith Formation

"This is my body given for you."

(Luke 22:19) ...**Awesome God** People reaching for God and God reaching for people. We can't get there on our own.

In Family Faith Formation, we've been sharing stories of Eucharistic miracles. In each story, we hear of the love and dedication that individuals have for Christ...in receiving the Body of Christ. At each Mass, we come together as the Body of Christ. We gather and greet each other as family. We pray together and lift each other up in prayer. We come together to share a meal. Strengthened by the Eucharist, we return to our families and communities to live the Gospel. During this Lent, may we rededicate ourselves to each other, to Mass, and to living the Gospel nourished and strengthened by Christ.



## SHARING SUCCESS

Most people in Turkana, Kenya raise livestock, and a few are farmers. But the hot and dry climate makes this work difficult—and climate change is making it even harder. Rebecca and Lotiang participated in a Catholic Relief Services program that installed a water well and taught them new farming techniques. They can support their family with their crops and are teaching others in their community what they learned. How can you use your skills and knowledge to help others?

### From the homilies recently...

Fr. Jay

Jesus has introduced us to the first evangelist. One who shares the faith with others and tells others about Jesus and what he has done in her.

Fascinating things about this. Jesus was in Samaria. Typically, Jews do not travel in Samaria. Samaritans were seen as unclean and you didn't associate with them. Jesus went through Samaria. Jesus stops at the well and this woman came up. You don't speak to Samaritans. You don't speak to women. Jesus spoke to this Samaritan woman alone. Jesus knows that her morality leaves something to be desired. Jesus calls her woman, the word that means a special lady. The same word he uses for his mother Mary at the wedding feast at Cana and at the cross. The Samaritan woman goes to the village to invite people to come and listen to Jesus.

There are several lessons for us here...about how we treat people who are different, how prejudiced we may be, especially how we invite people to Jesus. How do we invite people to come to Mass? How do we tell them about how Jesus has worked through us?

Let's take some time to consider how we have been evangelists. Who have we brought to Jesus? Who will we bring next?

It's all about the test. We are all on a journey. We all have to deal with the tests in our lives. We are called to take a deeper look at our faith. The Lord will come to us.

What is your test in life? What do you complain, grumble about the most? The Lord wants the best for us.

The church is sometimes put to the test. We sometimes make judgements about people. We are called to love people. We need to put our faith in God. Maybe what we grumble about the most is the test we have to face. We have to remember to love.

# Encountering the Eucharist

Believe ■ Worship ■ Live ■ Share



If you've been to the liturgical service called "Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament" you might have noticed that the priest or deacon puts a cloth over his shoulders and then covers his hands while blessing the people. This vestment is called a "Humeral Veil." The Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament is different from a normal blessing. The priest or deacon in Benediction does not bless the people. Rather, the minister holds the Blessed Sacrament. Who is the Lord Jesus Christ, and Christ *Himself* directly blesses the people. In order to signify that he is not blessing the people, the priest or deacon covers his hands with a humeral veil which drapes over his shoulders and covers his hands (*humurus* means "shoulder" so a humeral veil is a "shoulder veil").

## What We Believe... The MOST Blessed Sacrament

Have you ever wondered why the Church calls the Eucharist the *Most Blessed Sacrament*? Are not the other six Sacraments also just as "blessed?" Are they not as important? What is a Sacrament in the first place? The sacraments are "efficacious signs of grace, instituted by Christ and entrusted to the Church, by which divine life is dispensed to us" (CCC 1131). In other words, a sacrament is a sacred and visible sign that is instituted by Jesus to give us grace, an undeserved gift from God. (See also CCC 1084). Christ was present at the inception of all of the sacraments, which He instituted 2,000 years ago. Christ is also present every time each sacrament is celebrated. The Catholic Church has all of the seven sacraments instituted by Christ, which include Baptism, Confirmation, Eucharist, Reconciliation, Anointing of the Sick, Holy Orders and Matrimony. *The Catechism of the Catholic Church* explains that "the seven sacraments touch



all the stages and all important moments of the Christian life" (CCC 1210). Nevertheless, this still doesn't answer the question as to why the Eucharist is considered to be the "*Most Blessed*" of all the *Sacraments*. To begin, each sacrament is a sign demonstrative of the present invisible sacred realities. Another way of saying this is that each sacrament is an efficacious sign; the visible sign actually effects in us the invisible reality that it signifies. For example, the visible sign of water in baptism indicates cleansing. When someone is baptized, there is a cleansing of the flesh when the water is poured. But that indicates the cleansing of the person of sin by the invisible reality of Christ's sanctifying grace being poured into our very being. However, with the Eucharist, not only do the sacred species of bread and wine effect the invisible reality that they signify, they *really are, truly* what they signify! That is the real substantial presence of the body and blood with the soul and divinity of Our Lord Jesus Christ! St. Ignatius says that "the Eucharist is the flesh of Our Savior Jesus Christ who suffered for our sins and which the Father in His loving kindness raised again." Theodore of Mopsuestia adds, "The Lord did not say: This is symbol of my body, and this is a symbol of my blood, but rather: This is my body and my blood. 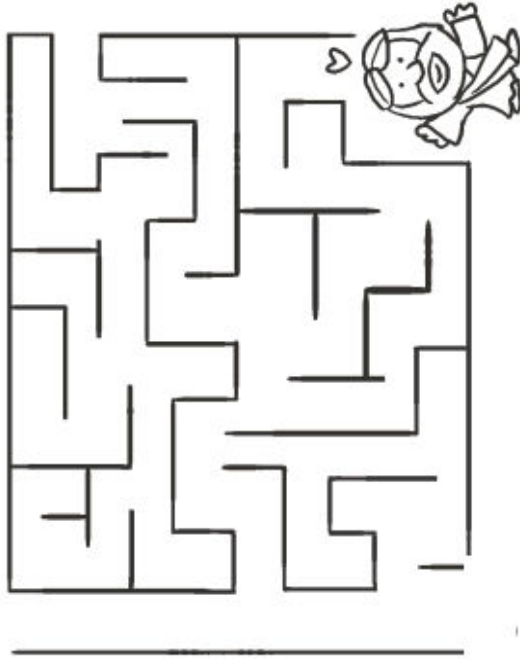
