

Justice Challenge 5th Week of Lent

The Gospel Sunday recounts the story of Jesus raising Lazarus from the dead. It is eloquent to read that Jesus wept when he saw how devastated Lazarus' friends and relatives were about his friend's death. Jesus showed such compassion and human emotion. The word compassion is from the Latin words com (meaning with) and pati (to suffer). Compassion, then, is suffering with others who are hurting. Your challenge this week is to show compassion to someone who is suffering. You might donate money to CRS or another organization helping hurting people. Or you might give a sandwich to a homeless person in your community. Whatever you do, remember that compassion means entering into that person's human condition, not with condescension, but with a genuine sense of walking with them in their experience.


is how long Lent lasts; at the well in Samaria; reminding us of our baptism and the God the Father, Son and Holy Spirit; the passion and suffering of Jesus; Oil of the Catechumenate used for baptism and ordination; Mass when the holy oils are blessed; baptized Jesus; is giving to others; the resurrection of Jesus; the blessed wine; where Jesus went to pray after his baptism and before he began his ministry; from full meal; Mass of the Last Supper; bible readings telling us the history of our faith; the three holy days of Holy Thursday through Holy Saturday; presented Jesus for sentencing to death; placed on Jesus' head; man cured by Jesus with mud; font to bless ourselves and baptize at Easter Vigil; Jesus died on the cross; Catholic Relief Services to give money to the poor; is the color of Lent reminding us to repent; Jesus fell this many times carrying his cross; the sacrament of confession asking forgiveness for our sins; the blessed host; wiped the face of Jesus; Sacred Chrism used in confirmation; praising God; when we remember the journey of Jesus into Jerusalem; for yourself and others; Old ones are burned to make ashes for Ash Wednesday; helped Jesus carry the cross; on your forehead on Ash Wednesday; of the Cross remembering Jesus' journey to his death; Oil of the infirmed used to anoint the sick; is sung before the Gospel is proclaimed/It is not sung during Lent.

Today, we hear about seeing and how God makes it possible.

If we learn to see, as God sees, we have to go through a process. We have to learn what God is trying to tell us, and God is very vague sometimes. We need to ask God to help us see more and more as he sees. We will never do that completely, and maybe never very well at all, but we must continue to try to see as God sees.

A prayer might be to ask God to let us see our sins so we can ask forgiveness for them and do something about them. There are lots of things that God can help us see, but it will be awkward. It will be difficult. It will be rewarding. It will be what God wants us to do. Let us ask God to help us see as he sees.

Homebound, Nursing Home or Hospital Visitation: Call the Parish Office.


Marriage: Couples planning to be married should contact Fr. Davidson at least six months before the wedding date. This ensures time for adequate preparation.
