

Justice Challenge 2st Week of Lent

Sometimes we think about making big plans for Lenten sacrificing, only to fall behind with work, family, and other responsibilities. We find ourselves in the Second Week of Lent with no commitment to better prayer lives, doing good deeds, or practicing acts of self-denial. But it is never too late. Catholic Relief Services offers a great resource to parishes and families for praying, fasting and charitable giving—all in one simple project. What is so great about this project, known as Operation Rice Bowl (ORB), is that it makes all the right connections. When you put the money you would have spent on a CD or that mocha latte you crave into your Rice Bowl box, you participate in Jesus' sacrifice. CRS provides prayers to accompany your giving. And it uses the money you would have spent on yourself to help people in need across the world. Participating in ORB is an act of solidarity-standing with your brothers and sisters as one human family. Your challenge this week is to adopt Operation Rice Bowl (go to CRSRiceBowl.org if you parish doesn't do ORB). Give up the extra energy drink, candy bar, movie, or trip to the mall. Put the money in your Rice Bowl, knowing it will be sent to CRS. You will be walking with Jesus while making a difference in the lives of others.

From the homilies recently...

I don't like these readings. The first Sunday of Lent is always the temptation of Jesus. We know we are sinful people. But we are the beloved of God, created in the image of God. I believe all of us here have bread to eat....the bread of gossip, vengeance, compassion, love.

40 days of Lent....What bread do I eat? What do I treasure?

Jesus was tempted. I thought Jesus was God made flesh. How could a God walking in human flesh be tempted? That was the picture I grew up. I've since learned it's not that simple. My imagination says that Jesus and God the Father had a conversation and agreed, If I become really, really human, I have to forget I am God.

Imagine, Jesus has been baptized. Then he has gone into the desert to fast for 40 days and 40 nights. After that he is famished and weak. Then the devil shows up. I think the devil came in the guise of a helper to offer him assistance. The devil tried to get him to eat to build up his strength. They went to the pinnacle of the temple. You need some good PR. If you jump off this pinnacle people will notice and want to follow you. So, the devil tried another time. He showed him all the kingdoms of the world and said I'll get you in with all of these kingdoms. They will set you up so you will have a voice and people will hear what you have to say.

Jesus says I will take the difficult way, the slow path. I will do it as the Father wants me to do it. In these 40 days I have learned what my mission is. I think we all have to take some time during this Lent to see what God wants of us. What our mission is in this world. We all have a mission, and it takes all of our missions to get God's work completed in this world.

CAJE Annual Rally







St. Vincent de Paul News

Ash Wednesday Service at St. Joseph Church

Since January 2nd All Saints conference has received the following requests from our 'neighbors':

- 60 individuals needing help with electric
- 15 for water
- 7 for appliances
- 42 for clothing
- 13 for furniture and miscellaneous household items
- 19 needing beds. We provide adult beds and refer beds for children under 18 to Sleep in Heavenly Peace.

After we make a home visit, this group goes to the home and builds the bed on site; they also provide a mattress and bedding. One of our volunteers received a video of a child dancing around her new bed.

As of January 15th, we have paid \$5,031 to CenterPoint, \$1,652 to EWSU, \$357 to the Thrift Store, and \$380 to Andersons Appliances.

We have been able to help thanks to the generosity of All Saints Parishioners and Friends. We also receive grants from the Diocese, Catholic Charity, and trusts from deceased parishioners. Last year CenterPoint provided a grant that reimbursed us for water and rent.

We meet Wednesdays at 5:15pm at St. Anthony Campus, new members are always welcome. Join us!





One Minute Meditations

Fasting to detach

"Their God is their stomach; their glory is in their 'shame."



(Philippians 3:19). We tend to eat and drink so freely that we forget God, who gives us that which we eat and drink. Fasting, especially during Lent, helps us to detach from the things of this world and remember Him. Catholics are required to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, and to abstain from meat on Fridays.

Believe in God

Believing in God means more than just saying He exists. Believers serve God, give time to Him, and put Him first. Spend more time in prayer this Lent, shed some possessions, perform works of charity and you will act on your baptismal promises.

"Yet even now,' says the LORD, 'return to me with all your heart, with fasting, with weeping, and with mourning; and rend your hearts and not your garments'" (Joel 2:12).

Preparing hearts for Easter joy

Lent is the Church's gift to us to help prepare our hearts for Easter by purifying our hearts,

opening up to love, and putting love into action.

Purifying our hearts: Every heart yearns for love, yet only God's love can truly satisfy that yearning. The goal of Lenten penance is to purify ourselves of whatever blocks us from God's love or closes our heart to others. This can include excessive social media, materialism, gossip, or sinful habits like lust or deceit. From what does your heart need to detach so there's room for God and others?

Opening up to love: Mother Teresa

wrote, "Have you seen...how [Jesus] looks at you with love?... Have you heard the

loving words He speaks to you?" Strive to know God's heart. Seek Him, not just His gifts. Only by receiving God's love first, beginning with prayer, can we share it with others. Put love in action: "Even as I have loved you...you also love one another" (John 13:34). God commands us to love as we've

been loved – because we are loved. Find small, doable ways to serve during Lent. Commit to a Work of Mercy (corporal or spiritual). Practice patience. Give the gift of listening. True joy at Easter comes from loving Christ and imitating Him. Strive to do this throughout Lent and beyond.



Many churches cover statues and crucifixes in red or purple cloth for the final weeks in Lent, traditionally known as "Passiontide." The veils are visual cues that we're entering into a solemn time and remind us that sin separates us from God.

Why do Catholics cover statues during Lent?



This helps to build anticipation for Easter when the statues are unveiled and we are restored to Him. Lastly, the veils symbolize that heavenly glories are hidden in this life, but will be revealed when we enter eternity.

GOSPEL MEDITATION - ENCOURAGE DEEPER UNDERSTANDING OF SCRIPTURE

March 5, 2023 2nd Sunday of Lent

As a kid I remember looking at my sister and thinking, "No man is ever going to marry her. She is way too...my *sister*!" I couldn't see her as anything except my goofy, emotional, cooties-laden sister. Years later, on her wedding day, I remember seeing how her husband looked at her, he was totally in love with her, his watery eyes full of overwhelmed joy, drinking in her beauty and grace. He was the one

who actually saw her. Blinded by familiarity, I had not been able to see her until now. She was glorious. I finally saw how beautiful my sister really was.

Jesus is transfigured before Peter, James, and John. His face shone like the sun and his clothes dazzle with heavenly light. If it's a miracle, it is so related to the apostles' perception of the glory of Jesus. The physical spectacle reveals how the Father perceives the Son, so to speak: **"This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well-pleased; listen to him."** The Son is *always* bathed in the Father's love. It's only just now that they finally perceive it.

Who could possibly give his or her heart totally to Jesus? If we perceive him to be just another teacher, symbol, or moral example, we can't. But if the Holy Spirit gives us eyes to see that he is the Beloved Son of God, who makes our humanity not just pleasing to God but filled with glory ... then who can resist him? Perhaps only the lovers are the ones who properly see.
