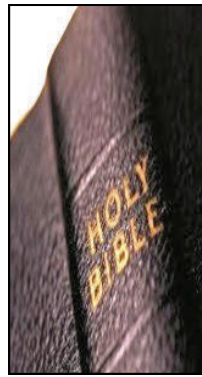

Saint Damien of Molokai, whose feast day is May 10, is well known for breaking bread with lepers. **Your challenge this week** is to reflect on the people who need you to break bread with them. Is it the people who come to the local Catholic Worker House for lunch or the homeless shelter? Is it the young person sitting alone in the cafeteria at school? Spend some time searching your heart and your community to see who needs you to be bread in their lives. Then break bread with someone new this week, and discover the face of Christ when you do so.

"This is my body given for you."

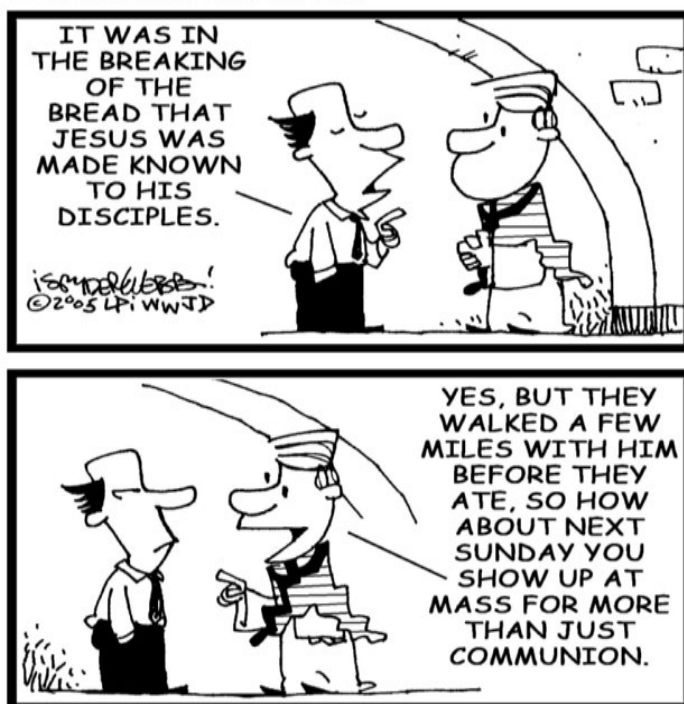
(Luke 22:19) ...**Awesome God** People reaching for God and God reaching for people. We can't get there on our own.

A few years ago I was at a convention of priests. The question asked was "How have you been hurt by the Church?" The answers were pretty heartbreaking. The next question was, "How have you been helped by the Church?" This one was more encouraging.

I think some of those hurts can lead to doubts. Thomas doubted the resurrection of Jesus. Hopefully doubts can be good and encourage us to think more deeply and come to a deeper faith.

We are asked to look at our doubts. Many things cause us to wonder, think, doubt and pray. The Church is a sinful Church and a saintly Church. We are a human Church.

We are the body of Christ. We are the church. Can people see God's love in us? We are called to work to make the church better...to make the world better.

- at least 18 years of age
- have been a member of All Saints Parish for at least two years
- active members (regularly come to Church for Mass and share their time, talent & treasure with All Saints Parish)
- Catholic
- able to attend meetings.

Submit nominations/names along with the gifts/strengths you see in the person(s). Nominations are kept anonymous. Nominations can put in the box at church, be emailed to Sharon at svogler@evdio.org, or given to Sharon at Mass.

Thoughtful Moments

Prayer habits

Children with good prayer habits become adults who rely on prayer throughout their lives. Refresh your family prayer habits and encourage children to start and end the day in prayer. Together pick a morning and evening offering and say it together. Encourage spontaneous prayer from the heart.

Penance vs. punishment

Penance isn't punishment. In fact, true penance helps us to undergo a change of heart that helps us become better people who positively influence others. Our sin affects others, and our penance and reparation can, too. Help children cultivate penitential habits such as abstaining from meat on Fridays throughout the year, performing extra chores, graciously accepting the menial tasks of life. The purpose of penance is not to diminish life but to enrich it.

A living hope

"Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ! By his great mercy we have been born anew to a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead" (1 Peter 1:3).



Help children to P.R.A.Y. in Mass

The Mass is the most important gift Catholic parents can share with their children. Help youngsters engage with this timeless treasure of our Faith, by encouraging them to:

P-Prepare. Good preparation leads to a fruitful Mass experience. Lay out Mass outfits the night before. Get up early enough to have breakfast (at least an hour before receiving Communion) and share the Gospel reading. Explain that this time with God deserves special attention.

R-Raise voices in song. We're encouraged to actively participate in Mass by being attentive, praying the responses, and offering our lives, our

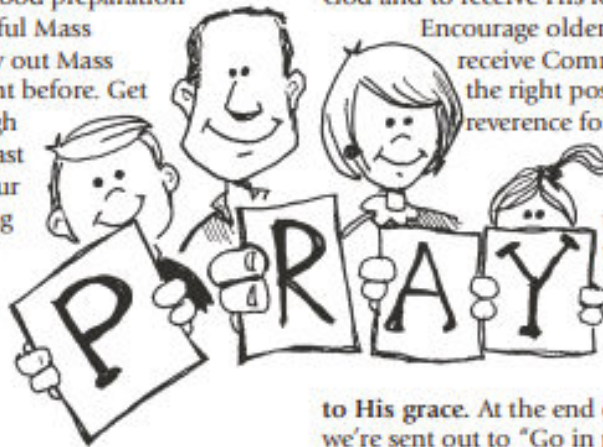
intentions, and our praise to God's service. By respectfully raising their voices in song, children also lift their prayers – and their hearts – to God.

A-Adore God. We are made to love God and to receive His love for us.

Encourage older children to receive Communion with the right posture and reverence for Jesus' Body and Blood.

Little ones can use this time to tell God they love Him and to thank Him for His gifts. Y-Say "Yes!"

to His grace. At the end of the Mass, we're sent out to "Go in peace to love and glorify the Lord by your life." Together, take a moment after Mass to say "yes!" to accepting God's grace. That grace in you will bear good fruit all week long.



Why Do Catholics Do That?

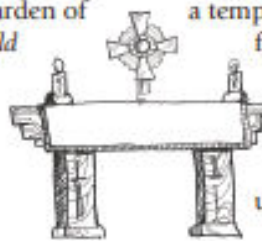
Why do Catholics pray at an "Altar of Repose" on Holy Thursday?

On Holy Thursday night, Jesus and his disciples prayed in the Garden of Gethsemane. He asked, "Could you not watch with me one hour?" (Matthew 26:40). Instead, they slept while Jesus prayed in agony over His Passion.

On Holy Thursday night,

Catholic parishes traditionally display a temporary altar decorated with

flowers and candles where the Eucharist is displayed. People are invited to come before the Eucharist and offer their prayers and love, making up for that "lost hour" in Gethsemane.

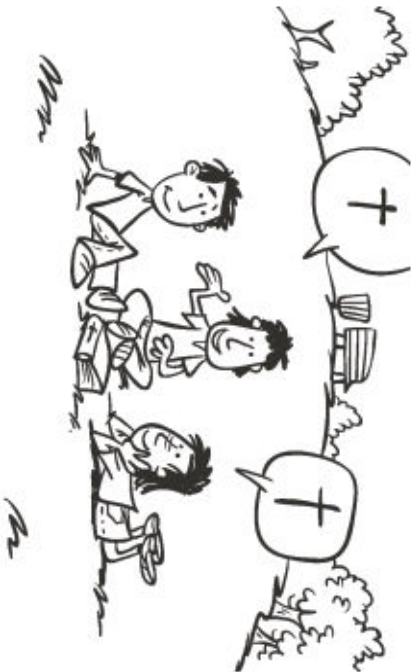
