How do we show others who God is in our lives? How do we live our faith that makes other people want to have a deeper faith? We know we are not alone... "And behold, I am with you always, until the end of the age."

From the homilies recently...

Fr. Steve

The disciples were always so anxious. Yet, Jesus tells us, "I'll never leave you orphans."

Through our struggles, God is always with us.

CDTs the Cares and Difficulties and Troubles of life.

The secret is connection and relationship. God promised to send us the Holy Spirit. The Spirit is deep within us all. We are called to develop our spiritual life.

Fr. Ron Rohlheiser says, we have to kill those things that live on the surface, those things that don't let us know that God loves us unconditionally. We have to kill our cares, difficulties, troubles, brokenness and woundedness. God will never leave us orphans.

Fr. Jay

Those who love me will be loved by my father.

Fr. Ronald Rohlheiser was giving a talk. During intermission a lady came up to him and said I know God loves us unconditionally, but I just can't believe it.

We know this is a basic tenant of our faith.... that God loves us unconditionally. We probably haven't experienced much unconditional love. Everything has a condition on it and so we are not used to unconditional love— that God loves us no matter what. In addition to conditions on love, we have people who are trying to put us down, people who are abusive to us...we want to blame ourselves for that for some reason, we feel unlovable, unworthy, we can't really believe that God loves us.

In a nursery, they were trying to get the babies to stop crying. They found that the sound of a mother's heartbeat was reassuring. The Holy Spirit wants us to hear God's heartbeat. If we can hear that heartbeat, we can be at peace.

We have to forgive the people who have hurt us. If we tell ourselves that we forgive them often enough we will be able to feel better. The other thing is to ask God to help us hear his heartbeat next to us, so we can feel God's peace and that the Holy Spirit is truly with me.

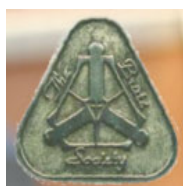

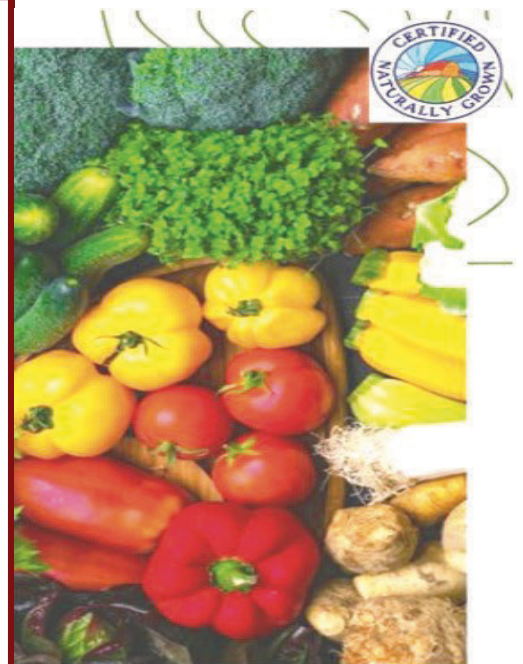

One Minute Meditations

Act in confidence

Jesus does not want us to be troubled by worldly concerns.

"My peace I give you" (John 14:27). When you feel

yourself starting to worry or stew about a difficult situation (or person), act out your belief that your prayer for resolution will be answered. Substitute positive, cheerful thoughts for negative ones. God is in control.

Your Lenten change

Lent is a time when we make changes that bring us closer to God. During Lent, many of us fast from our favorite food or drink, and approach Easter a little lighter in spirit and in body. Don't forget that a Lenten change can continue beyond Easter. Consider continuing your Lenten fast on Fridays throughout the year, or for a week each month, for example. Find ways to make your Lenten change permanent.

Rest and relax

God expects us to be sure to rest.

"Come to me, all you who labor and are burdened, and I will give you rest" (Matthew 11:28).



Welcome all God's children

God loves each of us uniquely and fiercely no matter where we come from or how we look. Those of us who follow Him know that it's not just important to love each other. It's God's law.

Celebrate diversity. Invite foreigners or people who are different from you to your home or church. Jesus was once a foreigner in a strange land and was grateful for the hospitality He received. There is great diversity in the Communion of Saints.

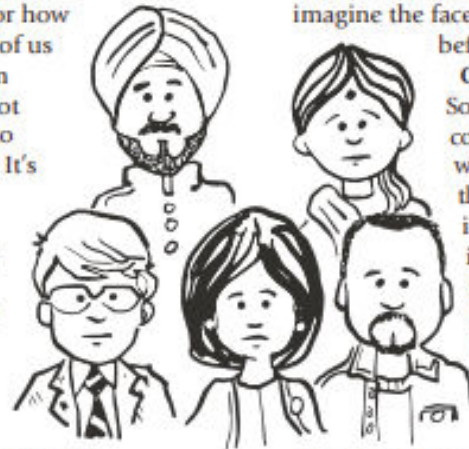
Practice patience. It can be tough to listen to someone with a speech impediment or a heavy accent. Imagine, though, how grateful that

person will be when you offer your attention. Perhaps it would help to imagine the face of Christ in the face before you.

Counsel the ignorant. Someone from another country, background, or with different abilities than yours might behave in what looks like an inconsiderate way out of ignorance or limitations. He might appreciate being informed.

Speak up. Don't stay quiet when you witness prejudice, and be positive about diversity if friends or relatives start criticizing others' faith, cultures or abilities.

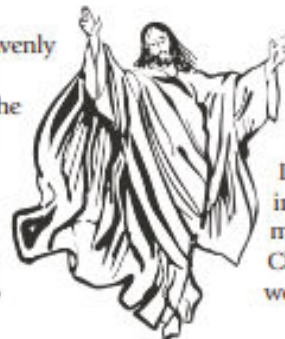
Act with love. The God of love gave of Himself so we could be reunited with Him. We share that love when we assume the best of others and look for the good in all God's children.

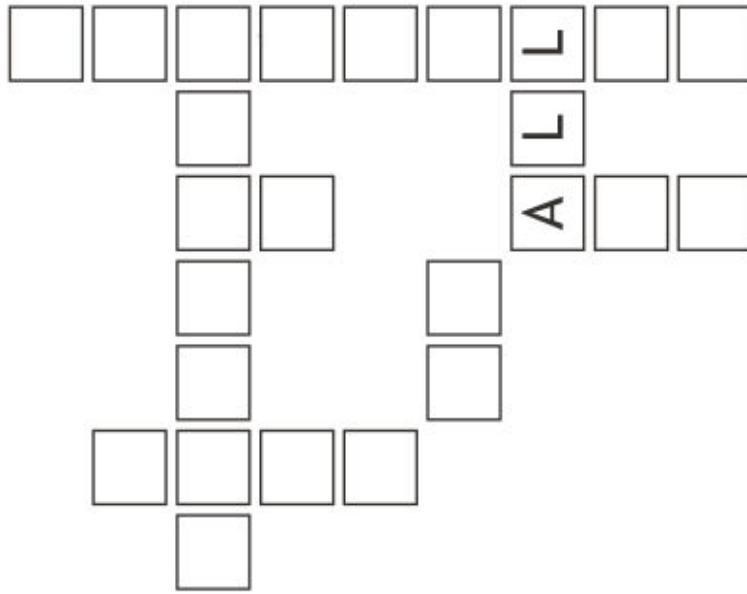
