


"This is my body given for you." (Luke 22:19) ... Awesome God People reaching for God and God reaching for people. We can't get there on our own.

#### From the homilies recently...

#### Fr. Steve

Ronald Rolheiser tells the story of a Rabbi who wanted to be in God's presence. You can find the story at <a href="www.allsaintsevansville.org">www.allsaintsevansville.org</a> under livestreamed Masses. The story of the great Rabbi reminds us of rituals and the stories that give life by themselves.

Just as when we gather every weekend at the Eucharist, we gather as a family, to be united, to tell the stories, gather at the table to eat his flesh and drink his blood, and we are one with God in God's presence.

What do we remember primarily about the Eucharist? There is a crucifix in Church. It reminds us of sacrifice and self-denial. It is self-lessness. It is Good Friday, giving our blood and body for others. That is what Eucharist is about...sacrifice. Just like some mothers and fathers who give up their dreams to make the dreams of their children present. They sacrifice. They make holy. They make holy others.

Eucharist is to give thanks always for what God has done for us. It is to eat his body and drink his blood. We are called to make sacrifices for one another. We are called to remember. We are called to pass on traditions like eating his body and drinking his blood. To eat and drink of the Lord himself, the true presence is the finest gift we have and that God is present to us and gives everything to us.

Missionaries use this story to tell the story of Jesus. He was the hunter. He gave his life...Jesus' birth, life, teaching, suffering, death and resurrection.

He left the work to all of us, each one of us. He didn't leave us alone. He gave us the Holy Spirit to strengthen and enlighten us. He gave us his word in the Scriptures. And one important thing he did besides that was give us his body and blood in the Eucharist. At the words of institution, the bread and wine will be turned into Jesus' own body and blood.

This is different than regular food because when we eat regular food, that food becomes part of us. Here if we eat Jesus, we become Jesus. We become part of his body.

When we consume it, we become Jesus. We become part of his body.

Let us think about this great mystery. That Jesus has given himself to us in a very, very special way by his own body and blood in the Eucharist. Let us thank God for that presence and for being with us in so many ways especially in the Eucharist and for strengthening us to continue his work of spreading his love.

#### St. Vincent de Paul News

In May we received 36 requests for help with electric bills, six for water, seven for furniture, three for new appliances, 26 for clothing and 11 for beds/bedding. Our expenses included \$4,292 to CenterPoint, \$1,503 to EWSU, \$75 to Goodman Creek for appliances and \$59 for supplies. Our Thrift store charge for vouchers used was \$984.

#### Parental worry

It is normal for parents to worry about their children. Even Mary and Joseph worried about Jesus (Luke 2:48). Healthy concern



keeps us diligent and focused.
However, when anxious, it is best
to turn to God and pray for
wisdom, guidance and protection.
Identify what makes you most
anxious as a parent and give it over
to the Lord in trust.

#### Require obedience

Parents want to teach children to make good choices and develop good judgment. Part of this process involves requiring their obedience. "He went down with them and came to Nazareth, and was obedient to them" (Luke 2:51). Jesus might have preferred to stay in the temple in Jerusalem, but He obeyed His parents and went home.

Requiring our children to obey us teaches them to obey God.

"Train up a child in the way he should go, and when he is old he will not depart from it" (Proverbs 22:6).



# Here's to a happy, holy Summer

The slower pace of Summertime gives many families a necessary break from schooltime routines.

Summer days also provide opportunities to focus on family, faith and worship. Try these fun ways to have a happy, holy Summer.

Make Sundays different. Greet Sunday rested and refreshed with an early bedtime Saturday night. Set the tone of the day by listening only to reverent music. Wear




