

Justice Challenge



Family Faith Formation


"This is my body given for you." (Luke 22:19) ... Awesome God People reaching for God and God reaching for people. We can't get there on our own.

Diocesan policy: Report and inform

The Diocese of Evansville has in place a policy that requires that any allegation of child abuse must be reported to civil authorities. If an allegation involves the sexual abuse of a minor by diocesan personnel, the Victim Assistance Coordinator must also be informed. Sexual misconduct violates human dignity and the mission of the church. The spiritual well-being of all victims, their families, and others in the community is of particular concern to the church.

Report child abuse

Every allegation of child abuse must be reported to Child Protection Services, an agency of Indiana state government.



Sisters of St. Benedict to Host Adoration for Vocations.

FERDINAND, IN -- For those interested in focusing more intently on the Blessed Sacrament and praying for vocations, the Sisters of St.. Benedict will be hosting a special "Adoration for Vocations" event at Monastery Immaculate Conception in Ferdinand, Indiana on Thursday, July 13. Adoration begins at 7 p.m. EDT, with prayer led by Sister Jill Reuber and silence with the Blessed Sacrament. Refreshments will be provided afterwards, and all are welcome to stay and socialize.

Sister Jill Reuber has a Bachelor's degree from St. Mary-of-the-Woods College and a Master's from the University of Southern Indiana. She has been a teacher, and currently serves as Director of Vocations for the Sisters of St. Benedict in Ferdinand, Indiana.

The Sisters of St. Benedict in Ferdinand make up one of the largest Benedictine communities of women in the United States — over 110 members strong and thriving. They seek God through the Benedictine tradition of community life, prayer, hospitality, and service to others. By their life and work, they commit themselves to be a presence of peace as they join their sisters and brothers in the common search for God. The Monastery Immaculate Conception was founded in 1867 by four young Benedictine sisters who came to Ferdinand to teach the children of area settlers. Since then, more than 1,000 women have entered this community. Their ministries extend both beyond education and beyond Ferdinand, with members of their community serving as teachers, social workers, parish ministers, counselors, nurses, youth ministers, chaplains, librarians, and much more.

The Necklace



I have a necklace that originally belonged to my great-grandmother. I don't really know much about the man who gave it to her, most of those details have been lost to time. But I know that he wanted to marry her, and that she refused, and it had something to do with religion — ultimately, he did not share her faith. And while I've certainly seen many interfaith couples have loving and successful marriages, in this particular case, my great-grandmother discerned that this would not be one of those marriages.

Like I said, I don't have many details about this man, but I know that she felt she couldn't marry him because it might jeopardize the souls of her children, and therefore the souls of their children, and their children after them — me. She turned him down because of me.

My great-grandmother never sold that necklace, not even when the Great Depression further reduced her financial circumstances. She kept it, and she gave it to her daughter, who gave it to her daughter, who gave it to me. The necklace is always given with a warning: there is something worse than being poor, worse than being scared, worse even than being desperate. Worse than all of these things is separation from God.

When I wear this necklace, I think about my great-grandmother and this man she possibly loved a hundred years ago. I think of the many decisions we make every day — large and small, good and bad — that reverberate down through the generations in ways we cannot, at the time, imagine. I think of the God who knows every hair on my head.
