

On July 26 we celebrate the feast day of Joachim and Anne, the parents of Mary. Anne is the patron saint of grandmothers, since she herself was Jesus' grandma. While many cultures around the world honor the elderly and give them the highest respect, in our own country we have witnessed the neglect and sometimes even the abuse of our elders.

Your challenge this week is to be an advocate for the "wisdom people" in your life. How can you show respect for the older people in your own family, or on your block, or in a nursing home in your community? How can you support the needs of the elderly through legislation? Can you offer a smile, a greeting, and perhaps even a visit with an elder who is lonely and gets few visitors?

Sit with your eyes closed. Think of the Eucharistic prayer. What is the first thing that comes to mind? For me, it is "so that they may become for us the Body and Blood of our Lord Jesus Christ." And, "Do this in memory of me." The "epiclesis" and

"transubstantiation." For me, the power of the God at work through the Holy Spirit and Jesus to nourish me. In this part of the prayer, I am called to remember Jesus' last supper with his disciples. How would I understand this moment if I put myself into that occasion of the last supper? How would I feel? How would I be changed when I left the meal?

Fr. Steve

There's something about summertime. There's something about being out in the garden.

We have this great story of the sower and the seed. It's not about the seeds, the generosity of God, who throws this seed everywhere. It's not about the harvest. It's not even about the powerful Word of God, the seed that must take root for life.

It's all about the earth, the soil, the dirt. It's about us, and how receptive we are to the Word of God, to everything that God gives us, not only the good news, but sometimes the bad news.

We learn very clearly in this parable that the seed that falls on the path, rocky ground, the thorns, it will go nowhere. The seed needs to fall on the good soil.

Who has ears ought hear. How receptive am I to God's grace. That's the challenge. Do we have ears to hear when people are telling us something we need to hear? Do we have ears to hear and eyes to see? As we listen to the parables these next weeks, let's listen to hear what God has in store for us.

The Catholic Bubble

There's a dangerous myth that exists among pockets of faithful, observant Catholic families. I call it the Legend of the Catholic Bubble.

Here's how the legend goes: you find a devout Catholic parish and a devout Catholic community filled with devout Catholic people who care about devout Catholic things, and you stay away from everything and everyone else, you and your children will be safe from the influence of the evil one. Your children will never fall away from the faith, or even be tempted, and your own faith will stay steel-strong amidst the many tempests and trials of this earthly life.

But like the Loch Ness Monster and the Abominable Snowman, it's all made up.

Don't misunderstand me: I *love* a good devout Catholic parish. I *live for* a supportive, devout Catholic community. It's one of the biggest blessings in the Christian life, and I cannot overstate how helpful it is to raise children in an environment that upholds your Catholic faith and does not denigrate it.

But. But.

Make no mistake: the Catholic Bubble will not save you. The trials and the temptations will find you there, too: on the parish council, at Catholic school, in your Catholic moms' group. No community on earth is so supportive that it mimics Heaven. The weeds have been sown with the good seed, and the harvest time is not yet upon us.

Cherish your community, certainly — but beware of the lure of the Catholic Bubble. We are called to be yeast in the loaf of bread, and yeast is nothing on its own.

Tri State Creation Care-Green Solutions for a New Era in Water Treatment

Congregations Acting for Justice & Empowerment



CAJE News

All Saints hosted the 20th Anniversary Nehemiah Action on May 1st. All Saints CAJE Network members brought 108 of the 435 people who joined together to act for justice. The A-Men's club turned out in large numbers to help with traffic control and parking with special shout outs to Jerome and Jeremiah Echele, Roger Rogge, Jim Tolen, both José Remirez Sr. and Jr. Sorry if not every man who helped is listed as you all did a good job. Also, thanks to Sharon Vogler who taxied people from parking lots to the church. Bonnie Wink, Machalle Walker, Sandy Bruno, Vera Gilbert, Ava Neidlinger, Karen Stewart, and Carol Wagner helped get people situated in the church and gym. Lee Ann Rasche took magnificent pictures. Welcoming the community to St. Anthony Church was made possible by your hard work.

With your support CAJE won commitments from Mayor Wennecke to commit to recommending \$500,000 into the AHTF for the 2024 budget. As well as, allocating \$10 million in ARPA funds set aside for affordable housing and informing CAJE about how those monies will be spent by the end of this year. Zac Heronemus, Evansville City Council, indicated he would work towards forming a group to address ways to hold landlords responsible for providing safe housing. Va Cun, new director of the United Caring Shelter indicated they are looking for a program director for the crisis care unit and expect it to be operational 3-4 nights a week starting in the fall.

Thirty of us gathered at St. Wendel for the CAJE Celebration. The group made contributions or pledges to support CAJE in its work for next year. If you have not yet invested in CAJE please send a check to CAJE at P.O. Box 18172 or go to www.greaterevansvillecaje.org and click on invest. Or, consider making a Qualified Charitable Distribution from your IRA. Let CAJE know if there is a program that will match your investment. If you know of a business that might be interested in investing in CAJE contact Brenda Meyer.

Finally, we are coming up on the start of a new justice cycle with CAJE. House Meetings will be offered in September and October. Please join us as we gather information about unmet needs or injustices in our community in preparation for the Community Problems Assembly in November.


