

Justice Challenge 20th Week in Ordinary Time



I think the challenge of the word of God today might be, where is God working in my life? What risks am I invited to take in my own life? In my family life? In my church life? The story of Elijah is a story of risk-taking.

In our struggles, God is not always in the mighty winds, or the earthquakes, or the fires. God comes in a tiny, whispering sound, as we wait for the word of God. The story is about faith, and trusting in God.

We all take risks in life. The Lord calls us all the time. We can't quit. Sometimes we all need to step out and take a few more risks. Lord, let us see your kindness and grant is your salvation.

How long has it been since I took a risk for God in my life? How long has it been since I've taken a risk to do something for my church on my family? I think risk taking is a part of discipleship. Where is God calling me to walk on water?

Reset/repaired breakers to make ceiling lights work.

Received insurance payments for both lightning strikes.

Updates of A/V equipment at St. Anthony Church in process

Applied to Oregon Catholic Press for a grant. Decisions are made in the fall.

Considered updating 10-year-old video cameras.

Considered installation of fiber optic cable.

Continue to look for a part-time Business Manager and Pastoral Associate.

Parish volunteers continue to help in the parish office.

Our All Saints Parish website is in the process of being updated/refreshed.

Our 2022-2023 budget summary shows a surplus of \$30,312. This surplus is a result of salaries which were not paid/positions not yet filled and grant money that helped fund the new Justice Ministry.

Our Catholic Parishes Campaign goal for 2022-2023 was \$148,259. We reached 76% pledged toward that goal. \$100,354 has been paid toward this goal as of 7-26-23.

The remainder is paid in monthly installments to the Diocese.

Updated landscaping.

Numbered entrances to the buildings.

Scheduled a Situational Awareness class.



Exercising School Bus Safety

Hoosier students are returning to school, which means school buses will be on our roads again. The <u>Indiana State Police</u> ask all motorists to remain aware of traveling and stopped school buses by abiding by the following state laws.



- If a school bus stops on a two-lane road with the red lights flashing and stop arm extended, all motorists must stop.
- If a school bus stops on a multi-lane roadway without a barrier and with the red lights flashing and stop arm extended, all motorists must stop.
- If a school bus stops on a multi-lane roadway with a grassy and/or concrete barrier and with the red lights flashing and stop arm extended, only vehicles behind the bus must stop. Vehicles approaching from the opposite side are not required to stop but should remain cautious.

Children should also stand six feet away from the curb while waiting for the bus to arrive and only approach the bus when the doors open after it comes to a complete stop.

Make sure children look both ways before crossing the street in front of the bus in case motorists do not heed state school bus safety laws.

"Go and make disciples"

We're all called to spread the Gospel as missionaries (Mark 16:15), but not everyone is required

(Mark 16:15), but not everyone is required to travel. As a Carmelite nun, St. Therésè of Lisieux lived out her "second calling" to be a missionary. Here are three ways to spread the Gospel within any vocation:

Go deeper in your faith. You can't share what you don't have. St. Therese developed her "Little Way" of holiness after years of prayer and study. Step deeper into your faith daily: read a section of the

Catechism, pray over a verse of Scripture, listen to a

Catholic podcast while driving or walking, pray.

Adopt-a-missionary: St. Therésè was a "spiritual sister"
to several missionaries, writing them letters and
supporting them in prayer, indirectly helping
hundreds of souls. Adopt a missionary – or
anyone who shares the Faith. Contact your
parish or diocese for suggestions.

"Intercession fueled by charity": St.

There's lovingly offered to God the "thorns"
she received from others – discomforts,
misunderstandings, hurt feelings – to win souls for

Christ. Offer your "thorns" as saving graces.

Matthew 16:13-20, The "Rock-solid" foundation

The events in this passage lay the foundations for the Catholic Church. In it, Jesus asks His disciples, "Who do you say that I am?" It was a question about Jesus' identity, rather than about the persuasiveness

than about the persuasiveness of His teaching or His popularity. The heart of Catholicism centers around the truth of who Jesus is.

Inspired by the Holy
Spirit, Simon answers
for the group, identifying
Jesus as the Son of God, the Messiah
(Matthew 16:17). Jesus proclaims
this was divinely revealed to Simon
and changes his name to Peter

("Rock"). Jesus gives him the keys to the kingdom, giving Peter (and his successors) the authority to interpret Scripture, forgive sins, and admit people into the Church.

By this, Jesus signaled He was building His Church on a rock-solid foundation – on the confession of Peter about Jesus' divinity. This truth has been handed down through the ages, from the Apostles to the bishops to

us. The Holy Spirit would lead Peter – and his successors, the popes – to continue speaking and acting in truth as the visible head of the Church.

Q &

How can I avoid gossiping?

Chatting with friends can become gossip – unfairly disclosing another's faults or sins without a valid reason, to people who don't know them (Catechism of the Catholic Church, #2477). Try these ideas when chatting becomes gossip:

Name it: A gentle reminder between friends is an act of kindness. Try, "I think we're edging into gossip," or "Oh, that's not kind!" It's better to risk speaking up than silently allowing sin.

Redirect the conversation: Highlight good qualities of the person about whom others are gossiping. Refocus on inspiring news, a good book you read – anything else that is "honorable ... just ... pure ... pleasing" (Philippians 4:8).

Leave: If nothing else works, excuse yourself and leave the conversation. You'll avoid becoming complicit to sin and wordlessly communicate that you find gossip unacceptable.

Pray: Sins of the tongue (gossip, slander, calumny, detraction) are serious and require grace to resist. Invoke the Holy Spirit for yourself, for those who engage in gossip, and especially for those harmed by it.

Feasts & 🖊 💿 Celebrations

August 6 – Transfiguration of the Lord. Christ appeared in glory in the company of Moses and Elijah, discussing the Passion (Luke 9:30-31), and a voice was heard to say, "This is my beloved son, with whom I am well pleased; listen to him" (Matthew 17:5).

August 14 – St. Maximilian Mary Kolbe (1941). A Polish Franciscan, St. Maximilian was imprisoned at Auschwitz. When the jailers chose ten people to execute, he substituted himself for a man with a family. He was honored as a "martyr of charity" by Pope John Paul II.

August 23 – St. Rose of Lima (1617). Born in colonial Peru, Rose worked constantly to help her poverty-stricken family. She became a lay Dominican, and cared for homeless children, the elderly, and the sick in her house.

August 29 – Passion of St. John the Baptist (1st century). St. John the Baptist courageously spoke the truth to the leaders of his time, making him powerful enemies. He was arrested by Herod and martyred (Mark 6:17-29).


