

From the homilies recently...

Fr. Steve

The Scripture today challenges – how accepting are we of all God's people?

Do I know my own biases and prejudices ingrained in me from my youth?

Where do we learn about diversity and acceptance? Where do we learn about respect and equality due to all genders? Where do we learn about racial or economic injustice?

Today is a challenge. God's house is a house of prayer for all people. God's creation knows no boundaries. He knows no partiality. Love usurps all exclusions.

Maybe like the disciples, you and I have learned and will continue to learn equality for all in this world. Mercy and justice is our birthright. All are invited to celebrate at the table.

Fr. Jay

Well, what happened to good old sweet Jesus? He doesn't sound like himself does he? He sounds like he's having a bad day.

What's going on here? When she told Jesus her daughter was tormented by a demon, he didn't say anything at all. When he'd just sent the disciples out, he told them to go to the Israelites only. That is what he is saying here.

Let's look at what's really going on here. First of all, this is how the Jewish people of Jesus' day talked about the Canaanites. They were the enemy. This is the language Jesus heard growing up.

I think that, as Jesus grew, he learned he had special gifts. At this point, the woman pushed him to realize he was there for everyone and not just the Jews. This is a possibility.

Matthew doesn't give us a lot of detail about what is going on between Jesus and this lady. We have to think about the relationship between Jesus and this woman. Did Jesus know her? Had they been talking?

Like this woman, we need to look at how we talk to the Lord. How we present ourselves to him. Do we keep talking and asking? Is our faith strong?

From Eucharistic Prayer II

"Therefore, as we celebrate the memorial of his Death and Resurrection,

we offer you, Lord, the Bread of life and the Chalice of salvation,

giving thanks that you have held us worthy to be in your presence and minister to you.

Humbly we pray that, partaking of the Body and Blood of Christ, we may be gathered into one by the Holy Spirit."

This part of the Eucharistic prayer caught my attention the other Saturday evening at Mass. I need to pray with these verses more to see what they are fully saying to me.

I was struck especially by the phrases, "to be in your presence and minister to you" and "we may be gathered into one by the Holy Spirit."

How do I minister to Christ? Being gathered into one takes me back to all of us being the Body of Christ. So, I minister to Christ when I minister to others? When and how do I minister to others? Am I aware of when others are in need? Do I minister joyfully, impatiently, compassionately, distractedly? Just thinking...and praying.




