
Family Faith Formation


Justice Challenge Feast of the Transfiguration

On August 7 and 9, we mark the bombings of Nagasaki and Hiroshima during World War II. Today we have nuclear weapons which are much more devastating than the atomic bombs dropped on Japan almost 70 years ago. Our U.S. Bishops have written courageously about nuclear war. Applying the Catholic Church's teaching about just war, which has evolved over the past two thousand years, the bishops have concluded that they cannot justify the use of nuclear weapons. Your challenge this week is to look at how you can contribute to a peaceful world so that the threat of nuclear war is made remote and unimaginable. How are you a peacemaker in your home? At school or at work? In your community? In how you engage in civic life? What is one thing you can do this week to make our world safer for everyone?


Family Faith Formation

Sisters of St. Benedict, Ferdinand Mission Appeal

Thank you, Sr. Kathy Huber, for joining us last weekend!

Last Sunday we have someone very special with us. Each year we have someone to speak to us about a mission. We welcomed Sr. Kathy Huber. She is with the Sisters of St. Benedict in Ferdinand, IN.

In the 1960s the Pope requested religious communities to send 10% of their personnel to Latin America because he saw a faith crisis on the horizon, and our community responded. Thirty of our sisters have served in Columbia, Guatemala, and Peru. Today some continue work with the Latino communities in the USA.

In the 1970s, we were invited to establish a mission in northern Peru to begin a school for girls. Today it is coed, grades K – 12, with an enrollment of 900 students. It is the school of choice in the area.

Later we established a monastery. It is for this group of Sisters, all Peruvian, and their ministries that I make this appeal. The Monastery of the Peace of the Cross has seven Peruvian women in final profession and one int the novitiate. The country provides limited resources for the citizens, but the love, care and concern of our sisters is abundant. The sisters teach, provide pastoral care, and they assist those coming to their door seeking food, medical care, and spiritual care.

When our sisters arrived in the 1970s there was one priest for every 14,000 people. Nearly everyone was Catholic. Today our sisters train the laity to meet the needs of the people.

How many of you remember Sister T? I asked her to share a story. She said, "Do you remember the time when I asked Fr. Jay to drink a cup of water from the ditch?" She was asking us to help buy a water filter system for countries that had no clean water to drink. We will never know how we changed so many people's lives until we get to heaven and someone comes up to us and says thank you.

So, let us continue our efforts to change the world here in the neighborhood and elsewhere. All contributions, no matter the size, make a difference. We ask you to pray for the monastery and for peace in our world. Our Peruvian sisters say "gratias" and promise their prayer for you. On May 31st, our balance was \$14,939. During June and July we were able to help 110 of our neighbors with utilities,

rent, appliances, furniture, clothing, and miscellaneous household items for a total of \$11,269. We received a gift of \$1000 from St. Phillips parish, \$300 from the Baird Trust, \$250 in honor of Sr. Caroline who celebrated her 70th Anniversary as a Daughters of Charity, and contributions of \$2,158 from you, our generous parishioners. This is a huge difference from last summer when we could only help with clothing.
