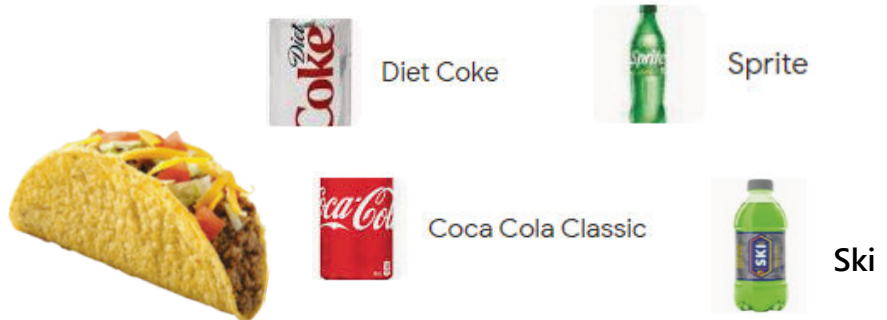

Justice Challenge 19th Week in Ordinary Time

On August 14 we celebrate the feast day of St. Maximilian Mary Kolbe. He gave up his life in a concentration camp during World War II, offering to take the place of a father who was selected for the gas chamber. He was canonized a saint in 1982.

Your challenge this week is to give up something on behalf of another person. It won't be your very life as it was for St. Maximilian, but it might be something you really like. Maybe you are called to give up television to help someone with their homework, or to sacrifice a meal in order to pray for a loved one suffering from cancer. It might be taking money you saved for a smart phone or tablet and donating it to people suffering from a hurricane or typhoon. What are you willing to give up for others?

This reminds me that the Eucharistic Prayer is not a static prayer. It is not just one of those prayers that we keep hearing at every Mass. It is a prayer that can be alive for me. How about you?

All of us need mountaintop experiences don't we? Every day gets a little old. We need to see who we can be with one another, and how we can grow confident in God's presence. We need to trust the vision that we have in the grace of the mountaintop experience.

Come with me to the mountain. It is there that relationships can be made right. We are no different than Peter, James, and John. We all have failed. Next, we are graced by God all over again. You and I need mountaintop experiences. You and I need Pentecost events, the spirit of God in us.

The sanctuary here, like others, is a mountaintop experience. Let us gain confidence in God's presence in our lives.

We celebrate this feast every year during Lent. This year we celebrate it again on this Feast of the Transfiguration.

I think when Jesus came to earth, he came as a human. He eventually grew into knowing that he was God. In this transfiguration story, Jesus calls Peter James, and John to go on the mountain. Jesus is revealed in his divinity, partially as God. They saw a bit of Jesus as God, and they were surprised. Did you ever think that maybe Jesus was surprised? I never thought of that until the other day.

What's this mean for us? I think we all have a bit of something hidden in our lives...a shadow self. Behind our shadow self are things we are not very proud of. We don't want to look at them. God can see your shadow self. Other people can see part of our shadow self, especially our good friends.

So, what would it be like if we began to look at our shadow self, and see what it was like to see what is there? We could see how we could grow in becoming more like Christ.

I'm inviting you, if you feel you can, to ask God to reveal something of your shadow self to you. Take a look at it and see what you can learn from it. It's a bit scary. If you're scrupulous, I would say don't do that. I think it can lead us closer to God.

See if you're ready to do this. Jesus says don't be afraid. Let God reveal to you a part of your shadow self.

One Minute Meditations

A vessel of God's grace

We are each asked to share God's love with others. How much we allow ourselves to be filled with God's grace will determine what we can share with others. We fill up with grace when we frequent the Sacraments, pray, and study our faith. After all, if we don't practice our own faith how can we help someone to become excited about theirs?

Our powerful Lord

In the Gospels, Jesus healed people 20 times. Seven times Jesus expelled demons. Three times He raised people from the dead, and eight other miracles showed His power over nature. With God all things are possible. All we have to do is ask in harmony with His will.

"My soul proclaims the greatness of the Lord; my spirit rejoices in God my Savior for He has looked with favor on his lowly servant. From this day all generations will call me blessed" (Luke 1:46-48).



Build up the Kingdom of God

As followers of Jesus, we're each called to take our place in the Kingdom of God and help build it up. Consider these suggestions to do your part:

Find your gifts: What special gifts do you possess? In addition to talents and skills, these can include wisdom from life experience or a particularly deep faith. Discern your gifts and ask God where He wants you to use them.

Cultivate gratitude: Write down everything for which you are grateful in a "blessings list." Review it and add to it regularly, especially when tempted to jealousy or discouragement. Praise and thank God daily for whatever is on your list.

Practice humility: St. Thomas Aquinas

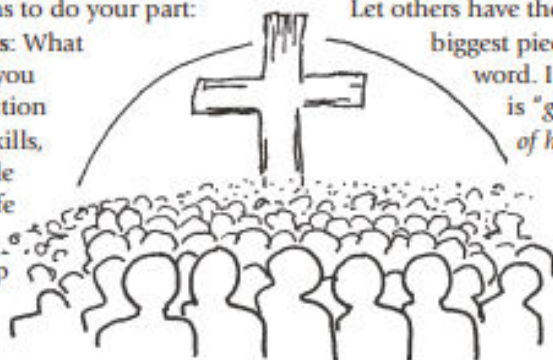
said, "Humility means seeing ourselves as God sees us: knowing every good we have comes from Him as pure gift."

Let others have the best place, the biggest piece of cake, the last word. Imitate Him who is "gentle and humble of heart" (Matthew 11:29).

Strive for the higher gifts: Jesus asked every one of us to love God and each other. Without love, St. Paul said, "I gain nothing" (1 Corinthians 13:3). If you have true charity, you're on the right track.



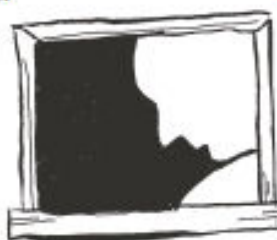
Why Do Catholics Do That?

On Easter Sunday, Jesus appeared to the Apostles in the Upper Room and said, "Peace be with you" (John 20:19). He breathed on them, saying, "Receive the Holy Spirit. Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them and whose

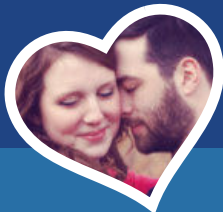
