

Justice Challenge 22st Week in Ordinary Time

The Gospel for Sunday reminds us that discipleship isn't easy. It will often require us to share in the Cross of Jesus. We are called to deny ourselves, to lose our lives for the sake of the Gospel. Your challenge this week is to take up your cross and walk in solidarity with someone who suffers on a daily basis. Can you journey with someone who is poor or homeless, someone who is a victim of prejudice or discrimination, an undocumented immigrant, or someone in prison? Reflect on someone who is in deep physical or emotional or spiritual pain and offer up your own suffering this week for that person. OR

September 9th is the feast day of St. Peter Claver. He exemplified the preferential option for the poor and vulnerable by reaching out to the black slaves in Catagena, one of the major entry points for slave ships on their way to American. Peter Claver once said of the frightened Africans who had been kidnapped for slavery, "We must speak to them with our hands, before we try to speak to them with our lips." He worked tirelessly on their behalf, baptizing and healing, sleeping in the slave quarters with them, always treating them with dignity. Your challenge this week is to reach out with your hands to a group in need in your community. Identify one action you can do as a family or household to help this group. Think of serving a meal at a shelter, or going door-todoor in your neighborhood to collect items which are needed by a local helping agency. Perhaps your challenge will be to give a hug and have a conversation with someone in desperate need. Reach out with your hands while honoring the dignity and giftedness of whomever you encounter.


Our next two sessions will be on Sunday, September 10 and 24.



From the homilies recently...

Jesus loved questions didn't he? They say that in the four gospels, he asked over 100 questions. Today he asks, "Who do people say the son of man is? Who do you say that I am?"

Who do you say that I am? Maybe we need to spend more time with this question.

What does Jesus mean to me? Is it the Creed? Is it the alpha and the omega? Is it the man who died on the cross and rose from the dead?

There are many questions in our world. Why is there no cure for Covid? Why are there wildfires, floods, whole cities being destroyed? Why are all of the wars going on? Is this calling us to believe more in Jesus?

Maybe we are like Eliahkim? We are called to take care of the people. We are called to be faithful. Everything depends on Jesus. I urge you to lean on him, to listen to his words of challenge and take up your cross every day.

I invite you this week to ask yourself that question, who is Jesus for me?

Fr. Jay- Jesus asked a lot of questions didn't he? I think he did it mainly as a teaching method because it got people to think. He asked his disciples today. "Who do you say that I am?"

That's an important question. If we get too off, we could be in big trouble.

Can you imagine what it was like for Jesus to leave heaven, and become one of us? In fact, he became a nobody in Nazareth. No one knew who he was. Jesus was well received for a while. Then he started to turn some heads, and was tortured.

He started a revolution of love with his teachings. Not a quick revolution, but a revolution that takes one step at a time. Jesus let us know that if we struggle with him in this revolution, we like him, will never die. We will rise like he did.

So Jesus asks us today, "Who do you say that I am?" Let's take a few moments to think about that question. It makes a big difference. Who do you say that I am?


