

#### Justice Challenge 24st Week in Ordinary Time

This Sunday's Gospel challenges us to treat others as we want to be treated. The example which Jesus uses to illustrate this teaching is the one of debtors and forgiveness of debt. Throughout the Scriptures, we hear God challenging us to forgive debt and give people a second chance. Your challenge this week is to focus personally or globally on debt forgiveness. If you go the local route, ask yourself who most needs a second chance in your life. Whose "debt" can you forgive? If you want to meet the global challenge, ask who most needs a second chance, or a chance to start over, in the world. Is it victims of a natural disaster? Could it be those who have suffered from political persecution? Pay attention to what is happening in the world, then choose a group or individual in need of a second chance. #### From the homilies recently...

#### Fr. Jay

Jesus says if another member of the church is against you go in Point out the fault when the two of you were alone. Sound simple enough doesn't it? Ever tried it? Sometimes it works. Sometimes it doesn't.

When were offended, something builds up inside, which I got anger, I may be disappointed. If we don't confront it and keep it inside, it is not good for us.

I'm thinking Jesus is talking about some thing called restorative justice. Criminologist tell us this is a good way to deal with an offense.

If your kid, throws a ball through the neighbor's window, you might suggest that you and your son go over to the neighbors together. Have him tell the neighbor he threw the ball, and that he was sorry. When you think about the damage done, you may find a way for him to make up for the cost of the broken window.

Sometimes restorative justice is pretty messy.

This is a tricky situation. How do we deal with people who have hurt us? A lot of prayer and conversation with the Lord before we do it.

Community justice is what I call it when we are looking at community problems that need solutions. We have an organization that works on this. It is called CAJE. You will be asked to help identify the needs of our community.

Think about what needs to change in our community. For the future, what needs to happen? What needs to change? We will have house meetings coming up in the fall. Talk to Brenda Meyer about this opportunity.

Take some time now, to think about what are the most pressing needs in our communities that need to be solved and how can we make that happen?

#### **Congregations Acting for Justice & Empowerment**

#### CAJE is one of the 24 DART affiliates. CAJE is the Evansville Area's Justice Ministry Organization

#### Why do we need a justice ministry organization in Evansville?

Since ancient biblical times, those in power have convinced us that there is a scarcity of resources to create justice for everyone in our society. CAJE is here to use the power of large numbers of people to redirect the priorities of our elected officials. We are here to focus them on community problems that may not directly affect them personally. We know elected officials listen to and act upon the desires of the loudest voting voices. A good example was the "Tea Party" during the Obama Administration. Protests and marches are excellent ways to raise awareness of community problems, but we need to go beyond that and make structural changes, government policy changes, and city government budget changes that will change the system and make for broad, long-term solutions. "We have to do more to help the people that need the most help." (Jeff Hatfield – Vanderburgh County Commissioner)

#### What has CAJE accomplished over the years?

Since its founding in 2003, CAJE has persuaded city and county government officials to

- · Establish a free/reduced cost dental clinic
- · Create a bus route from Evansville to the Toyota Manufacturing Plant in Princeton
- Expand the Vanderburgh County Drug Court Program\*
- Expand Aurora's Re-Entry Program\*
- · Equip First Responders with Narcan (naloxone) to save lives in case of drug overdose
- Increase the dollar amount in the city's Affordable Housing Trust Fund

#### What were CAJE's most recent Issue Campaigns?

- To get MORE money in the Evansville Affordable Housing Trust Fund. (Currently \$500,000 per year. This year, Mayor committed to at least \$1 million for next two years)
- To get the city to work with the National Network of Safe Communities to reduce gun violence in Evansville.
   (Mayor committed to \$380,000 contract with NNSC and has named the Task Force to work with the consultants)
- To get important city agencies to work with the community's Dually Diagnosed Children Task Force
- To fund and staff a crisis care center (Evansville Diversion Center) to divert people from jails and emergency departments for mental health crisis (The city has committed \$600,000 over the next two years)
- To create affordable housing solutions in Warrick County


