Justice Challenge 25st Week in Ordinary Time

This Sunday's Gospel challenges us to treat others as we want to be treated. The example which Jesus uses to illustrate this teaching is the one of debtors and forgiveness of debt. Throughout the Scriptures, we hear God challenging us to forgive debt and give people a second chance. Your challenge this week is to focus personally or globally on debt forgiveness. If you go the local route, ask yourself who most needs a second chance in your life. Whose "debt" can you forgive? If you want to meet the global challenge, ask who most needs a second chance, or a chance to start over, in the world. Is it victims of a natural disaster? Could it be those who have suffered from political persecution? Pay attention to what is happening in the world, then choose a group or individual in need of a second chance. How can you help them get it?

OR

On September 27 we honor the life of St. Vincent de Paul. He founded missionary communities of men and women, both dedicated to the needs of the poor and vulnerable. Today the Vincentians continue his legacy, as do the thousands of lay people who belong to their local St. Vincent de Paul Society. Your challenge this week is to research your parish chapter of St. Vincent de Paul, or the nearest local St. Vincent store or center. Find out what you can do to help. It might be joining your parish chapter, or donating time and money to this ministry, or getting the word out to others about the great work which St. Vincent de Paul chapters accomplish. It might be going through your closets and donating quality clothing or household items to the local St. Vincent de Paul store. Fr. Jay

There are several problems in today's Gospel. First is with numbers. We hear to forgive 77 times and we hear 70×7 times. The point is forgive always.

The first man owed a very large amount to his fellow slave, owed, very small amount. So, the owner put the first slave in jail until he could be paid. God told us to forgive over and over again. So why didn't this owner forgive his servant? I suppose he could not be forgiving.

I think forgiveness is extremely important. Sometimes we are angry with people who are closest to us or people who are different from us. We are called to forgive so we can be at peace.

A few weeks ago a mother called needing 3 twin beds for boys 6 and 8 and for a teenage daughter. We told her we could financially assist with only one twin bed, but shared with her about the Sleep in Heavenly Peace Program which is a National Organization of volunteers that build beds in the home so that every child in America has a bed. The mother wanted them to come to the home right away to build the beds. A St. Vincent de Paul member made a home visit to make sure there was adequate space to build the beds and three weeks later several men built bunk beds for the boys and a bed for the daughter. The mother called saying the boys keep hugging their bed and her daughter is overjoyed to be off the floor.

They were overwhelmed to be supplied with mattresses, pillows, sheets, blankets, bedspreads etc.

We love hearing such happy results and without your generous donations to SVdP stories like this would never happen.

Vulnerable youth are at particularly high-risk:

- In one study, 95% of youth who were sex trafficked reported a history of childhood maltreatment
- Multiple studies have found 50% to 90% of children who were victims of child sex trafficking had been involved in the child welfare system
- 1 in 6 runaways reported to the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children in 2020 were likely victims of sex trafficking
- 40% of homeless youth identify as LGBTQ teens who have no support system
- LGBTQ youth are 7.4 times more likely to experience sexual violence than their heterosexual peers
- Marginalized youth of color: In one survey of domestic minor sex trafficking survivors, 42% identified as African American, 21% as Hispanic
- #1 risk factor for labor trafficking for immigrant and/or undocumented youth is recent migration or their location


