Justice Challenge 28st Week in Ordinary Time

The Sunday Gospel describes the wedding banquet to which the groom's father invited his family and friends. But the invited guests chose not to come. In frustration, the father welcomed people beyond his immediate circle, even reaching out to people on the fringes of society. And they came! Jesus' message is clear: through him, God has given us a new understanding of who the Chosen People are. They are not only people born into the Jewish community. The chosen people include anyone who says yes to God's call. Your challenge this week is to look at someone who is not Catholic, a person you don't know very well. It might be someone you pass on the street or in the grocery store, perhaps a person whom you consider different or wrong, scary or mean. Can you view the person through God's eyes, seeing them as part of God's chosen people? Can you name one way in which the person has said yes to God? In the coming week, commit yourself to a change of attitude or heart about this person.

OR

Justice Challenge: On October 16 we celebrate World Food Day, a world-wide event designed to increase awareness, understanding and informed, year-round action to alleviate hunger. We often reserve fasting for Lent. But your challenge this week is to choose a fast you can do to be in solidarity with those who go to bed hungry every night. It might mean giving up food for a whole day, or giving up one meal, or abstaining from your favorite beverage or snack for a day—or for the whole week. Take the money you would have spent on the meal(s) or snacks or drinks you sacrificed and donate it to an organization which feeds people directly or advocates for policies in our government which protect the hungry and vulnerable here at home or across the globe.



From the Homilies This Week

Fr. Jay

Today's Gospel is the third confrontation Jesus has with the chief priests and leaders. For them it was astounding because they had control over people's lives, and they were able to oppress people very directly, economically.

The parable today has a watchtower to guard against thieves and the lease of the vineyard to tenants. Matthew turns this parable into an allegory where each feature has some particular meaning. The landowner is God. Leased vineyard to tenants; the tenants are the chief priests and elders. Servants to collect the owners share are the early prophets. The owner's son is Jesus.

So, Jesus asks the chief priests and elders what will happen to the people who killed the tenants. They will put them to death and lease to other tenants. Jesus says in effect, you are those servants, those people who will suffer the effects because the vineyard will be given to others.

I think Jesus is trying to expand our vision of what the Kingdom of God will be like. After Vatican II, our vision was expanded. Some people liked it, and some didn't. We have begun a worldwide Synod. I'm inviting you to be part of this as much as possible. Pray for those delegates who are gathered in Rome now. Pray that the people listen to one another and to the whole Church to do what God wants to do to expand the vision of the Church. Pope Francis has asked us to evolve our understanding of theology. Pray that the Synod is successful, that we are able to expand our vision and follow what Jesus wants for our Church.


