





Justice Challenge 30th Week in Ordinary Time

The Sunday readings challenge us to care for the most vulnerable in our midst. The First Reading focuses on immigrants, orphans, widows, and the poor. The Gospel has Jesus linking the great commandment of loving God with the command to also love our neighbor. Jesus made them inseparable. Your challenge this week is to explore your definition of neighbor. Whom does it include? Can you identify the people whom is God calling you to love as you love yourself? Stretch yourself as an individual and as a family by expanding your circle of neighbors to include those beyond your comfort zone and beyond your own parish or neighborhood. Have a conversation, meet for coffee, sit in the school cafeteria, or share a ride with someone with whom you haven't connected. Make a new neighbor!

November 3 is the feast day of St. Martin de Porres. Martin was the son of a knight and a freed slave woman. His passion and life work were dominated by his care for the sick, the poor, and slaves in Peru. While we don't officially have slaves in our country today, we do have people who are unjustly bound. There are victims of human trafficking in our cities who are working for unjust wages or are caught up in the commercial exploitation of sex. Many of them are immigrants, and many are children, innocent victims of crimes which deny them their basic human rights. Your challenge this week is to educate yourself—as an individual and as a family—on one of the ways in which people are treated as slaves in our country. Then pray for the victims, and pray for the perpetrators of the injustice. Do one thing—send an email, make a phone call, talk to others—to advocate for safeguards which will prevent this crime from happening in our country and our world.

All Saints CAJE House Meeting Results

All Saints CAJE Team Network Leaders (Janie Allen, Bonnie Wink, Jerome Echele, Tom Bogenschutz, Brenda Meyer and Krisit and Vince Wagner.) held 10 listening sessions to find out what keeps people up at night. 55 people attended and 46 committed to being CAJE Network Members. Remember, Network Members agree to attend the Neimiah Action and bring 3 people with them, also attend the Community Problems Assembly, Rally, and consider investing in CAJE's work at the Celebration in June. Many issues were raised but often people talked about someone lacking affordable housing or living in unsafe conditions. Concerns were also voiced about mental health issues, children lacking parental guidance or support, safety issues in the community or a lack of infrastructure or good parks.



BEACONS OF HOPE

Pope John Paul II wrote, "Even the sick are sent forth as laborers into the Lord's vineyard" (Christifideles Laici, no. 53). As the sick unite their sufferings to those of Christ, they become bearers of the joy of the Holy Spirit in the midst of affliction and witnesses of Christ's Resurrection. Anointing of the Sick testifies to the fact that all are called to participate in the redemption of the world (Sacramentum Caritatis, no. 22). We all have a role in sanctifying and building up the Church, whatever our physical condition. As the Synod of Bishops told an audience of sick and suffering persons, "We need you to teach the whole world what love is" (Per Concilii Semitas ad Populum Dei Nuntius, no. 12).




