

On October 11 we honor Blessed John XXIII. This is the pope who shepherded the Second Vatican Council. He also wrote several encyclicals, one in his last year of life in which he focused on war and peace. In Pacem in Terris (or Peace on Earth), Pope John wrote that the root cause of war is people not getting the resources they need to live a life of dignity. We know that there are enough resources in the world to support all of God's people. But some have too much while others don't have the barest necessities of life. Your challenge this week is to ask yourselves (as individuals and households) if you have too much, if you over-use resources while people around the globe are starving or living in despair. If you answer yes to this question, choose one thing you have which you can donate to someone in need. From the Homilies This Week

Fr. Tom

What if All Saints Parish had one mind, one heart and one opinion? One opinion - that would be hard, but that is what we are if we are following Christ. The scripture today had one son who was able to change his attitude- he was moving forward towards what we want to become.

Two stories of being frustrated.

I tried to get a library card and had to get my picture taken. The quiet and nice staff member reminded me to comb mny hair as she normally would with others so the picture would look nice. He found this ridiculous.

Another time I was serving in a pastoral role at Redbrush Parish. One of the women in the parish was ill and at St. Mary's Hospital. I was rushing back and was almost to the brother's dorm at Memorial and realized I needed to turn around and go to St. Mary's to see this woman. I got there and found out she had been moved to another hospital, Welborn. I was really frustrated at myself for not calling ahead and finding this out and saving a trip. As I was leaving, I ran into a protestant pastor who was coming from a visit with a family and requested that I return. The husband, who was critically ill, had asked to be baptized in the Catholic faith. " Are you serious?" I know I looked irritated and clearly didn't welcome the task, but begrudgingly found the room, and provided the sacrament. The man passed the next day. Good works are there even when there is a bad attitude. Attitude impacts everything we do. If you have the same attitude as Christ, you can't go wrong. For those who can change their attitude, they will be able to move forward.

The chief priest were the rulers of the Jews and used to being spoken to with a title. You were very careful how you addressed the chief priests. So, Jesus poses a question here, sharing the parable from the Gospel. Jesus, said let me tell you, the tax collectors and prostitutes are entering the Kingdom of Heaven before you.

Who is this guy? He didn't go through seminary, he wasn't certified, he had no credentials, he's acting like a rabbi. Who is he? They thought this guy was an imposter, preaching heresy. He was admitting all kinds of people to the Kingdom that they knew were unworthy.

Hopefully we let our hearts be changed. It is difficult. We don't like to change. God says we need to do some work. We need to expand our idea of who is acceptable. Jesus said all people are acceptable there are no limits. God's kingdom is open to everybody. We can't draw limits. If we exclude people, we are not thinking as Jesus does.

Are we excluding people from God's kingdom? Do we think some people are not worthy? Do we really let God's word into our hearts and let our hearts be changed?

Confide in your guardian. Guardian angels aren't mind-readers, but they do observe us

carefully. The more we tell them, the better they can help us make good choices, avoid sin, and keep us safe.

Ask for help. Our guardian can help make tough decisions, resolve conflicts, offer protection especially for our souls. They intercede for us, and help to prepare our souls for the moment when we stand before God.

Respect guardian power. Angels are powerful creatures, created by God to care for us. They aren't answerable to us but stand ready to help us get to Heaven.

October 7 - Our Lady of the Rosary. Pope Gregory XIII named this feast because it was believed that Christians won a critical victory at the Battle of Lepanto after praying the Rosary.

October 9 - St. John Leonardi (1609). Born in 1543 in Lucca, Italy, St. John spent his priesthood ministering in hospitals and prisons and teaching the Faith. He established the Clerks Regular of the Mother of God, and helped found the Congregation of Christian Doctrine.

October 16 - St. Hedwig (1243).

Born to the Duke of Croatia, St. Hedwig married the Duke Henry of Silesia. They founded a convent, h ospitals, and monasteries. After his death, St. Hedwig became a Cistercian nun, donating her fortune to charity.

October 28 - Sts. Simon and Jude (1st century). St. Simon was a Zealot -Jews who believed the Messiah would free them from political oppression. St. Jude was a fisherman. After being called by Jesus to be apostles, they eventually traveled to Persia where they preached the Gospel until they were martyred.

Q Can Catholics & celebrate A Halloween?

Catholics can celebrate Halloween as a holiday with Christian roots. In 835, Pope Gregory IV moved the commemoration of All Martyrs (later All Saints Day) from May 13 to November 1. The night before became known as All Hallow's Even or "Holy



Evening," and eventually Halloween. Villagers visited local homes to gather contributions for the feast to be held the next day, All Saints Day.

Those who didn't contribute might be subject to a prank or "trick."

Catholics enjoy donning creative costumes and giving out candy, but it's important to avoid glorifying evil, death, and the Devil. Consider using the holiday to learn about a saint you didn't know or collecting food for the poor.

In short, Halloween is a chance to celebrate generosity, friendship, and community. It's the threshold of a time to remember the believers who have gone to Heaven before us and the hope we have of following. We also pray for the Holy Souls in Purgatory to strengthen them during their purification before entering Heaven.
