### 33<sup>rd</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time

When I was a kid, I hated playing Monopoly because my siblings and friends always seemed to win. But worse was how it happened. Scared to risk my fake money on buying properties, I'd hold on to it. My opponents hungrily bought up the various real estate squares on the board. Then, inevitably, my poor, low-equity self would land on their spots, pay them rent, and my money would drain to zero. It seemed so unfair. The rich get richer, and the poor get poorer. I had to learn that monopoly money is meant to be spent. I was scared to lose some of it. So, I lost all of it.

How do we see what we possess? Jesus' parable about the talents is not really about economics but about the instability of everything he entrusts to us. How marvelous that everyone in the fable who places talents in the open market doubles their investment. The only one who doesn't is the man who fearfully buries his one talent. Jesus' success strategy for us seems to be, whatever we have, *get it out of our possession*. Risk it as quickly and as fully as we can.

You and I have precious gifts. We have valuable things to invest — time, talents, treasure. The Lord invites us to be brave and even somewhat reckless, to give as much away as possible. If we give it away in the direction of love and truth, it will grow. If we hold on to it in fear, the little we have will be taken away. Let me challenge you this week: find something in your life you're holding on to, and risk it by giving it away. It won't double if you hold on to it.

## Ministry Update... A new ministry... Hand Up



As you know, our Wednesday mornings offer a Community Meal for lunch and a Clothes Closet. These two ministries are charity ministries. Lunch and clothing items are given to people in need.

We are in the process of trying to formalize a Wednesday morning ministry. We are calling it "Hand Up." We are looking for this to be an opportunity to help people take small steps needed to help them move forward from whatever situation they find themselves in. Perhaps we can help them... make phone calls in search for housing or shelter; get an ID so they can apply for assistance; make a copy of paperwork they need to submit for services they need; call for financial help with overdue bills; find specific community resources they need.

This ministry will need volunteers who are interested in working with our neighbors (those who are homeless or living in poverty who come on Wednesday mornings), hearing their story, and building a relationship with them. This will enable the volunteer to have an idea what kind of services the neighbor already has available, and what resources we may be able to help them find.

Do you like to talk with people? People you don't know? Do you have a sense of organization to gather resource information? Find information in a resource book? Do you want to work for justice in small steps? Pray with this ministry possibility. 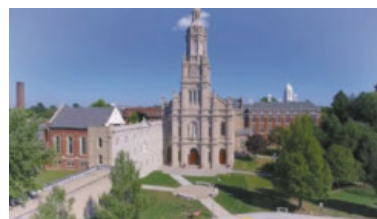
## All Saints CAJE House Meeting Results

All Saints CAJE Team Network Leaders (Janie Allen, Bonnie Wink, Jerome Echele, Tom Bogenschutz, Brenda Meyer and Krisit and Vince Wagner.) held 10 listening sessions to find out what keeps people up at night. 55 people attended and 46 committed to being CAJE Network Members. Remember, Network Members agree to attend the Neimiah Action and bring 3 people with them, also attend the Community Problems Assembly, Rally, and consider investing in CAJE's work at the Celebration in June. Many issues were raised but often people talked about someone lacking affordable housing or living in unsafe conditions. Concerns were also voiced about mental health issues, children lacking parental guidance or support, safety issues in the community or a lack of infrastructure or good parks.

We can't get there on our own.

As we look at stewardship in Family Faith Formation, it reminds me of several conversations I've had recently. When talking about stewardship with the children, it's like.... what can children do? The conversation is similar with adults as we get older. As we age, life changes. We are no longer able to help with ministries that require physical work. Maybe our eyesight is declining, and we must look for ministries that don't involve reading. With the children, maybe they don't get an allowance or have an income, so how do they share? It is not necessarily about treasure for them, either. How can they be involved in the parish, their school, our community? How can they help others? Put the needs of others first?

## Justice Challenge

### 33th Week in Ordinary Time

The Sunday gospel focuses on the gifts which God gives to each one of us. We are called to use our talents and gifts, not hide or neglect them. And God always wants us to share what He has given to us with the most vulnerable. **Your challenge this week** is to share one of your special talents with someone in need. If you have the gift of speaking, perhaps you could make a call to your legislators, asking them to support bills which ensure food security for all. If you have a gift for music, consider visiting a homeless shelter or nursing home and brightening residents' day with song. If you are talented in sports, call a family shelter and offer to organize a game for the children. If finances are your field of expertise, offer your services to a service organization which is doing fund-raising. Share your God-given gifts with others so your light can shine for all to see!
