Jesus said all you need is to love God with all your heart and to love your neighbor as yourself.

This is our calling. We have all been loved by family and friends. This is what we celebrate today, all of this love. Love is not only the center of my faith, but it is also necessary for emotional and physical health. We all need the touch, being loved, to grow in love.

This week, as we meet the people in our life and the people who love us, we ask ourselves, do we need to love that person? Do we need to do something for someone else? Do we put love in the center of our faith?

You shall love the Lord, your God with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind. This is the greatest and first commandment. The second is like it, you shall love your neighbor as yourself. On these two commandments hang all of the law.

It sounds so simple, doesn't it? Jesus wraps up the law in one sentence. Love God love your neighbor and love yourself. This commandment falls in line with our basic human needs and our emotional needs.

Love is necessary for our own well-being, for our physical and emotional life.

The law of love is so simple. If we lived it, we'd have heaven on earth. But we get so hung up on who deserves our love. Even though God loves everyone, we believe people have to deserve it sometimes. When we do that, our circle of love becomes very small. The challenge is to expand the circle. Jesus has expanded who we love to even include our enemies. We are called to love everyone. Someone said that you love God as much as the person you love least. Love, I think, means treating the other person as an equal.

Ministry Update... A new ministry... Hand Up



As you know, our Wednesday mornings offer a Community Meal for lunch and a Clothes Closet. These two ministries are charity ministries. Lunch and clothing items are given to people in need.

We are in the process of trying to formalize a Wednesday morning ministry. We are calling it **"Hand Up."** We are looking for this to be an opportunity to help people take small steps needed to help them move forward from whatever situation they find themselves in. Perhaps we can help them... make phone calls in search for housing or shelter; get an ID so they can apply for assistance; make a copy of paperwork they need to submit for services they need; call for financial help with overdue bills; find specific community resources they need.

This ministry will need volunteers who are interested in working with our neighbors (those who are homeless or living in poverty who come on Wednesday mornings), hearing their story, and building a relationship with them. This will enable the volunteer to have an idea what kind of services the neighbor already has available, and what resources we may be able to help them find.

Do you like to talk with people? People you don't know? Do you have a sense of organization to gather resource information? Find information in a resource book? Do you want to work for justice in small steps? Pray with this ministry possibility. All Saints CAJE House Meeting Results

All Saints CAJE Team Network Leaders (Janie Allen, Bonnie Wink, Jerome Echele, Tom Bogenschutz, Brenda Meyer and Krisit and Vince Wagner.) held 10 listening sessions to find out what keeps people up at night. 55 people attended and 46 committed to being CAJE Network Members. Remember, Network Members agree to attend the Neimiah Action and bring 3 people with them, also attend the Community Problems Assembly, Rally, and consider investing in CAJE's work at the Celebration in June. Many issues were raised but often people talked about someone lacking affordable housing or living in unsafe conditions. Concerns were also voiced about mental health issues, children lacking parental guidance or support, safety issues in the community or a lack of infrastructure or good parks.

St. Margaret of Scotland

A Hungarian princess, St. Margaret grew up in luxury and privilege, but she never lost sight of those in need and her duty to serve them. After the Battle of Hastings, her family fled to Scotland where King Malcom III sheltered them and eventually married Margaret. Although a queen, her private life was austere, dedicated to prayer and serving the poor—even washing beggars' feet. She is remembered for her life of piety, kindness, and generosity.

Be generous with your patience. Ours is the God of second chances,

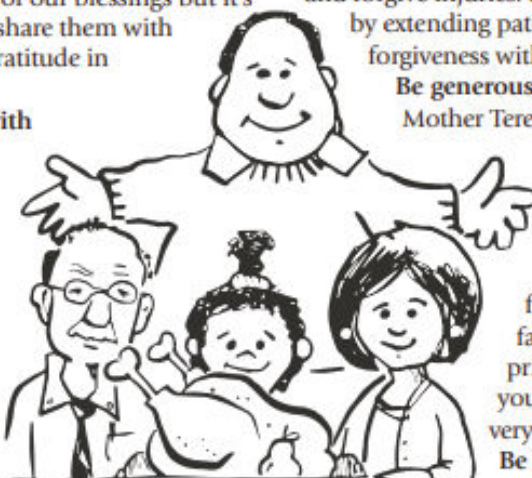

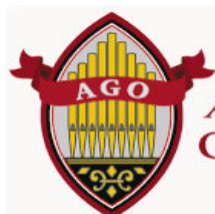

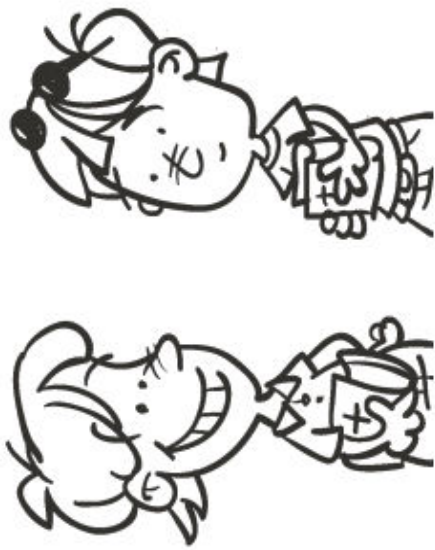
