

Fr. Steve

At the heart of the readings, I think we should ask this question, "What is more important in our life... appearances ...or authenticity?" We all know the answer is to be authentic. Lots of what we see all around us is for show.

Jesus tells us today, don't be fooled. It's a show, they don't practice what they preach. We are not to exalt ourselves, but to be humble of heart and soul. The challenge is not to advance our own desires, but to serve others humbly.

It is not in titles like Rabbi, Father, Master. Jesus was not into our behaviors. It was important what was on the inside of our lives. He wasn't into possessions or authority, but of service. Jesus call is to a very simple life, to be for the other.

Life isn't about privilege. We are called to lead one another as faithful servants. It is all about service to people and being authentic.

Sometimes we might need to think things in our life are real, and not know that they are fake. In Jesus' time, he had things to say about the leaders of his people. Jesus called out the leaders and said that they are fakes and hypocrites. They would say one thing and do another. They liked to do acts of charity. They liked to be in charge. We find the same things going on today. I think most politicians and clergy are honest servants of the people. But there are some who are not. In the church, it is called clericalism. Pope Francis has talked out about it many times.

Jesus says that we have to be sincere and be a servant to others. We all make mistakes, but Jesus says be a servant to one another.

Let's take a few moments to reflect, and think about how we serve others and whether we lord it over others. Which side do we fall on? Can we become more of a servant to one another?

Ministry Update... A new ministry... Hand Up



As you know, our Wednesday mornings offer a Community Meal for lunch and a Clothes Closet. These two ministries are charity ministries. Lunch and clothing items are given to people in need.

We are in the process of trying to formalize a Wednesday morning ministry. We are calling it "Hand Up." We are looking for this to be an opportunity to help people take small steps needed to help them move forward from whatever situation they find themselves in. Perhaps we can help them... make phone calls in search for housing or shelter; get an ID so they can apply for assistance; make a copy of paperwork they need to submit for services they need; call for financial help with overdue bills; find specific community resources they need.

This ministry will need volunteers who are interested in working with our neighbors (those who are homeless or living in poverty who come on Wednesday mornings), hearing their story, and building a relationship with them. This will enable the volunteer to have an idea what kind of services the neighbor already has available, and what resources we may be able to help them find.

Do you like to talk with people? People you don't know? Do you have a sense of organization to gather resource information? Find information in a resource book? Do you want to work for justice in small steps? Pray with this ministry possibility. All Saints CAJE House Meeting Results All Saints CAJE Team Network Leaders (Janie Allen, Bonnie Wink, Jerome Echele, Tom Bogenschutz, Brenda Meyer and Krisit and Vince Wagner.) held 10 listening sessions to find out what keeps people up at night. 55 people attended and 46 committed to being CAJE Network Members. Remember, Network Members agree to attend the Neimiah Action and bring 3 people with them, also attend the Community Problems Assembly, Rally, and consider investing in CAJE's work at the Celebration in June. Many issues were raised but often people talked about someone lacking affordable housing or living in unsafe conditions. Concerns were also voiced about mental health issues, children lacking parental guidance or support, safety issues in the community or a lack of infrastructure or good parks.





Family prayer time. At least once a day, pray as a family. Praise God for His goodness. Repent of the times you failed to love God or each other. Intercede for others. Ask for all that you need. Quietly listen for God's voice.

Experience Mass each week. Help your

children meet Christ "up close and personal" at Mass on Sunday. Let nothing come in the way of your weekly appointment with the Lord.

Keep a family gratitude journal. At mealtime, take turns writing a line or two about how God blessed you each that day.
